THE VICAR CONFESSES

I have been asked a few times recently; 'How have things changed since I began training for ordination forty years ago?' The short answer to that question is; 'More people were on my side then!' By that, I mean, a larger percentage of the population were sympathetic to, and had some understanding of, the Christian Faith and the clergy had a fairly wellestablished role in community life. What people never ask me is; 'How have you changed in your understanding of a Vicar's role since you began your ministry?' That is a very hard question to answer honestly. Trying to be honest I don't think I have really got to grips with the very changed situation and the revolution in social attitudes that shape the present context of ministry. This is partly because these changes are so rapid that it is difficult to keep abreast of them, and partly because there is a kaleidoscope of responses with the Christian church, even within the Church of England itself. The result is that I find myself pruning down my life and work to the fundamentals of being a priest.

It has been said of me by others ' that you are far too religious to be a Vicar'! By that they mean (I think) that my priority has always been the fostering of the spiritual life, of helping individuals know and love God and experience the liberty and fullness of life that comes from being alive in Christ. I have never really been interested or gifted in social action, or building up community or 'playing the parson' as some kind of community leader. It just isn't my vocation. I know this must have disappointed lots of people over the years but I never set out to please anyone but God!

I think that to pray, to deepen knowledge of Scripture and the Holy Tradition of the church is even more vital. It important to be committed to offering worship that expresses the beauty of holiness, and to preach and teach the Gospel with honesty and integrity. This I believe is what the ministry of a Priest is built on.

In these parishes now, the church communities and the wider communities in which they are set are very distinct in a way they weren't thirty years ago. The church has to relearn how to reach out and communicate the Gospel, how to be of service to their neighbours, and how to be truly welcoming to all.

If I were involved in training Priests now I would want to see a greater emphasis on mission and evangelism – again something I am not geared up for! What I can do and hope I am in a little way effective in is helping others 'bear witness to hope that lies within them.'

I have always placed nurturing people of all ages in the Faith at the top of my list, and one of the ways we can do this is through Confirmation. Next year's Confirmation is in May and if anyone would like to know more about what Confirmation is, and how we prepare for it, then please do contact me.

Toft cum Lound & Manthorpe Parish Council Clerk's Notes Parish Council meeting, 19th September

The major concern was again HGVs travelling through the parish and it was agreed to arrange a meeting with the director of Maynell Plant Hire Ltd. It was proposed that the Parish Council look at the possibility of taking over the maintenance of the Y Junction at Toft.

The following planning applications had been received and agreed no objection: Toft Lodge, prior approval of change of use of agricultural building to dwelling, 1&2 Waterworks, erection of porches, replacement pitched roof to garage & external alteration. 4 Waterworks, erect single storey detached triple garage. Alteration to access at Manor House Farm at Lound was allowed by SKDC.

Councillors agreed to look at the condition and possible replacement of the shed in the Playing Field. The Annual Fireworks at Manthorpe would be on 5th November, usual venue & time. It was also agreed that parishioners could use the field for any private functions on condition that they took out separate insurance and provided evidence. The Council's assets had been inspected, nothing to report.

D.Cllr Martin Wilkins reported on the Big Clean, Stamford Georgian Festival and the New Local Plan. He also said that he was hoping to arrange a meeting for residents of the Ward and Planning Officer from the District.

C.Cllr Robert Reid reported that the County Council were calling for support for Fairer Funding for Lincolnshire. He also said he would be attending a highways meeting next week at Thurlby.

Since the September meeting the application for an erection of a single

storey detached triple garage at 4 Waterworks House, Bourne Road, Lound has been approved. Councillors are looking at an application from Mr Collett, Amberley Barn, Manthorpe for an erection of a single storey side extension.

100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

November 1917

The Darkened Church. - In addition to screening the windows we have now shaded all the lights, so that no rays fall upon any of the windows. We wish to remind the congregation of the step *in the porch*, also of the iron door stop in the centre, and to exercise caution in entering the church. These will be whitened for greater safety. The four steps below the level of the

ground, one of which is *outside* the door, and three *inside*.

No Bells may be rung after dark, so we must rely on our own clocks and watches to be in time for the evening service. The organist will commence to play a few minutes before the service begins, as a guide to those outside.

Wounded. - We deeply regret to hear of several casualties to our lads during the past month. Pte. J. W. Haddon (Sherwood Foresters) has received a shrapnel wound in the left shoulder, and is now in hospital in England. Mercifully no bones are broken, and he is going on well. Pte. Walter Archer as been slightly wounded again, in the



face, but not badly enough to "get a Blighty." There's a report too that Pte. Harold Holmes (attached to the R. Fusiliers) is wounded, but at the time of writing his parents have received no official intimation. Enquiries are being made, and we earnestly hope that reassuring news may soon arrive of his whereabouts and condition. Mr Tony Fenwick has recently also been slightly wounded in the left leg, from a shell which exploded only two yards from him. The wet condition of the ground undoubtedly saved his life, we hear. Had the ground been less water-logged, he must have been killed. As for Mr. Monty, he is to continue in splints for another month, and then to be put in plaster. Except for his leg, he is well and cheery. We all sympathize with him in his long and wearisome detention in hospital.

Captain W.D. Johnson, only surviving son of the late Squire Johnson, who was wounded and taken prisoner in 1915, has now been released and is in England. About a year ago he was fortunate enough to be sent to Switzerland from Germany, where he was interned at Murren as a prisoner of war, and now under arrangement made with the German Government for mutual exchange of prisoners he has obtained his release. He writes to say he is well but thin, and hopes to pay us a visit ere long.

Witham on the Hill WI October

Most of us have visited Rutland Water, but didn't realise what pioneering work goes on towards the conservation of ospreys. Paul Stammers told us how he's been involved in encouraging pairs of ospreys to stay and breed at Rutland Water instead of flying on to Scotland, having already travelled all the way from West Africa. The first pair spent the summer in Rutland in 1994. Over the next few years nests and roosting poles were put up and chicks introduced to the area, as the birds return to where they were born to breed. This year 8 breeding pairs produced 15 chicks - a great success! Paul had some entertaining photos of himself feeding the chicks through drainpipes & climbing up to the nests to ring the chicks. When the ospreys fly the 3,277 miles to Senegal it only takes them 14 days but, sadly, 80% don't make it because they may be shot, blown off course into the desert or out to sea. Paul and a group of volunteers spend 6 weeks in Senegal, Gambia and Mali observing the ospreys and especially looking out for any with a blue ring around it's leg, because that has been put on the bird at Rutland Water. We enjoyed

the talk so much that many of us are now keen to go to visit the ospreys at Rutland Water next summer. Vote of thanks was given by Hazel Darley. The competition was a bird item: Sue Budden won, Sandie Streets came 2nd & Trudy Templeman 3rd. The raffle winner was Sue Hartley. Our next meeting is on 7th November. Courgettes have been abundant this year, and cake recipes are common too; but this is a delicious variation. It is very important to squeeze out the liquid to prevent the cake being too soggy.

Courgette, lemon & pistachio cake

325g grated courgettes

120g butter

180g caster sugar

juice & zest of 2 lemons

50g pistachio nuts

1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 eggs

280g self raising flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

60g icing sugar

Place the grated courgettes in a tea towel & wring out as much moisture as you can over the sink. This may take a few mins. Melt the butter with sugar; stir in courgettes, lemon zest, chopped pistachios, & vanilla. Beat in eggs. Add flour & baking powder, stir in gently – do not overmix. Tip into a greased & lined 2lb loaf tin. Bake at 180c approximately 1 hour, until skewer inserted in the centre of the cake comes out clean. Mix lemon juice & icing sugar. Using a fork, gently prick the top of the cake & pour over the lemon drizzle, so that some soaks in & the rest forms a light glaze on top. Cool in the tin.
