

THE VICAR WRITES

Observant readers will have noticed that we have had a rash of Baptisms in our parishes recently. Baptism is the rite of initiation into the Christian church. The Church of England, along with all other major Christian denominations (except the Baptist Church and the Salvation Army), practice Infant Baptism. It is a remarkable fact that despite the lamentable differences between Christian denominations, all Christian churches (except the Baptist Church) accept one another's Baptism. Baptism creates a fundamental unity among Christians. I consider that my own Baptism is the one of the most important gifts my parents made available to me. They themselves at the time of my Baptism as a baby were not 'church goers'. However, out of custom and a sense of responsibility, they took me to St Luke's Church in Grimsby [which was demolished in the 1970's] and had me Christened (the traditional English term for Baptism). In my teens, when I decided to seek confirmation. I was thankful that they had laid the foundation for my Christian life and I still am.

There is now an understandable reticence about Baptising babies. Former social and family expectations

sometimes created unwelcome pressure on young parents. In the earliest years of my ministry Baptism was also surrounded by all kinds of superstition and it was seen in some quarters as some kind of 'white magic.' As a wider gap has opened up between 'church life' and 'community life' Baptism has largely disappeared from the consciousness of many people. It can seem a very large decision to make and a daunting process to become embroiled in. I, for one, am very aware that those making a first contact about Baptism are often very uncertain and nervous. I do hope they find me sympathetic!

There is also a view that Infant Baptism does not respect the 'individual rights' of the child. Some argue that a person should be able 'to make their own mind up' rather than be lumbered with membership of the Christian Church. I think that position has integrity as long as parents ensure the child has a choice. This means making sure that as they grow up they have real exposure to the life of the church and come to a clear understanding of what it means to be a Christian. In recent years several adults have come to Faith and been baptised in these parishes - one by total emersion! All our five children were baptised as infants because it

was our intention to instruct and nurture them in Christian living. To our mind it was equivalent to having them immunised – it was inoculating them with the life of God himself, giving them the seeds of the Spirit to grow and develop in their individual way. Living in the Risen life of Christ was and is the overarching truth of our lives and it would have made complete nonsense to have left them out. This same imperative was at work in the early church; the Acts of the Apostles tells us that whole 'households', i.e. everybody of all ages, were baptised together and St Peter in his first sermon at Pentecost declared 'this promise is to you and your children.'

People often ask what difference being Baptised means. In practical terms in adult life not being baptised means that you can't be a member of a church electoral roll or an office holder of any parish church. It also means you cannot be a Godparent or a Sponsor of a person for Baptism or confirmation. In marriage within the Church of England if neither party is baptised a Christian marriage cannot take place. In the case of funerals, some of the prayers for the departed are different when the deceased is not Baptised. For people living in some Islamic states in the Gulf they

cannot claim any privileges of being a Christian without proof of Baptism. Some Christian educational foundations require Baptism as one of their entrance criteria.

In terms of relationship to God, Baptism makes no difference whatsoever to the love that God has for that person. But in Baptism an individual becomes part of the New Testament or New Covenant with God. In Baptism an individual becomes a personal beneficiary of the death and resurrection of Jesus and is grafted into the life of his Body, which is the church. They receive as a personal gift the same Spirit by which Jesus was raised from the dead and they are adopted as a child of the Heavenly Father. Baptism ensures full membership of the Church and the Christian life is nothing more than living and growing into the life given at Baptism.

If you would like to know more about Baptism and how Baptism is celebrated in these communities then please do get in touch. I always assume that when I am contacted about Baptism that it is best to start with the assumption that those enquiring know nothing or next to nothing about what's involved and I do my very best to help people




Further Adventures of Augustine

Witham on the Hill WI

We had an entertaining evening with a talk from one of our own members and a sushi demonstration. Frances Plummer gave a fascinating talk of her holiday with Travel Eyes. The holidays are to share sight and experiences between sociable likeminded people who are keen to travel. In each travel group half the group is visually impaired and the other half sighted. Every day a sighted person is matched up with a different visually impaired person. Frances has enjoyed these holidays before and this time went to Nepal visiting Katmandu. The area is still devastated from the 2015 earthquake but the group visited the elephant breeding centre and watched elephants bathing, the National Park and even canoed down a river with crocodiles!

Yuko Swindells explained the history of sushi – 300 years ago the rice parcels were 3 times bigger than today, invented in Tokyo with seaweed on the outside. 30 years ago a variation was created in California. With the aid of her laptop she

showed pictures of sushi restaurants. A variety of fillings can be used including smoked salmon, prawns, cucumber, chives, sesame seeds & wasabi paste. The rice has to be short grain & moistened with sushi dressing to make it stick. She came to UK 20 years ago and missing sushi she had to learn how to make it and then set up her own business. Yuko demonstrated 3 different varieties. A few members had a try, then tasted samples. Many were surprised how tasty they were!

Sandie Streets gave the vote of thanks. Jenny Stanton and Juliet Renner won the raffle. The competition was a Japanese item. Julia Haynes came 1st, Juliet Renner was 2nd and Anne Marie Lilly 3rd. 

Public Access Defibrillators are installed and ready for use in Manthorpe and Toft.

In Case of Emergency - Dial 999 from a landline or 112 from a mobile.

The ambulance service will know your location from your mobile and will ask you your geographic position from a landline. They will give you the access code to the cabinet if you can assure them that there is at least one other person with the injured person. Enter the code into the keypad and open the door. Take the defibrillator to the emergency.

VERY IMPORTANT

The defibrillator requires no training - all the instructions are given by the machine. Do not wait for one of the 'trained' residents to come and assist -
