THE VICAR WRITES

My wife Siân loves opera and I will go a long way to avoid it. I have an instinct to switch it off if it warbles out of the radio. But for her sake, and because I am aware that I soon give in to my own prejudices, I do accompany her from time to time to a performance and stay in the room if it is playing on the audio system. I have no idea where this prejudice came from – I think it is something arising on a taste for clarity and purity in music and drama. Opera always seemed to me to be an art form too far. I have sometimes infuriated my family by singing the most ordinary conversation as in recitative in opera.

Until last week I was very comfortable in my pre-judgment. Then dear reader something happened. We were given a present of two tickets to see and listen to La Boheme (an Opera I have seen twice before). It was a production by the Welsh National Opera at the Millennium Centre in Cardiff. (Our family is shot through with Welsh connections). It is a harmless, rather ridiculous plot about poverty stricken artists in Paris and the love affairs of two of them. It ends in the death of Mimi, one of the beloved.

Very early in the performance I realised that I was quite enjoying it.

The quality of the orchestra and the singers was very high and the theatre itself is a great space to be in. Then I found I was responding emotionally and at the death of Mimi I was moved to tears –it really communicated to me. Thus I found myself, and indeed Siân, amazed at what had happened to her husband at the Opera. I tell this story against myself because in a simple way it illustrates a change in understanding and experience. It was a small conversion and illumination.

I find that a great many feel the same way about church worship as I did about Opera. In the same way it is written off, in 'it's not for me, I tried it once, ' kind of attitude. That is not fair either to worship of the Church or to the person who has settled comfortably into an attitude of rejection.

Lent is time for trying new things or having another go at old ones. It is time for letting go of old habits and attitudes and being open to learn and experience new things. It is about open heartedness and open mindedness. St Paul teaches that we should 'let our minds be remade after the manner of Christ Jesus'. But a mind can't be remade after it has stubbornly decided to be 'made up' in a certain way.

Interactive Speed Warning Sign

After road safety concerns from parishioners with regard to excessive vehicle speeds on the main road running through both Edenham & Grimsthorpe, the Parish Council has investigated the possibility of acquiring an interactive speed warning sign.

However, we have found that the initial setup costs including one sign, 3 mounting brackets and associated site surveys (required by Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership) etc. would be approximately £2800.

The Council does not hold reserves to meet such a large capital outlay relative to the modest income we receive from SKDC via the Precept. Therefore, the Council would like to canvass the views of parishioners on the way ahead by asking for feedback to the following questions:

- 1. Do you agree that there is a traffic speed issue through the villages of Edenham/Grimsthorpe?*
- 2. Do you agree that the use of such signs would improve road safety within the parish?*
- 3. If the council started a fund-raising campaign would you be willing to pledge/donate to a fund to buy the sign and if so how much?*

Witham on the Hill WI

Sandi from Lincs Notts Air Ambulance started by telling us that the consultants from Pilgrim Hospital had the idea of having an air ambulance in the 1980's but it didn't come to fruition until 1994. It very quickly ran out of funds, so, Lincolnshire farmers started fundraising and have offered continued support for the Ambucopter.

The charity runs 11 shops many of which have recently been refitted with old shop fittings from BHS. The paramedics who man the Ambucopter have to have been land paramedics for at least 3 years. There is also a doctor and pilot on board. The paramedics are taught to land the helicopter in an emergency.

The medics will fly the patient to the best hospital for their needs but most go to Queens Medical Centre, Nottingham, which is in the process of having a helipad built.

On average they are called out 3 times a day, mainly to traffic accidents, the busiest time for them is between 3 and 4 pm on a Friday.

The helicopter is based at RAF Waddington. In March, Lincs Notts Air Ambulance will be taking delivery of a new Ambucopter which will be

bigger, so, it will be easier to treat the patient on board and will be able to fly further before refuelling. It will be able to fly at 190 miles per hour so will be able to cover the 3,000 square mile area faster.

All this comes at enormous cost and this year the charity will have to raise £2,500,000. It costs on average £1,400 per call out and equipment such as bubble wrap blankets cost £20, defibrillator pads £30, high vis flying suit £500 and a helmet with inbuilt radio £1,200.

The ambulance service will know your location from your mobile and will ask you your geographic position from a landline. They will give you the access code to the cabinet if you can assure them that there is at least one other person with the injured person. Enter the code into the keypad and open the door. Take the defibrillator to the emergency.

VERY IMPORTANT

The defibrillator requires no training - all the instructions are given by the machine. Do not wait for one of the 'trained' residents to come and assist -

Jane's Seasonal Recipe

This is another Mary Berry recipe, a variation on the classic lemon drizzle cake.

BLUEBERRY & LIME DRIZZLE RING

225g butter

225g caster sugar

275g sr flour

1 teaspoon baking powder

4 large eggs

2 tablespoons milk

finely grated rind of 3 limes

100g blueberries

FOR THE GLAZE

6 tablespoons lime juice (3 limes)

175g granulated sugar

Grease & line with strips 3 pint ring mould. Cream butter & sugar until pale and creamy. Beat in eggs, milk & lime rind. Stir in flour & baking powder. Spoon half mixture into ring mould. Scatter over the blueberries and top with remaining mixture, smoothing evenly to cover fruit. Bake at 180c for approx. 35-40 mins until well risen. While the cake is baking make the glaze: mix lime juice & granulated sugar. Leave the cake to cool in the tin for a few mins, then loosen the sides carefully with a palette knife. Turn it out onto a wire cooling rack, set over a baking tray. Peel off paper strips. While the cake is still warm, prick all over with a fine skewer. Stir the glaze, then spoon slowly over warm cake. Leave to cool completely.
