

# Witham on the Hill Parish Council Clerk's Notes of Annual Meeting of Witham on the Hill Parish Council 31<sup>st</sup> May 2017 at 8.30 pm in St Andrew's Parish Hall

Cllr Henriques was the only nomination as Chair and was duly elected.

Cllr Greenwood was the only nomination as Vice Chair and was duly elected.

**Resignation:** Cllr Debbie MacMillan has resigned from the Council and SKDC has been notified. Notices advertising the vacancy have been put on the parish noticeboard and on the website.

#### Matters to Report

The Clerk asked District Cllr Wilkins about planning matters. The PC meet every 2 months and more often than not plans arrive during that period which means the PC do not have sufficient time to discuss some applications at a meeting. Cllr Wilkins said that Planning Officers can grant an extension of time to respond and only occasionally this is refused. Alternatively the PC could call a special meeting or if the matter was not contentious, it could give the Clerk delegated authority to respond. Cllr Wilkins confirmed that the PC, as consultees, usually have 21 days to make representations about a planning application and this formed part of the 8 weeks within which the District Council needs to deal with the application. He suggested if we had any problems he could be contacted for advice. The Clerk asked District Cllr Wilkins about planning matters.

The roof over the Stocks at the Bywells is in need of repairs. The question of responsibility for this was raised and the Clerk was asked to investigate. It was also pointed out the structure may be listed in which case the appropriate consent would be required in any event prior to works being undertaken.

The grass verges at the bottom of the hill at the crossroads with the B6121 are now so high that drivers views of oncoming traffic are dangerously



obscured. The crossroads are frequently the scene of accidents and this makes the junction even more hazardous. The County Councillor was informed that representations have been made to the Highways Department on a number of previous occasions, requesting that additional measures be introduced to reduce the speed of traffic approaching the junction, but that no further action had been taken to date. He was asked if he could investigate this matter for us and he said that he would look into it.

Cars often travel much too fast along Bottom Street and the question of new signage close to the junction with Main St was raised. The Clerk suggested that an approach could be made to the Road Safety Partnership in Lincoln for advice and Cllr Kirkwood agreed to discuss the matter with them.

The old Pétanque area and the adjacent wild flower patch needed to be cleared of weeds. It was suggested that planting some fruit trees there, may be a better alternative. It was agreed that this would be put on the agenda for July but Cllr Kirkwood would investigate further.

The Clerk was asked to ensure that the minutes of PC meetings appeared in the Three Towers parish magazine.

Dog fouling remains an issue along the bridle path leading off Bottom St towards Edenham and on a number of occasions recently, dog walkers cars have been parked so as to cause a potential obstruction in Bottom St. Concern was expressed that this could make difficulties for farm machinery/emergency vehicle access and that those responsible appeared to be mainly parents from Witham Hall School. Therefore it was agreed the Clerk should write to the school Bursar, asking that parents be informed.

County Councillor Bob Adams, having only been recently elected, was finding his way around and was trying to get to know all the villages he now represents. He apologised that he might not be able to attend all our meetings but he would do his best and send a report if he was unable to attend.

District Councillor Martin Wilkins said there had been a few changes at the District Council, which now has a new Leader and a new structure but that services would still continue. The Chief Executive was leaving after over 10 years' service and they were looking for someone to fill that role temporarily for 12 months until a permanent appointment could be confirmed.

He had noticed on the agenda there was an item about the play equipment on the Green and suggested we contact LCVS who can award grants from £200 to £5,000 for community events and from £500 - £10,000 for community projects. He thought the latter could be of some help to the Parish Council. Funding is considered biannually the next opportunity being later this month which meant we would probably not have enough time to put a bid together, but his suggestion was welcomed and would be looked into.

SKDC was aware of people complaining about the standard of cleanliness generally in their town or village and as a result are promoting the 'Big Clean' initiative. Areas would be identified and teams would go to clean up. If we had an area which we felt needed particular attention we should let them know and they would consider the request.

He also pointed out there was a grant which we could apply for from SKDC for a village cleaner. This might be something we would like to consider.

It was resolved that we sign up to the 5 year contract with the Community Lincs Insurance Services at a cost of £173.15 pa.

The Clerk reported that he had spoken to Mike Smith at SKDC who apologised for the lack of progress on the condition of the play equipment on The Green. Mr Smith recognised the village was in need of a playground with equipment, in good order. He would look into the matter to see what funds might be available and pointed out the cost of the repairs required might be in the region of £3,500. He said that he would get back to the Clerk within a few days with a definite proposal.

It is understood that Witham Hall School parents association may be prepared to help with either the cost of repairs or providing new play equipment. The Clerk suggested that a meeting with Mike Smith (SKDC) could be the best way forward. The suggestion was welcomed and the Clerk was asked to make the arrangements for a meeting at The Green, on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> June, at 10.30am. Cllrs Henriques and Greenwood would be present.

#### 100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

#### August 1917

Three Years of War. - The 4th of August will be the third anniversary of the outbreak of war. Sunday, the 5th of August, is to be observed throughout the Kingdom as a day of National prayer and intercession. At all our services the special forms of prayer, issued by authority, will be used. The Vicar appeals for the presence of all in church on this solemn and momentous occasion.

War Weariness. - We are all longing with ever-increasing intensity for the end, but meanwhile we must guard against the danger of "war weariness" in regard to our intercessions. It is a sad and significant fact that many of us have long since become weary and careless as regards these. Our place in God's House is empty week after week. Some of us have never been present at our Intercession service since the War began. In God's Name let us put this right, and strive to make a new beginning now that the third anniversary of this frightful struggle for right has come. God is waiting for our prayers, come and ask Him. Here is His Promise: "Ask and ye shall have".

"Missing." - Our deep sympathy goes out to Mrs. Weldon, who has received official notice that her son Pte. Alfred Weldon has been posted as missing since the assault on Messines Ridge in May. We fervently hope that news may yet be heard of him, though the Chaplain who has been communicated with is unable to trace him.

**On Leave.** - We were pleased to see Pte. William Archer (A.S.C. Motor Transport) (Army Service Corp) who was recently home again on leave looking so fit and well. He has now returned to the front, taking with him the good wishes of us all.

#### Pure Bread for the Holy Communion. -

In issuing their regulations as to flour ingredients, the Government have rightly taken into account the requirements of the Church, and licences for

the supply of pure wheaten flour for the Eucharist are issued by the Ministry of Food. The wafer bread used in this church is made wholly of this pure flour, and we notice it stated that similar wafer bread is used almost universally by Army Chaplains.

Ordinary bread, at all times unsuitable, is now totally unfitted for this sacred use.

#### September 1917

**Sunday, August 5th**, was kept by us, in common with the whole of the country, as a solemn commemoration of the completion of three years of war. At the early Eucharist we remembered by name those who have laid down their lives, at all the Services we used the special forms of prayer authorized for the occasion. Though our numbers were larger than usual, we were grieved that many failed to make use of this great opportunity for united intercession. In this fourth year of war let us consecrate ourselves afresh to the duty of prayer. Let us call to mind once more what Admiral Beatty said last year in reference to his duty - "When England looks out with humbler eyes and prayer upon her lips, then she can begin to count the days towards the end." Or we might remember the well-known words of that great and far-seeing soldier, Lord Roberts, who said: "that for her salvation England must become a nation on its knees."

**Darkening the Church**. - The vicar and churchwardens are anxious, if possible, to continue evening service throughout the winter, if the lights can be sufficiently screened to satisfy the legal requirements. Though the scheme may be somewhat costly and difficult owing to the number and size of the church windows, yet they are of opinion that it should be attempted, rather than face a third winter with no evening service, with the consequent serious spiritual loss of our people.

#### Witham on the Hill WI

Every July we have the pleasure of joining together with Carlby WI, so it was a lovely social evening with some delicious cakes made by members of both WIs.

Our speaker this month was Michael Brown. He is a garden historian and horticulturist. He designed and created the largest authentic medieval garden in Europe at the Prebendal Manor, Nassington, Northamptonshire. The talk he gave to us was about 'Death in the Garden' - Poisonous Plants, Myths, Magic, Passion and Murder. He warned us that many of the plants he was going to talk about may well be growing in our own gardens.

We, of course, had heard of deadly nightshade - sometime people are accidently poisoned when they mix it up with elderberries. When ingested, the pupils dilate which over the years has given it a romantic attraction.

Many of us had read about mandrake because it is in the Harry Potter books. It is a Mediterranean plant of the nightshade family which has a forked root that looks like the human form and which was formerly used in herbal medicine and magic. It is said to shriek when pulled from the ground.

Michael told us of plants used to poison in gruesome murders such as Crippen who used henbane to poison his wife Cora. Another infamous killer was called the "Curry Murderer". She was spurned by her lover and was convicted of murder when she sprinkled deadly poison made from monkshood on his and new girlfriend's curry. Monkshood was also used to poison arrows and bullets in battle.

Michael also talked about carnivorous plants and how the poisonous Yew tree clippings are made into a medicine that fights cancer.

We certainly had an enlightening evening!

Richard Elton trained as a sculptor, has worked as a prop-maker, an art teacher, a set-designer for large events and as a designer and art director for films and television. These jobs have taken him around the country and to various parts of the world, always involving him in drawing in one form or another. Drawing is central to his practice and his work invariably starts from a drawing of something seen; a still life set up in the workshop, a vase of flowers on the side in the kitchen, the skeleton of a tree in winter or the shapes of old farm sheds with bright sun and shadows on them that are making interesting shapes. A landscape or a building will be drawn, not as a topographical record, but because it lends itself to making

interesting patterns on the paper. These studies are referred to later for developing other drawings, sometimes combining media and using paint.

Recently, Richard has been using print-making techniques, particularly screen printing, as a means of developing his drawings, evolving the image as he reacts to each stage of the print process.

# Notes from the Edenham Parish Council Meeting 12th July 2017

Open Forum. Chairman welcomed PCSO Stuart Bowden, Lincs Police Community Beat Team, who briefed the meeting on the current changes to the local beat team. Due to a reduction in available PCSOs, the team will be less visible in the local area but PCSO Bowden is remaining and hopes to maintain a good relationship with the Parish. He emphasised the need for the public always to report all minor incidents and any suspicious activity/vehicles via the police 101 number, keeping 999 for emergencies only. The logging of such minor incidents will help to ensure that future policing needs have recorded data to support decision-making by management. The issue of traffic speed in Edenham was raised and the police team will endeavour, limited resources allowing, to carry out enforcement action.

Cllr N Robins (SKDC) briefed the meeting on District's plans including a more hands-on direct approach to providing services etc. They are working on improving the appearance of the District with the planned 'Big Clean', improving town markets, encouraging business and providing affordable housing.

Chairman thanked PCSO Bowden and Cllr Robins for their attendance and input, closed the Open Forum and opened the Parish Council Meeting. All parishioners are reminded that the Open Forum at each Parish Council meeting is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. Interactive Speed Warning Sign: The recent traffic survey carried out by Lincs Road Safety Partnership (LRSP) confirmed that excess speed is a problem along Main Street, Edenham. However, the above detailed reduction in local policing will no doubt reduce the possibility of positive enforcement and with little
