

Your bank MAY CALL to advise you of a suspected fraudulent movement in your account. If they do call, DO NOT give them any details until you have cut that call and made a call to yourself or another friend to make sure that your line has not been hijacked. The Vicar Writes

Hidden away in most family photo albums you'll find the baby and childhood pictures (the photos your children pray will never be on display when a boyfriend or girlfriend pops round!). Of course, it's fun to look through old pictures and to re-live some of those memories – wedding photos showing how much hair your father once had and the days when your mother was a natural blond! Then there's the photos of new-born babies arriving home from hospital, early family Christmases, school photos, sports days etc - they're all there – special times, special places and special people.

The second chapter St Luke's Gospel is not unlike a photo album of Jesus' childhood and brief look back to easier and more straightforward times. Obviously, there are no pictures but we do get glimpses of his early life; from his birth through to the time when he was twelve years old and went missing in the Temple. Not much else is known about those years. It's almost as if an important volume in the family photo album has been left behind or lost. chiefly those of his mother Mary. It could be that she shared them with St Luke or that others remembered her speaking of them. Whatever the case was, they were remembered by someone and St Luke, inspired by the Holy Spirit, wrote them down so that we can read and know them today.

These memories aren't your average memories either!

There are no birthday parties, first words spoken or visits from the Tooth Fairy. But there is a growing sense that the child at the centre of it all would prove to be someone exceedingly special. What we see unfolding before us is the life of the man who, from his birth onwards, was (and is) the Saviour of the world.

Looking back into his childhood we see, first of all, parents who were loving and God-fearing. Mary and Joseph were Jews who believed in God and practiced the religion of the Old Testament. In keeping with the Law they brought Jesus to the Temple when he was about forty days old, to offer the sacrifice prescribed for a mother and her new born child.

Earlier, Luke had described Mary as being "favoured" by God and that

the Spirit of the Lord was with her. Mary was favoured by God because God was a vibrant part of her life; she believed in him, obeyed him, and lived her life in response to him. We might even go as far as to say that Jesus was fortunate to have had such a good and God-fearing Mother.

But something happened that day in the Temple, something that remained fixed within the heart and mind of Mary; an old man, a stranger, would suddenly become an important figure in her childhood memories of Jesus. Although he was unknown to Mary, the elderly prophet Simeon was someone who, like Mary, had allowed the Spirit of God to shape and direct his life. And now, as he neared the end of his life, the only thing that was missing (the only thing that he was holding on for) was the promise of glimpsing God's salvation, of actually seeing the one who would be the Saviour of Israel and of the world.

God fulfilled his promise to Simeon. When he saw Jesus, when he saw that pink, wriggly, bundle of fluff, he knew that it was nothing less than the pinnacle of his life! "Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace according to thy word. For mine eyes have seen thy salvation; which thou hast prepared before the face of all people; to be a light to lighten the Gentiles and to be the glory of thy people Israel."

Simeon knew that his life was now complete because God had done everything that he'd promised he would do and, just as Mary was full of grace, so Simeon was full of trust, trust in God. And, having given thanks to God for the privilege of seeing Jesus, Simeon then turns his attention to Mary... Simeon wants to talk to Mary about her child but not of how beautiful he is or how he has her nose or chin. Rather. Simeon speaks of all that her son will one day bring about. Simeon tells Mary that her child will be responsible for the falling and rising of many – that those who look not to Jesus but believe that their own righteousness can justify them before God, will inevitably fall and fail. But those who, like him, see in Jesus the grace and loving forgiveness that God is offering would (through him), guite literally, be lifted-up to heaven!

How would this come about? Simeon was again on hand to hint at how it would be opposition to Jesus (culminating with his death upon the cross) that would pay for the sins of the world. But that wasn't all, for Simeon warned Mary that "a sword will pierce your own soul too." Those words must have caused Mary's heart to miss a beat. Her baby, this perfect child, the one who she'd brought into the world, was going to cause her extraordinary grief and pain – words that must surely have come back to her the day she stood at the foot of the cross.

It was some time after Jesus died that St Luke composed the memoir of memories that we have today, and when you read them, you get the impression that Mary was looking back over those memories to see how, from the very beginning, the life of her son spoke of how God would bring salvation to all who believed in him. He came to live a life with one primary purpose; to give up his life as a ransom for many and to bring us back into relationship with God.

This collection of memories; memories of the childhood of Jesus ends with these words: "And when they had performed everything according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favour of God was upon him."

The favour of God was upon Jesus and, through Jesus, God's favour now rests upon all who turn to him. That same Jesus may well have been part of your childhood memories (there may be Baptism or Confirmation photos in your family album). Why not take the time this year to reacquaint yourself with Him at the beginning of this New Year? Details in the usual places – we'd love to welcome you!

105 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

There are no entries for February 1920 in Rev Cooley's notes. I have used those from 1915 instead (editor)

February 1915

Lent, a call from God - Year after year this precious season of grace comes to us and we pass it by. This year however, which is likely to prove the most momentous in our lives, the call of Lent is one to which we must listen. We must try and put away our indifference and our apathy, and turn to God, who alone can help us in this hour of our country's peril. Many of us seem to have lapsed into indifference, which in a small scattered community like ours is the most deadly enemy which we have to fight. There has been a sad falling away lately of several who once were regular worshippers, regular communicants. Since the outbreak of war there have actually been more

empty places in the House of God than before. Well then, let us all begin afresh this Lent. Let every reader of these words ask himself or herself: "how can I best answer God's call this Lent?" Make a resolution to pray daily, to come to church with regularity, to begin afresh to be a frequent communicant, to put our duty to God before our own convenience and inclination, and thus to help ourselves and others to serve God better.

Two further Recruits - Alfred Pick and Richard Carr, Royal Field Artillery.

The Day of Intercession - Last month was unfortunately very wet, preventing the attendance of many from a distance. Our offerings of £1 4s. 6d. were given to the Red Cross Society.

New-laid eggs for the wounded. -Several friends have kindly promised a few eggs weekly for the wounded sailors and soldiers in hospital. We hope later on that others will be able to spare some also. They will be sent to the receiving house at Stamford every Friday, and should arrive at the Vicarage by Thursday. 200,000 are needed every week. Many hundreds have been already promised in the district.

Swinstead Parish Council Meeting -Clerk's Notes

Thursday 14th November 2019

Present: Chairman, Paul Cunningham, Vice Chair Cllr M Dermody, Cllr C Lunn, Cllr B Lynch, Cllr D Darling, C Hatch (Clerk), Visiting County Councillor, Bob Adams.

Public Forum: No members of the public attended the forum.

Financial report was presented and accepted; a copy can be obtained from the Clerk.

Croake Hill - Muir Housing has agreed a maintenance programme for grass cutting and shrub maintenance on the green at Croake Hill. This will include 16 cuts from March 2020 until the end of November.

Speed Sign - Data was presented to the Councillors for September (Creeton Road) and October (High Street). While located in Creeton Road, the speed sign registered 81 vehicles breaking the 30mph limit. The figure for the High Street is more alarming, 984 vehicles travelling in excess of 35mph.This is an increase of 455 speeding vehicles in the High Street since the sign was located there in July. The Chairman will repeat his call for volunteers to support the Community Speed Watch campaign.

Correspondence - Letters of thanks were received from Mrs P Wright (Secretary to the PCC) thanking the Parish Council for their donation to St Mary's Church. Also, a letter from Cancer Research thanking Mr N Hawkins for his donation to them. Mr Hawkins requested the funds the Parish Council were going to give him to cover his costs for cutting the grass at the Bourne Road entrance to the village should go to the charity.

Parish Cleaner - The Councillors were advised that the Parish Cleaner will be moving out of the village in the early New Year and has requested we advertise for a replacement. Orchard Gate - A new sleeve has been purchased to enable the gate post at the Jubilee Orchard to become removable, allowing larger hedge cutting machinery into the Orchard.

Chairman's Report: Residents Concerns:

At the September meeting one local resident raised concerns about the footpath outside his property. This was reported to Highways who after inspection confirmed "No Action" would be taken at this time.

At the same meeting another resident raised concerns about the large Ash tree just outside her garden. The Clerk confirmed he has written to this resident confirming the action taken with SKDC and Lincoln County Council Highways department. Now awaiting a response from Highways.

The Chairman advised of the continuing flooding problems in New Estate. Cllr Adams said that having visited the site, he would speak with Highways and advise on progress.

The Chairman confirmed the

purchase of new Flower/Bulb Planters which will be located at the three entrances to the village. The Big Plant will take place at 10am, November 23rd & 24th all volunteers will be welcome to come and help with the locating and planting up of the new planters. Quotes are being requested for "Welcome to Swinstead" signs.

The Chairman told the councillors, he had contacted several haulage companies via email suggesting working together to make sure speed limits are being observed and lorries are properly covered. To date he has had no response.

The Chairman asked the Clerk to contact Muir Housing to gain approval to site a Christmas Tree on the Green at Croake Hill. If approved, the Clerk to purchase a tree and lights for the Festive season.

He also let the Councillors know Grimsthorpe Estate is happy for the Jubilee Orchard to become a Memorial Orchard. This will enable local residents to donate a tree or a bench in memory of a loved one. More on this in the near future.

Councillors Reports:

Clir Lunn: Confirmed the cost of a final grass cut and the cutting back of the hedge inside the Orchard, this was approved and will take place as soon as possible, weather permitting.

He also asked the Clerk to contact a local resident regarding trees/ hedging that was overhanging the boundary causing some problems for pedestrians on the foot path. This has now been actioned.

Raised the question of the War time Airfield Memorial Plaque location. The Chairman confirmed this is on his agenda and will confirm the location once he has spoken with the landowner.

The Clerk circulated the LALC training programme of 2020/21. He encouraged all Councillors to attend appropriate training days during the forthcoming year.

The Clerk is to request quotes for work on the Swinstead Cross. Work to the Jubilee Orchard gates and for signage for the new planters

Figures from the 30 mph speed sign were circulated. There was a noticeable decrease in the volume of traffic during December due to the road closure at Creeton. While the sign was in Bourne Road during November, 1614 vehicles entered the village at speeds between 35 and 50 mph.

Jane's seasonal recipe

We are still eating pumpkins! These little squares are delicious – adapted from a Lidl recipe.

PUMPKIN, PECAN & WHITE CHOC BLONDIES

275g pumpkin (or butternut squash)
175g soft butter
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
200g light brown sugar
1 egg
225g plain flour
125g white choc
100g pecans

Chop pumpkin into chunks & cook in microwave until soft (approx. 15mins). Mash & leave to cool. Beat butter, vanilla & sugar until pale smooth & creamy. Add egg, beating well. Stir in pumpkin, flour, chopped choc & pecans. Spoon mixture into greased & lined 8x12in baking tin. Bake 180c for 40mins. Cool in tin for 10 mins. Cool on a wire rack. Cut into squares. Can be served cold as cake, or warm with cream or ice cream.
