

THE VICAR WRITES

Rogationtide used to be a very

important time in village life. The custom of 'beating the bounds' has long since disappeared but that was the chief way that parishes both marked and policed their boundaries. On Rogation Sunday (which this year falls on the 6th May) the congregation after the morning service would set out - often in procession with the choir leading the way- and visit the parish boundary in significant places. At each point the voungest members of the boundary would beat the ground with a stick thereby lodging the place in their memories. In this way the community memory carried the knowledge of the boundary into the next generation. What has survived of this practice throughout the English countryside has been the prayers that accompanied the procession. The prayers ask God's blessing on the growing crops and on the people who look after them. There are prayers for corn, root crops, hay, orchards and gardens and even pounds and streams. This continues in these parishes in a small way with the Rogationtide walk; details of which are found in the list of services. The walk through Grimsthorpe Park is quite magnificent and takes us

through forest plantations, fields of different crops, past the lake and into pasture. At each different aspect of the stewardship of the land a prayer is made. All are welcome to this but please bring stout shoes – the walk takes around an hour including the stops.

Apart from the Rogation Sunday there are Rogation days on the Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday following. Originally these were days set aside for fasting and prayer for the crops at such a crucial stage of growth. Rogation has its origin in the Latin verb 'rogare' meaning 'to ask.' True and effective prayer of asking comes out of the heart of our need: fasting is the surest way to come to recognise the vulnerability of our life and well-being. Jesus taught that some kinds of problem and evil can only be overcome with 'prayer and fasting.'

For around forty years the charity Christian Aid has adopted Rogationtide for its own campaign and fundraising week. Not so long ago most homes would receive an envelope for a door to door collection. This has died out across most of the country. The key reason being a lack of volunteers willing to deliver and collect, this reluctance has been reinforced by more frequent encounters of an unpleasant

kind on doorsteps. The collection stopped in these parishes around seven years ago.

Enormous credit is due to the congregation at Witham on the Hill who have organised lunches and breakfasts to support Christian Aid and over the past eighteen months have raised nearly £2,000. True charity does not always begin at home and we should always have in mind the needs of others. God knows there is more than enough need in the world and more than enough to go around if it could be shared. If we drift away from our own fundamental needs and the needs of others it is inevitable that we will also drift away from God. That's a fact of spiritual life.

100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

May 1918

Easter. - No sadder Easter surely ever dawned for us before, for it came just at the time of our greatest national anxiety. For that very reason its message must have brought infinite comfort to many a soul in deep distress. The church was, as usual, beautifully decorated, and we thank all our kind helpers and the donors of flowers. The Easter offerings amounted to £1/18/6, which the Vicar proposes to give towards the memorial to our fallen soldiers.

Second-Lieut. Leslie Metcalfe. - On the morning of Easter Day Mr. and Mrs. Metcalfe received news that their son was reported missing since March 21st, the first day of the recent great enemy offensive. The tidings threw a gloom of sorrow and anxiety over us all, and the deepest sympathy was felt for all Mr. Metcalfe's family, to whom the news came, tragically enough, shortly after returning from the early celebration.

After nearly a fortnight

of suspense, it became known that he was a prisoner of war and unwounded. Particulars at the time we write are still lacking, but it is supposed that under cover of a ground mist his detachment was cut off and enveloped by the enemy and captured bodily. In any case, we are more thankful than we can say for the news that he is alive and well, even though a prisoner.

L.-Cpl. Jack Haddon, we grieve to say, died on March 25th from diphtheria. He was taken to a clearing station in France on the previous Saturday, and lived only two days. The news of his death was not received by his family until Easter Eve, and cast still another shadow over the Easter Festival. We venture to express our heart-felt sympathy with his parents and family. Born at Manthorpe in 1896, Jack Haddon had lived all his life in the parish, and was closely associated with us as chorister and ringer. With his sunny and engaging disposition, he was a general favourite, and his loss will be mourned by many beyond his family. By a tragic coincidence his sister's marriage was arranged to take place on Easter Monday, and had to be carried through, as the bridegroom was home on leave from Italy, but a

CHANGES TO THE LAW ON PROTECTING YOUR DATA

Data Protection Act - General Data Protection Regulation

You may have wondered why you are being contacted by companies and charities informing you that the law is changing on how these organisations store and use your personal data. This is down to the reform of the legal framework designed to protect your rights. The date that matters to readers is the 25th May 2018 when the new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) will replace the Data Protection Act and a Data Protection Directive (DPD) is introduced.

The GDPR is designed to give us better control of personal data. Whilst the DPD instructs the police and criminal justice system to protect the data of victims, witnesses and suspects of crimes.

"Personal data" is defined in as:

Any information relating to an person who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that person.

As such, online identifiers including IP address, cookies and so forth will now be regarded as personal data if they can be (or are capable of being), without undue effort, linked back to the individual.

"So what?", you may ask. The plus for us is that organisations will have to think harder about your privacy. The regulation mandates a "Risk Based Approach" where organisations are required, where appropriate, to make privacy impact assessments, focusing on protecting our data and rights.

"And if companies break the new regulation?" There will be a substantial increase in fines for organisations that do not comply with the new regulation. Regulators will have authority to issue penalties equal to the greater of €10 million or 2% of the entity's global gross revenue for violations of record-keeping, security, breach notification and privacy impact assessment obligations.


