

THE VICAR WRITES

A Vicar friend of mine once put a banner outside his church at the beginning of July, which read ' Come to church now and avoid the Christmas rush!' I never did find out how his parish responded; but I dare say it was mixed! It is, however, a phenomenon of contemporary society that large numbers of people, of all ages, come to church at Christmas. If this year is anything like previous years, over six hundred people will attend church on Christmas Eve in the Three Towers Parishes That's ten times the usual Sunday attendance! The total adult population is just under one thousand and this means a very high proportion of the community come to church at Christmas

I have to confess I am not at all clear why this should be the case. I assume that people come for a mixture of reasons. These might include – to sing carols; to enjoy the atmosphere both of togetherness and the numinous quality of the church; to meet people, and there must be many others. Underlying these reasons there may be something more

difficult to grasp – a deep need to renew connections – maybe with the past, or with spiritual experience. Whatever reason people come – they are very welcome – and I delight to see them there.

When I see everyone gathered together on Christmas Eve I reflect that in that half hour we glimpse something of what God hopes for his children: we are gathered together – all sorts of us – in His house, singing His praise – listening to the story of His love for us. It is a glimpse of possibilities - a hint of the potential we have to be a community of love of service.

My prayer is that all our worship may draw us closer to our true selves and to God.

To you and yours a peaceful and blessed Christmas when it comes!

Notes from the Edenham Parish Council Meeting 8th November

Open Forum: Chairman welcomed three members of public. The lack of accurate information available of the progress of broadband internet upgrade was discussed again. Council to contact LCC project team to ask for clarification on progress. Cllr Nick Robins (SKDC) briefed meeting on District's view on the proposal for a Mayoral Combined Authorities of Greater Lincolnshire. A majority of District Councillors were against the proposal and the executive had to concede that this should be the District's position alongside that of Lincolnshire County Council. He then introduced a member of the project team for Corby Glen's recently upgraded play area who gave an overview of their project and offered help if we were to proceed in seeking grants etc for our play area. Chairman thanked all for their attendance and input, closed the Open Forum and opened the Parish Council Meeting.

All parishioners are reminded that the Open Forum at each Parish

Council meeting is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. Details can be obtained by contacting the parish clerk at edenham.pc@btinternet.com – or contacting any of your current councillors.

Planning Application: S16/2070 - Conversion of the barns at Pillarwood Farm, Edenham to form 4 small residential units. Site visit 18th Oct with applicant - no objections raised for the welcome development of this near derelict site.

Highways: Disappointment over the recent reply from the department from concerns raised following last meeting. All issues will be monitored and raised again should they become worse.

Parish Christmas Tree/Lights:

Project proceeding well - a 20ft tree kindly supplied by Grimsthorpe Estate is planned for installation in early December (Ford Cottage and Church Lane, Edenham).

Children's Play Equipment:

Secretary reported that the report from the annual safety inspection

is still to be received. Once this is available the plans for the areas refurbishment can be made.

Hedges: The council would like to take the opportunity to remind property owners/farm tenants that where their boundary hedges border highways/footpaths, it is their responsibility to keep them trimmed back so as not to encroach onto them. This will ensure that they are safe for users and it will also enhance the parish's appearance - many thanks for those that do. (Your

local litter picker now finds it difficult to walk along the grass verges in places due to hedges/ trees being left to grow right to the carriageway).

Suspicious Activity/Vehicles: All parishioners are reminded to be vigilant in their local area and report anything suspicious, however minor, to the Police using the Police 101 tel no.

The next meeting will take place in Edenham Village Hall on Tuesday 10th January commencing at 7:30pm.

Public Forum: Mr Dave Andrews of 8 Creeton Road, Swinstead presented documents in relation to his issues with the road outside of his property. The verge alongside his driveway is continually churned up as lorries and tractors use it as part of the road. This causes extremely hazardous driving conditions as the mud and water spread over the highway and the possibility of it freezing over in cold conditions would only add to the problem. Bryan Lynch stated he would email Martin Hill (legal leader of Council) and copy Nick Robins in the email.

Policing: PCSO Stuart Bowden stated that he has received no phone calls or has any concerns

regarding Swinstead. He explained that apart from the usual Deer Poaching, Speeding and Cold Calling nothing untoward had been reported. PCSO Stuart Bowden also stated that any concerns by the public of Swinstead could be reported to him via 101 and this would then be passed to him. He is also available most days with the mobile library. He agreed that a notice put up on the village notice board would be a good way to let people know how to contact him.

Declarations of Interest: All Councillors have now signed the new Declaration of Interest forms and that from now on these are to be signed yearly.

Code of Conduct: The Code of Conduct has now been rewritten.

Financial Report: One cheque had been issued to J K Mowing for the Orchard grass cutting. A cheque was written to Wendy Benson for stationery purchased.

Precept: This was adjourned until the meeting in January 2017

Planning: Planning applications are only available on line.

that yellow notices were put up on lamp posts when an application had been received. The clerk agreed to check the website regularly and check with other clerks of nearby villages to see how they dealt with this.

Change of details, addresses, emails, banking, insurance etc: This had mostly been carried out but Barclay's Bank were proving difficult as it needed a Signatory to change the address. Bryan Lynch to sort.

Buttercross: Councillor Clive Lunn has weeded and cleared the Buttercross area

Highways: The pot holes and drain cover issues in Croake Hill had been rectified. The pavement drain cover has collapsed by the outside number 4 Bourne Road causing a danger to pedestrians. Clerk will contact Highways at SKDC and report. Cars parked on the pavement in same area caused a lot of concern for the disabled and people pushing pushchairs as the cars blocked the pavement. PCSO Stuart Bowden agreed to check this when passing through and put a sticker on the windscreen stating the police were

aware of the pavement parking hopefully to encourage the residents to park on the road.

Parish Councillor Vacancy: We still have a vacancy for Parish Counsellor. The clerk will post a note on the village notice board asking for someone to fill the post.

Councillors' Reports: Clive Lunn stated that now the darker evenings were upon us the dog mess in the Church Yard had increased tenfold. It was also noted that on the pavements in Swinstead there was also a problem with dog mess. Nick Robins said that a new leader in May with new priorities could help with this, also mentioned the possibility of DNA testing could help. Residents could also report instances of dog fouling to the parish council or dial 101 and ask for Dog Warden who have powers to prosecute. The clerk will put this on the village noticeboard and also contact The Link to run a story on it and highlight the issue.

If you have a child who will be 4 years old between 1st September 2016 and 31st August 2017, this is the time to apply for a school place.

We do not run official open days, we prefer to meet you and show you what we have to offer on a one-one basis. We know that making a decision about which school is right can feel daunting. Hopefully after a visit, the process becomes a little bit more exciting rather than just plain scary!

Although the vast majority of our pupils begin on a full-time basis from the first day of the school year, this is not always the case. We are happy to meet you and your child to discuss their needs should fulltime school not be right for them by 1st September. Part-time schooling is also sometimes possible until children reach the compulsory school age - by law, every child must be in school at the start of term after their 5th birthday.

Applications are made to the Lincolnshire County Council until noon on the 15th January 2017. Whatever you do, try not to miss the deadline - life becomes very stressful for a few months if you do!

We are pleased to announce that Edenham CE Primary School has entered a new chapter in its long history with its conversion to Academy status on October 1st 2016.

The school has worked in close partnership with a group of other local schools - the Pathfinder Partnership. The members of the Pathfinder group set out to become academies at the same time. The school will maintain its Church of England character by becoming part of the Lincoln Anglican Academy Trust (LAAT) family of church and non-church schools.

Whilst many in our school community fundamentally disagree with the academies programme, it became clear that if we wish to maintain our genuine character and distinctive curriculum, it was the best possible path for us.

We are very proud of our individual character and we have always worked in partnership with other schools and organisations.

Increasingly the requirements on schools have become formalised, restrictive and isolationist. In addition the school, along with many other Local Authority maintained schools, has been victim of the appalling financial support and guidance from the Serco operated 'Agresso' system in the past 18 months.

Past and present members of the Edenham School community, including parents, governors and Friends of the School, expressed overwhelmingly that they supported the Governors' decision to convert as they were reassured that the creative, energetic and family character of the school will be preserved.

A parent stated 'We chose Edenham School because we were inspired by the school's commitment to outdoor learning, loads of experience in the Arts, Science and Sport, and the high standards in learning in English and Maths. We also know that the vast majority of the Edenham pupils become well-rounded individuals by the time they leave for secondary school. We agree that we want to do what we can to preserve this.'



Edenham School Love Learning Love Life!

When I worked with lots of schools in Lincolnshire, this part of the Autumn Term was always the one where I missed having my feet just grounded in one school.

Cake Filling

CHOCOLATE YULE LOG

4 EGGS 1/4 PINT MILK

4 OZ CASTER SUGAR 2 EGG YOLKS

3 OZ SR FLOUR 6 OZ BOURNVILLE CHOC

1 OZ COCOA POWDER 4 OZ BUTTER

2 OZ ICING SUGAR

米 米米 Grease & line 12x9 inch Swiss roll tin. Whisk 4 eggs & caster sugar until thick, pale & creamy. Gently fold in sifted flour & cocoa cutting through the mixture in a figure of 8 movement, 米米 lifting it from the base of the bowl & shaking the cocoa & flour back into the egg mixture. Pour the mixture into the tin. DO NOT smooth the surface, just tip the tin so that the mixture flows into the corners. Bake at 200c for 12-15 mins until the cake springs back when pressed lightly. While still hot, turn out onto greaseproof paper dredged in caster sugar. Carefully peel off the paper, trim off any crisp edges and cut a line, 1 米 inch in from one of the short edges but don't slice all the way **** through. Fold the indented end over & roll up keeping the paper inside. Leave to cool. Heat the milk until just warm. Blend egg yolks in a heatproof basin & beat in milk. Put the basin over a pan of gently simmering water & cook, stirring frequently, until the mixture coats the back of the spoon. Add chocolate & stir until melted. Cover the basin with cling film & leave to cool, stirring occasionally. DO NOT refrigerate. Cream butter & icing sugar, then gradually stir in cooled choc custard. Unroll the cake & spread with 1/3 choc mix. Re-roll **※** carefully so as not to cause cracks, but don't worry too much as they can be covered. Transfer to serving dish. Spread the remaining choc mix onto the cake, covering the ends too. Make lines with a fork – as for the bark of a tree. Chill for approx. 1 hour until set. Decorate as you wish.
