



THE VICAR WRITES

How do you think? By that question I mean: 'How do you make decisions?' The latest research in neurology looking at how the brain works in the decision-making process reveals that the rational function of the brain does not make decisions. The decisions are made intuitively, subconsciously and the rational part of the brain than ratifies and then processes them into actions. Some neurologists have highlighted the activity of cells identical to those in the brain, but found in the stomach, as playing a part in decision-making.

This would make sense of the common phrase 'a gut reaction' or 'I knew it in my guts.'

In his letters St Paul talks about knowing Christ in the 'guts'. Thinking and knowing are not entirely rational activities. Being in love or managing family relationships are not rational. Even the activities of deciding how to vote in an election or what to buy in a shop are not rational. I think that it is fairly incontestable observation.

Why is it then that being rational has been exalted as the only way to know and think, particularly in regard to the Christian faith?

As a person of faith who values the

spiritual over the material, I have never understood this slavery to reason. Being rational helps interpret the rational material world which for the most part follows rational laws (although I understand from friends who are scientists that science has abandoned the concept of 'law' for 'theory', as so many laws have proved to be inaccurate).

A friend of mine, who taught mathematical physics at university and became a monk, calls rationality 'the cloak over the human heart'. It is by casting off this 'cloak' that the writer writes, the artist paints and the children play. The English philosopher and theologian Eric Mascall wrote a wonderful book in the 1980's 'Whatever Happened to the Human Mind?' In it he argues that until the advent of the scientific theory the human mind, certainly in Europe, was understood to be enlightened by the Holy Spirit of God – this spiritual light was the source of knowledge and understanding; the purpose of reason was to interpret what had been understood. This does sound very familiar to the latest findings of neurology.

The New Testament teaches us 'to let your minds be remade' and to seek 'the mind of Christ.' Jesus never reasoned anything out with anybody.

Often, in response to a question, he would tell a story and thus triggered emotion, memory and imagination in the interrogator. That is what we might call wisdom, something very different to simply knowing a few facts.


100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

April 1918

More Light in Church. - Now that the dark evenings are over, we propose to remove the distemper from a portion of the West window, which will let in much additional light. Should it unhappily be necessary to screen the windows next winter, which please God may not be the case, we shall provide a curtain in its place.

Easter Offerings. - The Churchwardens, unknown to the Vicar, decided in accordance with ancient custom, to give the collection on Easter Day to the Incumbent. He is deeply conscious of their kindness, but whatever the amount may be, he will accept it only on condition that he may devote it towards a fund for providing a memorial to our fallen soldiers. We hope, after the war, to erect some standing monument to commemorate their names for ever, and the Easter offerings shall form the first instalment of this fund.



 Lieut. Fenwick has been recently appointed as General Staff Officer on the Defence of London. We congratulate him on this appointment, which is a gratifying tribute to his military ability. As a consequence, we shall see but little of him here, and the Hall will be closed.

Sewing Meetings. - In consequence of the above, the proposed fortnightly Red Cross Sewing Meetings at the Hall will have to be abandoned, but the Vicar has suggested that they might be held at the Vicarage, if there is a further supply of material to be made up. Due notice will be given should this be arranged, and we hope to enrol many fresh helpers. An Easter Social is to be held on Easter Monday, the proceeds to be given towards presents for our soldiers.

Arthur Galton Vicar of Edenham

A new book which will be of interest in our parish has just been published. Entitled **Arthur Galton Vicar of Edenham**, it tells the story of the life of the man who was our vicar one hundred years ago at the beginning of the 20th century. The author, Margaret McKay, writes...

"From 1904 - 1921 Arthur Galton was vicar of Edenham, Elsthorpe and Grimsthorpe. There is no one left alive today who knew him but for my father's and grandfather's generation he was a significant figure in the life of the village. My grandfather, Arthur Holmes, was church warden and gravedigger in the first decades of the twentieth century and my father, also an Arthur, was a child of ten when the vicar died in February 1921. It was anecdotes of my father's about the reverend Galton that first excited my curiosity about the man behind the title. In particular there was the story of an intruder to the vicarage who, one dark night was frightened off by Mr Galton brandishing a pistol (a shot was fired inside the house). And then there was the tale of the Sunday morning visits of Lawrence of Arabia roaring into the village on his, according to my uncle, Bill Holmes, "Brough Superior", motorbike! Many years after hearing these anecdotes, and others, I decided I simply had to find out what lay behind these mysterious goings on in Edenham, a village which I also have loved since childhood and its associations with my grandparents and rambling in the surrounding countryside.

The outcome of my quest was more fascinating than I could have imagined – albeit not quite in the Indiana Jones manner that the incident of "the vicar with the pistol" initially suggested. Instead it turned out to be the story of the child of an eminent and wealthy scientific family (Francis Galton was Arthur's second cousin), who, despite a promising start in life, carved out an unconventional, zigzag path for himself, encompassing religious conversions, a five year

Notes from the Edenham Parish Council Meeting 13th March 2018

Open Forum. Cllr N Robins (SKDC) gave the meeting a brief update on work/projects underway at District Council. These include progress on the Town Markets, Retail Forum, Improvements to Leisure Centres, Improvements to SKDC Community Grant Funding Scheme, SKDC working closely with Rutland County Council (shared resources), Upgrade to car park ticketing systems in Grantham/Stamford and the setting up of an SKDC Lottery to support community activities.

Parish Council Meeting. Interactive Speed Warning Sign: Secretary reported: Following receipt of LRSP survey results (1 site Grimsthorpe unsuitable - post leaning, 1 site Edenham unsuitable - hedge overgrown) an order had been placed with Unipart Dorman for one interactive speed warning sign plus 3 mounting brackets. Cheque signed prior to meeting for £2,582.40, order confirmed with a delivery forecast of early April. Working party to install equipment to be arranged with the sign being rotated around all 6 sites on a random basis to maximise effectiveness.

Children's Play Area: Secretary reported: The further application

made to SKDC's Community Fund has been successful with 80% of grant to be paid shortly with final 25% on completion of project. A completed order form and payment (Cheque signed for £4,050.78) for the replacement posts sent to Playdale Ltd to enable works to be scheduled as soon as possible. Once these are in place the play surface can be installed. It is hoped to have the facility open again later in the year once the re-seeded grass surface has grown.

Planning: Application S18/0169 - Mr T Blanchard, Agricultural Building, Elsthorpe Lodge, Elsthorpe studied prior to meeting - no objection/ comments passed to SKDC Planning Dept.

Previously Cllr Greenwood explained the Hill footpath is in a dangerous state, due to surface crumbling & vegetation spreading across it. C.Cllr B. Adams said the Hill footpath overgrowth has now been acknowledged and should soon be able to give us a progress report.

Potholes throughout the village were mentioned and will be pointed out to LCC Highways dept.

Cllr J Kirkwood mentioned the salt bins and the person to contact at South Kesteven District Council is Mr Adrian Smith with regard to re-filling or moving them.

No planning applications received.

The PC discussed a number of ways to reduce speeding through the village. Chairman C. Henriques recommended the village should 'register an interest' now for the Speed Guns scheme, to be ready for a future date.

Matters to Report: - the new Tower for the Playground was now well under way. A new piece of play equipment was discussed such as an assault course or zip wire. South Kesteven District Council recommended another play equipment company called E.I.B.E. to consider. Proposals will be necessary from the two companies that provide park equipment. Cllr Greenwood mentioned the play area was still very marshy and would watch to see if it dried with the warmer weather, before discussing how to deal with it.

CCIIr M. Wilkins talked to us about the street lighting options and also mentioned that Grantham has a new and much larger cinema being built and it is well underway in construction.

Witham on the Hill WI

Our speaker, Becky Taylor, explained she retired from the Royal Air Force aged 38 and did cookery courses as part of her resettlement package. She was so inspired learning about chocolate that she decided to pursue it as a career, teaching in schools & various groups. She explained that the cocoa tree grows between the tropics of Cancer & Capricorn, though 70% of world's cocoa comes from lvory Coast, Ghana & Nigeria.

The cocoa pods are surprisingly large (she handed dried ones around), the pods are split, & seeds scooped out & dried in sun. The seeds are winnowed to remove husk, & then nibbed (crushed). The nibs are then conched (separated) to produce cocoa powder & cocoa butter. The white cocoa butter (used as a body lotion) smells of chocolate, is white in colour but tasted with a pinched nose does not have a chocolate flavour!

Becky explained about the problems of British chocolate and EU regulations: that Belgian chocolate is pure with no additives.

We tasted a very expensive dark Cuban chocolate which has a smoky flavour. She gave us lots of advice about tempering chocolate & is willing to do a workshop for us at a later date, as problems with her car curtailed her presentation. Everyone was fascinated by her talk – an excellent enthusiastic speaker. The competition winners for a chocolate recipe were: 1st Deirdre Dunne, 2nd Jane Clark, 3rd Sue Horton.

Members were informed of various outings – a coach trip to London to see 42nd Street, a visit to the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire and a ladies lunch at Burghley Park Golf Club when the speaker will be Professor Krista Cowman, consultant for the film "Suffragette".

The next meeting will be the annual meeting on Tuesday 3 April at 7.30pm in St Andrew's Parish Hall, Witham on the Hill – with a competition for an Easter bonnet and other Easter fun.

************** 米 Jane's seasonal recipe With a few parsnips still in the garden, this recipe is ideal for a tasty dinner. ************* Pork & Parsnip Cobbler (SERVES 4) 1 tablespoon olive oil 600g diced pork 1 chopped onion 2 parsnips, cut into small chunks 2 teaspoons dried sage 1 tablespoon tomato puree 2 tablespoons plain flour 1 litre stock **TOPPING** 250g plain flour 1½ teaspoons baking powder 75g cold butter, grated 100g cheddar, grated 1 teaspoon mustard powder 1 teaspoon dried sage 200ml milk Fry onion in oil, add pork &cook until brown. A Letter from a Grand Breton

from a former resident

It occurred to me with the passing of 2017 and the arrival of 2018 that our great family exodus from the idyllic corner of Lincolnshire to an equally picturesque one here in Brittany was all happening 7 years ago. For many of us that period of time will seem to have flown by and in some ways it has. So there a couple of things which I'd like to ponder on and share with you:

The first is that I miss the earthy and familiar routine of the English rural life. The Community, the Friendships, the local Pub and that old building which most people, although they may not frequent it regularly, consider to be their local Parish Church. Here in Brittany, one of the most traditionally Cultural and Religious Regions (or Duchy) of France, I find myself living in a very compartmentalised society. People judge you on all kinds of levels -Education, Race (Breton, French, English....) Culture, Profession, Country/Town and whether you have a Faith.

There are 2 things which popular liberal thinkers here in France just cannot get their heads around and that is Religion, France is by definition a secular state. But do not confuse

this with being non-religious. It all makes for interesting dinner table conversation (there are no taboo subjects for me!) and I'm proud of my wife when she marks a line in the sand during a discussion "Glyn is very religious". The conversation often pauses and I simply state that for me, to believe in God and to consider what may exist beyond my and our collective understanding, is as much part of my life as how a motor car works, a tree is felled or a house is built – it's in my being and there is no conflict with that.

The second may provoke terrible thoughts and emotions, but I want to mention it, Brexit. Personally, I'm fervently against the current direction of the European Union. I see the effect first hand working in industry within an American-owned company operating within France. I believe that the economic model that we have within the EU neither serves its peoples, nor does it endeavour to raise the living standards of the general populous. On the one hand the monetary policy behind the Euro is one that I could align with but it is being exploited by big business to reduce operating costs through the increased fluidity of capital within the Euro regions to the benefit of the wealthy and Politically the EU has an Anti-Democratic structure that leaves

the elected representatives in the EU Parliament unable to question, modify or rescind legislation.

All I see from my office window is a constant flow of lorries with number plates ending in BG, CY, CZ, EST, H, IRL, LV, LT, PL, P, RO, SLO and very rarely 'F' for France. Germany dominates the fiscal policy of the Euro (because the German politicians have poured German wealth into it) and the French are struggling to align their strong Social-Structure policies (and expenditure) with a form of Capitalism that favours big business and corporate tax evasion (Luxembourg and Ireland). I feel for the peoples of the European Continent and particularly in the UK after the political shock of the EU Referendum; but when I look at the great changes which were brought in by the Peasant's Revolt, English Reformation, Civil War, Emancipation of Slavery, Defeat of the Grand Armeé (Napoleon), WWI & WWII and the coming of the age of the Internet...... I can only state two phrases coined by Einstein: "The measure of intelligence is the ability to change." and his definition of insanity as "doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results."

EASTER PEOPLE?

St Augustine's saying 'we are an Easter People and our song is Alleluia!' is often quoted and has achieved the status of a motto on prayer cards and the like. But what does it mean for us in our daily life? How do we live in the victory of Christ knowing as St Paul taught 'you have died and your life is now hid with Christ in God?' This is essence of the Spiritual life. Living in Christ who is Lord of the living and the dead and setting our minds 'on the things that are above'. Let me suggest three ways to live in the light of the Resurrection and in the love of Christ from which we can never be separated.

The first is to contemplate the fact of the Resurrection. Read the Gospel accounts of the resurrection appearance of Jesus. All of these include conversation with the Risen. Lord – hear him speak to you. Pay attention to the transforming effect on the apostles and share with them in their wonder, hear Jesus plead with you, as he did with Thomas 'do not be doubting but believe'. Imagine Jesus coming in to console and strengthen you in your confusion and fears as he did to the disciples locked in the upper room. Simply ask the Lord to renew and strengthen your

faith in his risen life. Ask for Grace to see and know where he is at work in your life now.

The second is to be more careful to attend and more attending in your partaking of The Eucharist and Holy Communion. This was the place of revelation in Emmaus and on the beach in the light of dawn. It is the sure place to know and share the presence of Christ. Prepare diligently to meet him there and be truly thankful for your sharing in his life. The worship of the Church in the Easter Season is a glorious experience; be as careful in your attendance for the fifty days of Resurrection as you were in the forty days of Lent.

The third suggestion is to use one of St Ignatius's spiritual exercises which he called 'contemplation to attain the love of God.' This begins by asking for grace to know the fullness of God's love. He continues by using all the senses to lift the mind and heart in thanksgiving for the love of God poured out on the whole of creation and of our experience of it in the here and now. The next step is to contemplate the outpouring of love and grace through the Christ that outweighs all the physical gifts and joys we are given through our senses. (The opening Chapters of the Letter

to the Ephesians can be helpful here). In this way our whole life and being finds it's proper place in creation and we are invited to share in the 'glorious liberty of the children of God' for we truly are 'an Easter People and our song is Alleluia!'
