THE VICAR WRITES

I had my wrist slapped quite firmly after my little article in last month's Three Towers (commenting on the decline of community events). So – apologies to the gangs responsible for the 'Edenham Extravaganza' for 'Steam Action' and 'Witham on the Hill open gardens' to raise money to support the Parish Hall. To my apologies I add genuine appreciation for everyone's hard work.

Thinking again about my remarks last month, as someone involved in the largest charity and volountary organisation in the communities (the Church of England), I was reflecting on the effect changes in society are having on my work with and through it. In the past five or so years there has been a sea change in the relationship of church to the communities in which they are set. A very powerful tide has turned. The centuries old rhythm of times and seasons married to the times of change and crisis in family life no longer connect or resonate with

the life of the Parish Church. The festivals of Mothering Sunday, Easter, Whitsuntide, Harvest, Remembrance are all receding in the community memory. It is also true that the secular alternatives to Baptism, Marriage and Funerals are increasingly popular. There is no doubt the church is closer to the edge of life than it has been for at least two hundred years. This is a view widely shared by colleagues in a variety of settings. Recently the Regional Minister of the Baptist Union said in conversation with me 'it's as if the ground has been pulled out from under our feet.'

But there are other changes that work against the church's vitality – the complete destruction of Sunday as a Sabbath day has opened up a massive variety of alternatives for the consumer to select for an activity of choice. In these parishes although more people (than ten years ago) come to church fewer and fewer of them attend regularly. An inevitable consequence of this is that it is very difficult to find any cohesion – to build up a family or team spirit.

In turn this makes organising and sustaining community events a considerable challenge. Hence last month's remarks.

In January this year the two hundred or so members of the three parish church's electoral roll received a guestionnaire. The purpose of the survey was to discover how far these changes were affecting individuals and family involvement, and whether there was an appetite to reshape the pattern of worship in our parishes to avoid the Sunday circus. 52 replies were received and of these 63% attended irregularly. But when asked 'is it difficult for you to attend church on a Sunday' all of them ticked the box 'not really!' The replies were anonymous, and I have no idea why this should be the case for individuals. The only reason must be there are better, more urgent things to do, for an hour or so on a Sunday.

I have always thought that attending Sunday worship is the hardest habit to establish and the easiest to break. I have regular conversations with people who say

'I used to attend church, and I don't now, I miss it, I suppose I should get back to it.' That is easier said than done. We live in a culture where the essential qualities needed to establish this habit are scarce: sacrifice, commitment, self-discipline, not to mention belief, have been transposed to the gym or golf course rather than the communion rail. In the end we all do what we want to do. It is a shame we don't always appreciate what we need to do.

I have no real idea how to respond in the current social revolution. As I told the Bishop of Lincoln 'you'd better sign me off as incompetent!' If anyone has any ideas perhaps you could let me know. Perhaps we will see the disappearance of the parish church as we know it and the growth of Christian communities which are smaller and embedded in society in a different way; leading a life which will be guite counter cultural and radical in contrast to a wider society. I also expect that although the buildings will remain in our villages they will not be sustained as places of weekly gathering and

activity – which is in fact the case in many surrounding villages. Where Christian community grows out of 'church life' Christian presence and ministry will survive and thrive, but it might not resemble anything we know at present. All this might happen quite quickly – God knows!

FOOD FOR THOUGHT Bible study followed by a simple lunch Thursday 2 July at 11am in St Andrew's Parish Hall, Witham on the Hill. Proceeds to Christian Aid. A GREAT BIG THANK YOU to all the helpers, adults and children, who spent several days giving St Andrew's Church, Witham on the Hill, a very thorough spring clean. It was great fun wielding very long poles with brushes on the end, which reached to the very top of the clerestory. We got rid of a lot of cobwebs and spiders, and the Church smells much nicer now! With 4 weddings in the Church coming up in the next few months, it is a job well done. Thanks too, to those who worked hard clearing weeds and ivy in the Churchyard. Well done everyone!

Notes from the Edenham Parish Council Meeting 12th May 2015

Annual Parish Meeting: No members of public present. The chairman introduced PCSO Bowden (Community Police Team) who gave a brief summary of Policing matters within the local area, encouraging all to be vigilant and to notify the police team if anything appears unusual within the parish by using the 101 Police number. It may be innocent but could be that small piece of information that may help to reduce crime in the future. The issue of motorbikes using the A151 throughout the Parish was raised. PCSO Bowden is aware of the problem and will endeavour, along with the traffic police, to monitor the road and address those riders who use the road in a dangerous manner.

Parish Council Meeting:

Acceptance of Office: Members signed new acceptance of office forms following the Local Elections. Members re-elected were: P Cranfield, R Biggs, T Martin, A Wilson, A Edwards and A Whadcock. Cllr. Cranfield was elected as Chairman and Cllr. Biggs, Vice-chairman for the forthcoming year. The council is a member short and encourages parishioners to consider standing for co-option onto the council at the next meeting (July 14th).

Highways: Consultation on Lincolnshire Highways proposal to reduce the current 40mph speed limit on Main Street (Traffic lights to Pillarwood Farm), Edenham down to 30mph received – no objections. Potholes on Scottlethorpe Road, Edenham to be reported.

Financial Matters: Financial accounts for the year 2014/15 along with internal audit considered and accepted by the council. External Audit Return completed and agreed by council. Spring Bulbs: It was agreed that the council should purchase and plant more spring flowering bulbs throughout the parish – a maximum of £40 was allocated. **Dog Fouling**: All dog owners are reminded that it is their duty to clean up after their pets wherever they are and be considerate to other footpath and road users.

Just to take one example: doing the weekly visit to the supermarket. That trolley of shopping is a complete whole, but made up of many smaller things, without which the total would be incomplete.
