#### The Vicar Writes

As I type this message the works at the Vicarage are nearing their completion and rehearsals for the Steam Action Pantomime at Edenham are gathering momentum (oh yes they are!). It's a busy time to be sure, especially with a General Election and Christmas only around the corner...

In all honesty it takes me quite a while to get into the 'Christmas spirit'. The tree nearly always goes up late on Christmas Eve in our house and I try to avoid TV during December in order to forgo the endless Christmas adverts (it was something of a shock to discover that the builders working at Edenham Vicarage had been listening to a dedicated Christmas radio station from the middle of November).

It's somewhat ironic that, being a Vicar, I don't get the time to appreciate Christmas until it's really happening! That said, the Christmas memories I've amassed since I was first ordained are among the most special. Back when I was a curate in Nottingham the three-year-old daughter of a couple in the congregation was suddenly taken ill with a dramatic swelling in her throat that left her unable to breathe or

swallow and quickly put her life in danger. The little girl, Emily, underwent emergency surgery just days before Christmas and afterwards her parents kept vigil at her bedside praying for her recovery and reading her the Narnia stories by C. S. Lewis. After finishing my morning commitments, I went to see them in the ICU at Queen's Medical Centre on Christmas day. Emily still hadn't regained consciousness and things were looking bleak. I felt utterly useless making small talk with Emily's parents whilst their daughter fought for her life. It was then that they asked me to celebrate the Eucharist for them in the ICU. They wanted to recall the birth of the Son of God, to receive him as bread and wine and to pray for Emily's recovery in the middle of all that was happening. So that's what we did. We laid out the all the necessary elements at the foot of Emily's bed and joined in the Mass of the Shepherds (the first Eucharist of Christmas morning). We heard the familiar account of the shepherds being first to glimpse the Christ-child after hearing the song of the angels on the hillside near Bethlehem. Emily remained unconscious for a few days more but eventually made a full recovery and it was a sheer delight to see her back to her energetic self,

running around the Church on a Sunday.

Another memory that comes to mind each December was the time I spent with a lady called Anne at St Andrew's Hospice in Grimsby on Christmas day. Anne was an absolute treasure! She sat just inside the Church entrance in Grimsby on a Sunday and greeted everyone as they arrived each week. Sadly, Anne was diagnosed with terminal cancer and bravely carried on regardless until being taken into hospice care. It was there in the hospice that I saw her after the last of my services on Christmas morning. Anne didn't much feel like Christmas Communion. Her sense of taste was all higgledypiggledy (her words) and all she really wanted to do was to eat ice-cream! The brilliant hospice staff happily obliged so that Anne and I sat watching the "Strictly..." Christmas special whilst feasting on a ready supply of vanilla soft-scoop and orange-flavour Callipos. Anne passed away not long after Christmas. Her funeral was a truly moving occasion and her daughter went on to complete a charity skydive in her memory.

But perhaps the most cherished Christmas memory of all for me happened when I was aged ten or so. I attended Midnight Mass with my

mother in the tiny village Church of St Cecilia not far from Collingham near Newark. An elderly retired Priest dressed in a crumpled linen surplice took the service and preached the most wonderful sermon story... He told of how a rich couple arranged a lavish party at their home following the baptism of their new-born son. The infant was becoming a little crabby after the service and was sent away to put down to sleep upstairs. As the guests arrived several enquired where they should put their fine fur coats and were told to deposit them in any of the available rooms upstairs (it didn't matter which). Soon the party was in full swing until someone asked if the child at the centre of the celebration could make an appearance. But where was he? No one could guite remember! He wasn't in the nursery - where could he be? No one could remember when they last saw him! A search was made but to no avail! Then, acting on a hunch, one of the maids started to lay aside the many heavy coats in one of the bedrooms and there, beneath all the finery, she 'found the babe' sound asleep! The child at the centre of the celebration (and the reason they'd gathered in first place) had been laid aside and forgotten but now he had been found once more.

## 100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

#### December 1919

**The Memorial. A request**. - A list of the fallen hangs in the church, near the font. Should there be any omission or error, we ask the relatives to notify the Vicar *before the new year*, as the names will shortly be cast in bronze for fixing to the memorial, and it is most important that the list should be absolutely correct.

Editor's note: We have no record of any entry for January and February 1920.

#### January 1915

1915 - Our wish to all our readers on this occasion shall be for a happier New Year. The year that is gone has been one of the saddest in the annals of our parish, and the Christmas Festival has only served to remind us afresh of our loss. For Christmas was ever a season particularly dear to our late Squire (Walter Lionel Fenwick died 13th August 1914), and which he loved to mark by thoughtful acts of kindness to us all. ## Germany Willing for Xmas Truce If--



added gloom and anxiety of war have combined to make 1914 a year of sorrow which we shall never forget.

**Day of Intercession.** - Sunday the 3rd of January, has by request of the King, been set apart as a day of solemn intercession for Divine guidance in the hour of national crisis. The day will be observed by every religious body in the kingdom and we trust that all the parishioners will take part in one or other

of the special services in church, which will be held at 8-30, 11-15 and 6-30. Forms of service will be provided and special hymns will be used.



## Notes from the Edenham Parish Council Meeting - 12th November

#### **Open Forum Meeting:**

The chairman welcomed 4 members of the public who were present. Mr Steve Brooks, Onlincolnshire, gave a brief on the 'Gigabyte Voucher Scheme' available to assist rural area business and private home holders to upgrade their broadband access to full 'fibre capability'. Detailed scheme information is to be sent to the council where it will be circulated to councillors for dissemination to local business and private householders encouraging uptake of the scheme. Cllr Hill, LCC, reported that following concerns raised by Mr Whyles, 'Agrilinc' Scottlethorpe, he has raised the issue of poor drainage and the condition of the road by Randall's Farm with the Highways Dept. He is also aware of the blocked drain on Main Street, Edenham (Pillarwood Farm), and the poor condition of the drainage dykes alongside Gunborough Hill both of which he will endeavour to expedite their rectification.

Cllr Whadcock reported - Steam action is still progressing the purchase of Memorial Benches.

Mike Harrison, an actor and director from Tolethorpe Hall, entertained us with a fascinating history of Tolethorpe. After our "Shakespearian Supper" served by members in costume, Mike performed a series of Shakespeare monologues.

In November's meeting Sue Jakeman, dressed in a beekeeper's suit, came to talk to us about keeping bees. She was so enthusiastic and animated about the importance of bees to our environment, it seemed a real shame she has discovered she is allergic to bee stings and so can no longer keep bees. There are about 50,000 bees in a hive; 48,800 are female worker bees with 200 male drones and one queen. The queen mates with about 17 drones over 3 days and then spends the rest of her life laying eggs. The drones die after mating. Sue explained the difference between bumble bees who live in groups of about 60 and mason bees which are solitary & live in walls.

Sue Renner gave the vote of thanks. The raffle winner was Angela Clifford.

The competition was a bee item. Sue Renner won, Kaye Mundy came  $2^{nd}$  and Trudy Templeman  $3^{rd}$ .

## Jane's seasonal recipe

We have loads of pumpkins this year – not huge, just big enough for one meal, so this is a perfect veg accompaniment to a meat dish – perhaps even your Christmas dinner! Chilli can be left out if preferred.

#### **CRISPY PUMPKIN BAKE**

1 kg pumpkin

5 tablespoons olive oil

12 shallots

1 red chilli

1 tablespoon rosemary

2 tablespoons parsley

1 orange zest

120g fresh breadcrumbs

Put shallots in ovenproof dish, toss in 1 tablespoon oil. Bake in oven for 15 mins at 200c. Chop pumpkin into 2 inch chunks. Add to onions & mix well, cook for further 15 mins. Heat rest of oil in frying pan, add chopped chilli, rosemary, parsley & orange zest, stirring constantly. Add breadcrumbs & seasoning, mixing well. Cook for 1 min. Reduce oven to 180c. Tip breadcrumbs over pumpkin & onions. Bake for 30 mins until golden & pumpkin has softened.
