



#### THE VICAR WRITES

The other day I received some junk mail from holiday lettings, 'luxurious Christmas Cribs available! 'Plenty of room at the Inn.' This, to my mind, is fairly bad taste, but not as horrid as Virgin Megastores 'All you need is a Virgin!' (It is one of the ironies of our culture that the Christian Faith is immune from the political correctness that protects other faiths from ridicule.)

These marketing ploys support my contention that the secular Xmas with its 'seasons greetings' has not one tiny thing to add to the true meaning and celebration of Christmas. There is an unavoidable contradiction between the feeding frenzy of the commercial Christmas and the fundamental claim of Christmas that God the creator, in order to redeem his beloved creation. entered time and space in the poorest place imaginable, in the vulnerability of a new born child. Simplicity, faith, poverty are the spiritual themes of the season.

Being 'Christmassy' is very

enjoyable feeling – friendliness among people, the beauty of all the decorations and indeed the wonderful carols, but Christmas is much more than that! This ongoing conflict between the drinking and eating of the pagan 'vule' at the celebration of the midwinter solstice and the pure examples of self-giving adoration of the Christmas story in the Gospels is generations old. At this moment 'Yule' (21st December) and its Roman equivalent 'Saturnalia' (25th December) seems to have the upper hand.

The consequence of the supremacy of the material over the spiritual and the commercial over the religious has a consequence. It leads to a gradual deadening of a spiritual consciousness and with it a gradual deadening of conscience. The inevitable outcome of this is the straightforward blasphemy of the marketing mind and a society in which everything goes!

If we desire to know the Christmas spirit, we must have a few times of stillness and quiet and

#### CONFIRMATION

Each year our parishes hold a confirmation service (in 2016 it is on May 8th at Witham on the Hill). 'Confirmation' is one of the signs or sacraments of the church by which God touches the lives of individuals with his own life. In the sign of Confirmation our Bishop lays his hands on the head of each candidate and prays for them that God's Holy Spirit will strengthen them in their spiritual life and faith.

In most years we have a mixture of ages. The youngest age permitted is ten but we have had people in the eighties confirmed in past years. Sometimes, when individuals are not baptised, they are baptised at the same service. This is becoming ever more usual.

Before the confirmation, candidates take part in a course lasting about three months –

children, young people and adults all have separate groups. This course is an opportunity to learn all about the Christian Faith and it really doesn't matter how little knowledge you start with!

The annual village fireworks party had been a great success despite the weather. Chairman thanked everyone involved especially Richard Blanchard, Geoff and Kathy Collett. It was agreed to give the remaining tins of soup to the local food bank.

Highways has been busy dealing with problems created by badgers, the problems with the kerb between Stonehaven & Church Farm was still ongoing. It was felt that the road markings had been done to a poor standard, especially Manthorpe & Toft hill. Concern was expressed about the ramps either side of the bridge at Manthorpe. The footpath at Toft from the Island to Toft hill is still causing problems for walkers especially those with young children. It would be helpful if residents along that area could cut back any overhanging branches and clear away rubbish/debris off the footpath.

#### THE POEMS OF WOODBINE

**WILLIE** On the evening of Armistice Day the Rev Richard Rice-Oxley set some of Geoffrey Studdert Kennedy's poems to music and sang accompanied by the guitar. As Richard was suffering with a cold, Sylvia, as well as reading biographical notes, also read some of the poems. Geoffrey born in 1883 became Vicar of St Pauls, Worcester in 1914. On the outbreak of war he volunteered as chaplain on the Western front to boost the morale of the troops with his remarkable faith and courage. He was awarded the military cross in 1917 for helping the wounded, at great danger to himself. He had great respect for the British Tommy. Some colloquial poems were beautifully read by Sylvia and the songs were sung with great feeling by Richard. It was a very moving evening on such an auspicious day; but the finale, an upbeat Marching Song, hoped for a better world. Woodbine Willie died in 1929 in his mid-40s. Thank you Richard and Sylvia for a very thought provoking evening!

#### \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* \*\*\* Jane's Seasonal Recipe \*\*\* I first tasted these delicious little tarts when I saw them in Sainsbury a couple of months ago. This recipe came from Paul Hollywood's latest book British Baking, which I couldn't resist buying when I saw the recipe for Ecclefechan tarts. At the time of writing I haven't actually tried out this recipe, but I am sure it will be fine! They are the Scottish variation of mince pies. 米 米 **ECCLEFECHAN TARTS** \*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\*\* Pastrv: 200g plain flour 2 tablespoons icing sugar 100g butter 1 egg 1 teaspoon lemon juice 2-3 teaspoons cold water Filling: 150g dark soft brown sugar 2 eggs 100g butter 1 tablespoon sherry vinegar 200g mixed dried fruit \*\*\* 25g chopped walnuts 25g chopped pecans Make the pastry: rub fat into flour & icing sugar. Add egg, lemon juice & water. Knead gently into a smooth ball. Wrap in cling film & chill for 30 mins. Roll out & using 10cm cutter, cut into 12 circles, & place in muffin tins. For filling: beat sugar & eggs, then add melted butter, vinegar & dried fruit. Mix well. Divide between pastry cases. Mix walnuts & pecans, sprinkle over tarts. Bake 20 mins 200c, until Mix walnuts & pecans, sprinkle over tarts. Bake 20 mins 200c, until pastry is golden & filling has slight wobble. Place the tray on a wire

rack to cool. It is easiest to remove the tarts when they are still

slightly warm.


