

YOUR VICAR WRITES

Some things in life come back to bite you! Ten years ago, I found myself the Rector of a picturesque Church in a former village (now a suburb) on the outskirts of Grimsby. A growing population coupled with a large new housing estate created a healthy demand for weddings and baptisms. The Church could comfortably hold around 120 people and each baptism service catered for two families. Every baptism meant a packed Church and the 'missional potential' was huge.



Or at least it would have been, if I could have heard myself speak above the din!

With one or two exceptions, the majority of such congregations were uninterested, bored, fidgety and probably focused more on the 'do' afterwards than the head-wetting preliminaries. I don't say this as a criticism; it was the reality of what I had to work with. All the vicaresque smiles and easy-to-follow service sheets I could muster made no difference whatsoever! Folk were 'in attendance' but refused to surrender their 'attention'.

But their attention was what I wanted!

Something extraordinary and dynamic was happening; a child was being born -again into the life of Christ, washed clean from Original Sin in the hallowed baptismal waters and welcomed as a member of the People of God. Undeterred I plodded on ending every Sunday morning feeling like a stand-up comedian who'd just died on stage. I would love to tell you that the fire-eating idea came to me in a 'glorious moment of revelation' but, in all honesty, I was desperate and desperate times occasionally merit drastic measures!

Fire-eating isn't rocket science but it certainly is scientific! Creating a cavity with your mouth, exhaling a steady flow of carbon dioxide to extinguish a burning flame just past the (visible) lips of your open mouth doesn't demand

a huge amount of skill but it does require a fair amount of nerve. The most important part of the whole endeavour was using the trick to convey the message. One of the key dynamics of baptism is the understanding that the Holy Spirit becomes an active and vibrant force in the life of the newly baptized person (young or old).

Throughout the Bible that same Spirit is often symbolised as a 'fiery presence' or 'force', be it the burning bush that spoke to Moses, the fiery pillar that led the Israelites through the wilderness or John the Baptist foretelling that Jesus would "baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3.11). My reasoning was that, if this was a moment when the Holy Spirit makes a home within the heart and life of the baptized believer, then (seemingly) ingesting fire would be a good way of getting the message across.

For once in my life, I was right!

Nervously placing a flaming torch in my mouth proved to be the clincher! It warmed 'indifference' into 'interest' and gave me the near-captive audience that I craved. The only snag was the unforeseen press interest and the increased demand for baptisms (two extra per month and phone calls from parents seeking confirmation that I would be fire-eating at their child's baptism because they'd said I would be on the invites). It was certainly interesting to watch how a local article in the Grimsby Telegraph ballooned into national press interest, the high-point of which was an interview on Radio 5 Live Drive and an appearance on ITV's People Do The Funniest Things (I was on with another Vicar who did a clown routine).

Back on planet earth, baptisms remained busy and the fuss quickly died down. After three years of fire-eating baptisms (I suddenly realised I'd done the same thing for three successive children of the same parents!) I decided to put it to bed. Having established myself in the community through weddings, funerals, pastoral care, school assemblies and the regular worship of the Church, I began to notice that folk were more than happy to participate at baptism services without the need for pyrotechnics. I have to say that it came as a great relief!

Since then the story has occasionally resurfaced and a recent article in the Stamford Mercury landed me in the Telegraph and Daily Mirror the following

day. The Mirror's coverage included a quote from me saying "It's got to be for getting a message across rather than entertainment". I hope I can stay true to that statement. After all, something wonderful, dynamic and lifechanging does happen at every baptism but it has nothing to do with a fireeating Vicar. There in the font a child is reclaimed by the God who frees us from the hindrance of sin through the loving-sacrifice of his Son, Jesus Christ. It opens the door of our lives to welcome God's Holy Spirit; the passionate and active presence of God within us and it sets us aside as a member of the People of God. Yesterday's newspaper will help light the kindling for tomorrow's fire, but baptism prepares us for a life lived in the light of eternity. That's a message I don't mind repeating over and over again.

100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

April 1919

The Memorial. - Mr. Prentice has designed a Cross of unusual dignity and beauty, to commemorate those who have fallen in the War, and the Committee have decided that it shall stand on the village green, at the bend

of the road between the Church and the old stocks. No more commanding position could possibly have been chosen, for there it will arrest the attention of every passer-by. (Note. - Since writing the above, the site has been modified, Ed.) The ancient base to which we referred last month will be mounted on three steps, and will support a graceful and slender shaft terminating in a hooded cross. It is an almost exact copy of the famous cross at Somersby. The total height will be 16 and a half feet. The cost is estimated at something over £100, and every parishioner will be offered the opportunity and privilege of contributing.

Notes from Witham-on-the-Hill Parish Council March 2019 Meeting

Present: Cllrs Charles Henriques (presiding), Andrew Greenwood, Janet Kirkwood, Lynne O' Hara and Sue Pennant-Jones.

Others: Bernard Champness – Clerk and County Cllr Bob Adams.

Cllr Pennant-Jones said that the East Green Garage area is being neglected. The council grass cutting team do not seem to be aware of it on their rounds.

The abandoned car, mentioned in the last meeting, has still not been moved.

The meeting wished to record thanks to Witham Hall school parents for no longer parking cars in Bottom Street, following complaints from residents' requests to the Parish Council.

Good news received, the drains have been cleared by the cottage in Main Street, as when it was flooded water sprayed onto the cottage as vehicles drove through.

Cllr Bob Adams had heard nothing from Highways with regard to proposed plans for the crossroads on the A6121. It was also mentioned the illuminated sign at the bend was only activated at 60mph which is too fast.

He was asked to raise the matter again along with request for double white lines on the approach.

C.Cllr Adams also reported on the outcome of the recent budget. The Increase was approx. 5% for a band D property.

Cllr Pennant-Jones mentioned the amount of road chippings thrown on the footways made walking uncomfortable. A footway sweep will be requested.

Cllr O'Hara reported the play equipment was now in place and being well used by the children. A plaque is to be installed by Cllrs Greenwood and Kirkwood on the park recognising Mick George for the kind donation.

Cllr Henriques was concerned the website was still not updated and is very out of date. This will be amended when Cllr Henriques is given the code for editing.

Public Forum: Four members of the public attended the forum and were most welcome. One attendee asked if attention could be given to the gate at the Jubilee Orchard, the centre bolt on the larger gate will not align due to movement in the supporting post, also was it necessary to keep the gate locked in the winter as he had to climb over the gate to gain access. It was agreed repairs to the gate should take placed and consideration given to the removal of the padlock, providing better access. Another member of the public expressed concern at the speed gravel lorries were traveling around the corner of Bourne Rd by the Village Hall and displacing some of their load onto the road. He was advised the gravel lorries were an agenda item and was welcome to stay to listen to the discussion.

This is a portable, battery operated sign that can be moved to different locations in the village. This was proposed, seconded and passed unanimously. Parish Clerk to action.

We also had an interesting talk from Ralph Philips of the Community Speed Watch Campaign. Ralph discussed the campaign, a collaboration between the Police and local communities, to stop speeding in rural areas. He told us how members of the local community can volunteer to be trained in the use of hand-held speed guns together with other equipment, to encourage drivers to observe the speed limit in the village.

It would be necessary to have a team of three volunteers, one to aim the speed gun, one to count the number of cars the gun is aimed at and one to record the details of the speeding vehicle. The more teams of three the better.

Fencing Quotes Croake Hill & Jubilee Orchard: Three quotes were obtained from reputable companies for the replacement of Post & Rail fencing in Croake Hill. The successful quote which was proposed, seconded and passed unanimously, came from SD Cox Fencing at a cost of £355.00, work to commence early April.

Due to the very high cost of Deer fencing around the perimeter of the Jubilee Orchard, it was decided to look at more cost-effective options. PC to action.

There is a volunteer (a retired officer who knows the reality of speeding enforcement) who has been travelling far and wide to spread the word, I'll drop him an e-mail and ask if he can make it. It is a bit short notice on my hospital appointment, so I've not had chance to speak to him in the time I've know I'll be off.

If he can't make it to add some flesh to the bones of the project, please make a note of any queries and concerns and I'll try and answer them on my return to work. I am quite happy to arrange an additional meeting if required to give a presentation if the need is there.

Working Parties: Cllr Lynch thanked all those who have volunteered to carry out various tasks in the village since the start of the new year.

We are looking for more local people to put their names forward to help with light tasks in and around the parish. We are keen to meet those who know how to prune fruit trees.

The trees in the Jubilee Orchard require some attention.

If you have the skills or are willing to learn, please contact the Parish Clerk who will be delighted to hear from you.

CAB: The council received a request from the Citizens Advice South Lincolnshire asking for a donation to help support the work they do in the county. The consensus was that a £50 donation could be made after establishing it can go to a local CAB office.

Gravel Lorries: Cllr Cowan raised concerns of the gravel lorries and issues associated with them, mainly the damage caused to the road and grass verges, the speed some of the lorries travel through the village and spillage of their load on the corner of Bourne Rd by the Village Hall.

Cllr Cowan suggested contacting the haulage companies, arrange meetings with the individual firms to discuss the concerns and working together with them in the future, with a view to resolve these issues.

.Any Other Business: Cllr Brown discussed the location for a Plaque to commemorate the Pilots who flew from the Airfield in Creeton Road. After discussion, a site visit will be planned for the first week in April.

Witham on the Hill WI - March 2019

Many of the WI members have suffered with back and neck pain and Mark Jessop told us that this would be the most common problem people go to see him about as a Chiropractor. The technique was developed in USA by Daniel David Palmer in 1895. Mark became a Chiropractor after studying for 4 years at University and he has a practice in Grantham. Jane's seasonal recipe

Not quite sure what the connection with St George's day is, but this is yet another very tasty variation on bread and butter pudding from the Dairy Diary.

St George's Day Pudding

10 slices white breadchocolate hazelnut spread75 g dried cranberries

1 pint milk

3 tablespoons caster sugar

4 eggs

Spread the bread with choc spread, make into sandwiches & cut into triangles. Arrange neatly in base of 2 pint ovenproof dish. Scatter with cranberries. Gently heat milk & sugar, until sugar dissolves. Pour milk onto beaten eggs in a steady stream, whisking well. Pour over bread & leave to stand for 30 mins. Bake at 180c for 40 mins until golden & lightly set. Serve warm, with cream if liked (gilding the lily springs to mind!)
