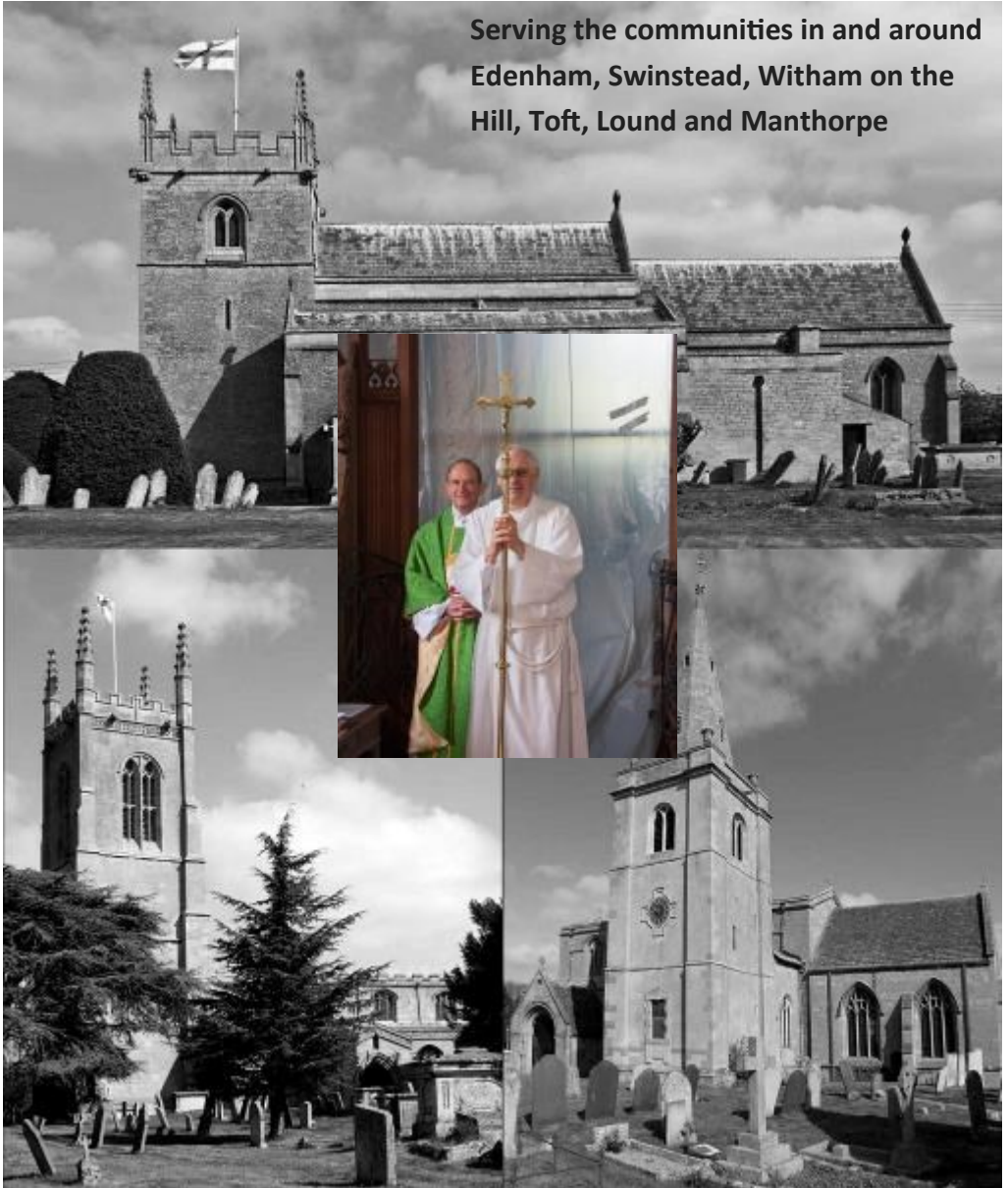

Farewell Father Andy

I have a very clear memory of a young Father Andy walking into the Parish Hall to meet the Witham on the Hill Church Council for the first time. We thought we were deciding whether he was the right one but I think it was rather more Father Andy deciding if he could work with us. We were blessed in that he obviously decided that he could.

It may surprise many people to know that for the first eleven years in our parishes he changed nothing. He did revive certain traditions in the parishes like singing the Eucharist and tidied things up a bit but he just built on the good foundations he found. He started his ministry with us in January 1989 and his first priority was to make sure that Holy Week and Easter, the foundations of the Christian Year, were right. Anyone who has attended the Holy Week services or the Easter Vigil at Edenham will know what a profound spiritual experience they were. We have also been blessed in having a Eucharist each Sunday in each parish. One of the many reasons why we have bigger congregations than most rural parishes.

Besides all his work in the parishes, Father Andy has done many things while he has been with us. He was a very proactive Rural Dean for seventeen years and led the Deanery through some interesting times and indeed we even became part of a different Deanery during his stewardship. In the wider world he was on the General Synod from 1995 to 2000. He did much valuable work with Forward in Faith and he is editor of "The Prayer Book Today", the magazine of the Prayer Book Society. He was made a Canon of Lincoln Cathedral in 2008 and is the cathedral's Foundation Governor at De Aston School, his alma mater.

He has been a governor at Edenham School throughout his time as vicar and, as those of us who have served with him know, he has contributed greatly to the school's development and ethos. He has been honorary chaplain to

Witham Hall and has worked with four different heads – all of whom valued and value his contribution. In recent years he has also been a governor at Witham Hall.

One statistic which stands out is that Father Andy has prepared over five hundred people for confirmation in his time with us. For him that is probably one of the most important parts of his ministry and I am sure that all those whom he has prepared for confirmation continue to benefit from his instruction and example. They will all understand the meaning of, “God has called you by name and made you his own.”

The love that so many have for The Regional House is also thanks to Father Andy. He would, quite rightly, credit the Holy Spirit but the Holy Spirit often needs people like Father Andy to lend a helping hand. His work there not only as warden but as a spiritual director has brought great solace and spiritual enlightenment to many people and his and Sian’s Christian hospitality has been an example for us all.

He is also an accomplished poet and librettist and I am sure that we shall see more of the results of these gifts when he has fewer things to do.

Father Andy has professed his orthodox faith unwaveringly however difficult that has been and he has suffered much as a result. His traditional views have upset some people but he has always treated everyone with respect and Christian love. Many may be surprised to know that many women priests who know him have a great respect for Father Andy.

Father Andy has always been there for those who need him and his cheerful manner and sense of humour have been a great help to many. Thanks in advance to the clergy, readers and lay ministers who will generously provide ministry at this time.

An address given to the Leavers of Witham Hall School July 2018 (adapted).

‘Leaving and letting go is something that happens throughout life, life does not happen unless we are moving on, leaving and letting go. The Christian Faith has much wisdom to help us; simple rules to follow when we have to move on: these can be summed up in one word **THANKS**.

T. We are taught it is our ‘duty and our joy to be thankful at all times in all places.’ **Thanksgiving** takes us straight into God’s heart, we see the world and ourselves as He made them – gifts, full of possibilities. Thankful people are generally happy

and generous people. As we move on – be thankful.

A. Be aware of the world around you. Jesus’ constant refrain was ‘look here’, ‘look there’. **Awareness** of what is around me, who is around me, is an absolute necessity. Kindness comes from trusting in God’s Love – which is patient and kind. Kindness creates good and strong relationships –these are the building blocks for our future.

S. Keep **Singing** – yes Singing! Make sure you have plenty to party about and people to party with. Celebrate success; don’t take yourself too seriously. Express joy! Have fun! Then there will be even more sources of Thankfulness.

100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—
reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

August 1918

Sunday, August the 4th, being the fourth anniversary of the outbreak of war, is to be kept throughout the Empire as a solemn day of prayer and thanksgiving, with special commemoration of the fallen. The King and Queen will join with the Members of Parliament in a special service at St. Margaret's, Westminster, and every parish in the land is asked to unite with them in prayer on this solemn day. I venture to ask that all parishioners will make a special endeavour to attend our services at Witham on this Sunday, and as far as possible in the morning, when the Holy Sacrifice will be offered to Almighty God as the central act of intercession on this great day. Copies of the special form of service will be provided in the church.

Recent events give us increasing cause for thanksgiving, but the need of our prayers is great and urgent. Let none of us fail to take our part in the great stream of prayer that will ascend up to God on this day, for our dear ones, for our country, for our homes. We can all help in this way to hasten the day of victory and peace. - L. H. C. (*Canon Cooley*)

Walter Archer who have both suffered from gas poisoning, are now quite recovered, and have re-joined their units. Sergt. Arthur Francis, who has been out in Mesopotamia, has not previously been home for more than two years. While there, he has been seriously ill, and at one time his condition was critical. more, looking wonderfully well considering what he has been through. We have also had a visit from Clara Holmes, our "W.A.A.C." (or more properly Q.M.A.A.C.) home from France on fortnight's leave, and looking so smart in her becoming military uniform. By the way, several thousand recruits for this Corps are needed, both for home service and service overseas. If any of our girls are desirous of joining, the Vicar will furnish them with all particulars and necessary information. Applicants must be over 18.



Flax.- Many of us have never before seen a field of flax, and the growth of it in our parish has been interesting to us all. Flax, which provides us with both linen and linseed, was once extensively grown in England, and our old church account book refers to it as grown in the parish in 1548. Now, when our supplies from Central Europe are cut off, flax has once more to be grown in England, where the cultivation of it had practically disappeared, owing to foreign competition.

Personal.- The Vicar wishes his parishioners to know that, after consultation with the Bishop as to military service, he has received orders from his Lordship to remain at Witham.

September 1918

Remembrance Day. - The fourth anniversary of the war was well observed, and the increased numbers at all our services were inspiring, particularly at both Eucharists. The collections were morning £2/2/0, evening £1/3/6, total £3/5/6, which sum was sent to the local Prisoners of War fund.

The Stamford Infirmary. - Most grateful thanks to all subscribers towards the house-to-house collection. Nearly everyone helped, and many of the contributions were on a most liberal scale. Witham (exclusive of the Hall)

gave £2/12/2, Manthorpe 13/9, Toft and Lound 15/5. Mrs. Wilcox, Mrs. Ash and Miss Lee again kindly acted as collectors.

Boy Scouts. - It was a pleasure to welcome the scouts from the flax camp at Hale House to our service on Sunday morning. The Commandant stated how pleased he was to find a church in the neighbourhood where they could attend the choral Eucharist, as that was the service he wanted most of all for all his boys.

Local Prisoners of War Fund. - Miss Ida Brudenell has received the following letter from the Countess of Ancaster (*of Grimsthorpe Castle*), President of the Bourne branch of the British Red Cross Society:- "Dear Miss Brudenell. - There are now 63 Prisoners of War whose homes are in Bourne Red Cross district, exclusive of Bourne Parish. (those whose homes are in Bourne Parish are being dealt with separately). A

15lb parcel of meat, biscuits, tea, sugar, jam, margarine, tobacco, etc., is sent to each of them every week, and in addition, 9lbs of bread once a fortnight. The cost is 19/- week for each man, or about £240 a month for the 63. Netley Hut funds being sufficient for immediate needs, it was agreed to suspend the Netley monthly collections in favour of this more urgent call for our Prisoners, and I shall be grateful if you will kindly undertake the new collection in your area. Yours truly, E. L. Ancaster."

We venture to ask all the monthly subscribers to Netley Hut to continue their donations to the new fund instead, and that many fresh subscribers also will come forward. The sum collected at present is £1/1/6 per month; cannot we endeavour largely to increase it? At present we have, fortunately, no prisoners from the parish to help (2nd-Lieut. Metcalfe, being a commissioned officer, is not included), but we may have. Meanwhile, let our sympathy go out to those poor fellows from the parishes around us who would starve but for the food sent them in their harsh captivity.

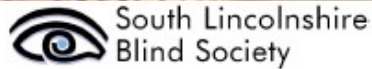
