

NATIONAL JUNIOR ROAD RACE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Sunday 15 July starting and finishing at Witham on the Hill. The boys race starts at 10am, ending about 12.45 and the girls race at 2pm finishing about 4pm. THE VICAR WRITES

It was the experience of worshipping with a handful of others in a small village church that awakened in me a desire to love and serve God when I was a boy of nine years old. Now, fifty five years later, it is worshipping with a handful of others in village churches that assures me that this desire was a true one. I look forward to many more years of worship in village churches and of being led to serve God in ways that I cannot now imagine.

Worship, has always helped me to find purpose in life and given me new purpose in living. I cannot imagine life without it. Life without an active and purposeful spiritual element would be less of a life. As a priest I have the enormous privilege and joy to give prime time to worship and prayer and, although there have been hard and dry times, a daily rhythm has sustained me. It has been my chief work to offer worship in each of the parishes I serve every Sunday, as well as on some weekdays.

In worship I come to know my proper place in creation. I become aware of God's gifts for me and in me. Worship enables me to reflect on my use of these gifts and hear His voice in the resonances of His Word in my deepest self. Worship has enabled me

to be a thankful person and therefore (most of the time) a happy one. It doesn't really matter to me if there is one person or one hundred people with me. It doesn't matter if I am by myself. When anyone worships in spirit and in truth they are participants in the worship beyond time and space with all the heavenly host. The fellowship of angels and saints is a wonderful companionship. It is an added bonus to worship in our parish churches. I am amazed when I hear from village residents that they have never been inside their local church. To be in one, alone and quiet for half an hour, can be a life changing and life enhancing experience. To my mind there is nothing more beautiful and strengthening to worship God in one of the Three Towers' churches on a summer morning with the light falling through the high windows and the bird song flowing through the open door.

At each Eucharist the priest prays 'it is our duty and our joy at all times to be thankful.' What a duty! What a joy! It is God himself who places his Spirit in us that we may call him Father. It is God who is the source of all worship and praise and his will is that everyone should know the liberation of calling upon his name: even nine-year old boys.

Church Repairs

Most will be aware that St Andrew's Church suffered a great deal of damage through the theft of the lead from its roof. Work is well underway in the repairs. As usual, every cloud has a silver lining and ours is that the subsequent water damage to the interior of the church was such that it is now undergoing redecoration. Until this is completed, services are held in the sanctuary of the church.

This is a very intimate setting and brings with it an even greater sense

of togetherness.

RECYCLING

ARE YOU CONFUSED ABOUT WHAT WE SHOULD DO?

Are you confused by some of the "guidance" we receive on how best to recycle waste? I know that I am. Regrettably, there is no common standard for recycling across the country. It all depends on the capability of the local recycling facility.

We here in Three Towers land are luckier than many of our neighbours as our district has a very good facility. So how can we help do our bit?

Shopping locally is always a good start. Shoppers at the Munton's Mill Farm Butcher's shop in Manthorpe will have noticed that they are now carrying home their meat in brown sealed paper bags. Hannah has explained that this is part of their business' personal push to reduce the reliance on single-use plastic bags.

Does this mean that we should throw away our trusted heavy white Munton's bags? No, or course not. Like many, I am sure, my family is still using the same Munton's bags that we were given over 10 or more years ago. This is recycling at its most basic. Just like the bags for life that major supermarkets use, reusing as many of your plastic bags as much as possible certainly helps.

But what about our silver bin waste? What can we, and just as importantly, can we not put in our silver bins?

Please be very careful when searching the internet for advice. A Google search of "recycling advice in South Kesteven" throws up contradictory guidance. You will find 2 South Kesteven pamphlets/posters that tell us that we can dispose of old clothes, shoes and other textiles in the silver bin: (http://www.southkesteven.gov.uk/CHttpHandler.ashx?id=9594&p=0 and http://www.southkesteven.gov.uk/CHttpHandler.ashx?id=9963&p=0)
These are incorrect and DO NOT represent the current situation. A query to

South Kesteven District Council made in late June 2018 states that SKDC is unable to accept textiles and the like. The current authoritative guidance for our community is found on their main website:

The current advice is that if you are unsure that an item is recyclable or acceptable to the SKDC recycling centre then DO NOT place it in the silver bin.

100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

July 1918

Pte. Arthur Crowson, who was at one time an under-gardener at the Hall, is, we grieve to say, reported killed through gas poisoning. All of us who remember him will hear of his death with great sorrow, for Arthur Crowson was a capital fellow, one of those lads whose influence was entirely for good. The Vicar used to hear from him from time to time, and he always wrote with a cheerfulness and courage which was splendid. Some of these letters he has still kept, and the following quotations will show how strong and firm was his faith. "We still keep smiling," he writes, "and know that God will hear our prayers, and do the best for us. Dear sir, I myself and all of us have more need of God than ever we had before, and we know it too." In another letter he writes; "Well, dear sir, I see no fear when in danger, as I have always God on my side, and if it is His good will to take me to a better place where there is no pain and no enemies, He will do so." Well, He has done so, to his great gain, no doubt, but to our very great loss, for fine manly young lives such as his are the very salt of the earth - R.I.P.



Joined up. - We have recently lost a very useful helper in John Lound, who has now joined the colours. We owe him much gratitude for his valuable help in the belfry, and his unfailing attendance there to ring for all services. We trust that his example may be followed by those of our young ringers

who still remain, so that we may be able to assure him that we are still "carrying on," as he hoped we would.

The Stamford Infirmary. - We are asked once again to have a house-to-house collection for the Infirmary during the present month. In spite of the numerous appeals for help which are made to us in consequence of the War, we must not forget this deserving cause, even if we can only give a little. Last year we collected £5/12/0, which was the largest sum but one raised in any parish in the district. We may not perhaps send quite so much this year, but let us do what we can.

There is a newspaper cutting in the scrapbook, which is re-printed from the "London Gazette". Military Cross. - 16th July 1918 "Lieut. C B. Cooley, R.E., awarded the Military Cross, for conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He pushed forward during an attack and started the construction of two strong points, and laid out a track for pack animals up to the captured position. Later, during an enemy attack, he held and organised the defences of a strong point, and, though without rations, held for two days and nights, under heavy fire, until relieved. He set a splendid example of determined leadership and courage." Lieut. Cooley is a brother of the Rev. L. N. Cooley.





Witham on the Hill WI June 2018

It's not often we go to WI meetings and wonder how much more we should be doing with our time. Our speaker Helen Philips has been to India 22 times – she is involved in several Charities such as "Ray of Hope" which teaches women who were begging how to make crafts and sell their goods. She is also involved in aid for a leper colony, sourcing a library for a school and "Days for Girls" which makes and provides reusable sanitary underwear. The reason Helen started travelling to the Himalayas was because she has a degree in textiles and is a Yoga teacher so hoped to be able to learn more about her interests while exploring the area. Helen discovered where pashminas are made in Northern India in Srinagar, near Tibet. She told us that a real pashmina is made from the combed wool from the underbelly of the pashmina

goat. The wool is incredibly fine and soft but the fibres are short and need great skill to spin. The wool is a third finer than cashmere. Women spin the wool and men work the looms. The master craftsmen of Kashmir embroider by hand, without frames or patterns. She brings the pashminas and other craft items back home to sell for the people of Srinagar. Vote of thanks was given by Jane Clark. Jenny Stanton won the raffle. The competition was for a favourite scarf: Jenny Stanton won, Doreen Whitaker came 2nd and Julia Haynes 3rd. Our next meeting is on Tuesday 10 July (note the second Tuesday of the month).
