The Vicar Writes

By the time you read this, Valentine's Day will have come and gone. For some people 14th February brings with it a fair share of anxiety. There's the wondering if a card will arrive and what the recipient will make of a card that's been sent. Sometimes Valentine's cards bring great joy, whereas on other occasions they can get you into trouble (Thomas Hardy's 'Far from the Madding Crowd' is a good example of the latter). While I was growing-up I never worried about Valentine's Day. Regardless of my 'relationship status' I knew that I would always get a card come rain or shine. Why? Because my Gran sent me one every year until I was eighteen! The only snag was that she used to sign it "Much love, Gran"!

Well, at least I knew my Granny loved me!

One place where few people expect to find romantic love getting much of a mention is in the Bible. But they'd be wrong! If you venture into the Old Testament, you'll discover a book known as the 'Song of Songs' (which is another way of saying that it claims to be 'the very best song of all'). It often surprises people to discover that the Song of Songs is a collection of slightly racy love poetry. Sadly, we

don't often hear it read aloud in Church. At one point the Church authorities considered it to be too romantic to be read in Convents. However, there is a passage from chapter two which, together with a small portion of chapter eight, is often read at weddings (Song of Songs 2.10-13; 8.6,7). The verses from chapter two describe what one 'lover' hears from the other...

My beloved speaks and says to me:

"Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away;

for now the winter is past, the rain is over and gone.

The flowers appear on the earth;

the time of singing has come,

and the voice of the turtledove is heard in our land.

The fig tree puts forth its figs, and the vines are in blossom;

they give forth fragrance.

Arise, my love, my fair one, and come away.

In these words, we can hear the beauty of a Mediterranean springtime (and with our own weather being a little unpredictable right now we may take some comfort in that). We also hear God's invitation to us, his beloved, to be his own. We also hear Christ the

bridegroom inviting the Church, his bride, to be with him for ever and we hear the splendid cadences of the love of a man and woman for each other. As I mentioned, the reading goes on to include some verses from chapter eight. Perhaps this is the voice of the other lover, answering and responding to the previous invitation...

Set me as a seal upon your heart, as a seal upon your arm;

for love is strong as death, passion fierce as the grave.

Its flashes are flashes of fire, a raging flame.

Many waters cannot quench love,

neither can floods drown it.

If one offered for love all the wealth of his house,

it would be utterly scorned.

This lover calls for a union with the other that is as close as a tattoo on the arm or a seal (a mark) upon our very hearts. For love is strong and fierce, as powerful as death and then some! Love is a burning flame that no torrent can quench. Only a fool would attempt to buy it; love is more precious than that. If you've ever felt love, then you know the truth of these words. They speak of the love that unites God and Creation, Christ and his Church, husband and wife in their marriage. Such love is so powerful, so central to existence – both human and Divine – that words fail us in describing it, as indeed words must fail us when we try to speak of such things. The implication is clear: human love at its best, it's most passionate, it's most flaming, reveals something of the love of God for us!

Now, we may think we know what that means. We may know something of what love is and how flames can rage and leap and burn. But if you look at the text in the original Hebrew language, you'll find that the word we translate as 'a raging flame' is a superlative. In other words, it speaks of it being 'the flamiest flame that ever there was'. But the Hebrew superlative is constructed by combining the word for 'flame' with a form of the name of God (something that can be done in Hebrew but doesn't really work in English). So, love isn't simply the 'most raging flame' or even 'the flame that rages in a way no other flame ever could'. Love is the 'Godflame'! It suggests to us that human love has a share in Divine love; that the passion uniting husband and wife speaks to us of the passion that burns in the heart of God for his people and for his Creation.

So, the love that unites two people in

marriage could be said, in Biblical terms, to be the 'most raging flame' or even the 'God-flame'! At the centre of the love of bride and groom for each other we can see something of the love which is God's passion and compassion for us and for the whole of Creation. So, when you think of love (and of the love you may have for that special someone) I would invite you to consider God's inexhaustible love for you and for us all. Imagine for a moment the most passionate love you have ever known or felt and then imagine a love that burns with such intensity that cannot be adequately described or fully comprehended and maybe, just maybe, you may just begin to see something of the love that God has for you.

One final suggestion. Whether you enjoy poetry or find it puzzling and perturbing – as I often do – it's certainly true to say that a poem often finds a way to describe love that other forms of writing struggle to do. So, may I encourage you to treat yourself (and possibly your significant other) by reading together the poems that you can find in the Song of Songs?

You never know what you might find there!

100 years ago this month

March 1920

The Memorial Cross. - As it was found that some considerable time must elapse before the old school can be removed, the Memorial Committee recently met and decided that the erection of the Cross must not be any longer delayed, and a new site must therefore be chosen. The place finally agreed upon was the churchyard, where it will stand at all events for the time being. In this position it will be a conspicuous object to all passers-by, for the total height from the level of the ground to the summit of the soldiers' Cross of Sacrifice will be over sixteen feet. or some twenty feet above the roadway. Upon the base of the monument will be placed the following inscription:-"In glorious memory of the men of this parish who fought and died in the Great War, 1914-1919." A Bronze tablet bearing the name, regiment, and the place and date of death of each soldier, will be placed on the east wall of the porch, as it has been found that there is not sufficient space for this upon the Cross itself. The Dedication of the Memorial by the Bishop will take place on Monday,

March 29th, at 3 pm. It is hoped that all who can will make a point of being present at this solemn ceremony, and will bring a wreath or bunch of flowers to place beside it as a tribute to the memory of the gallant dead.

The cost including erection will be about £135. Towards this sum the people of Witham have given £30, Toft-with-Lound £14/6/0, and Manthorpe is expected to give about £8. The Farmers' Committee have kindly given the balance of their soldiers' gifts fund amounting to over £27, Captain Fenwick, Mrs. Walter Fenwick and Mr. Monty Fenwick £40; church collection £4/17/4; other contributions £3/11/0. Total £127/14/4. The bronze tablet is likely to cost a further thirty or forty pounds, and just as we write the Trustees of the Church Estate have most kindly voted a grant of £40, wherewith to provide this.

A "welcome" to our Soldiers. - It is proposed after Easter to give a supper to all the men from the parish who served in the forces during the war. We feel sure that this will be readily supported by all, and we will all be asked to contribute either in money or in kind towards it. A committee will be formed to make the necessary arrangements.

The minutes of the last AGM were read and agreed as a true record.

Chairman's Report: Nikki declared another great year with much achieved over the year. We have had 10 meetings, 2 veg and prod meetings and plenty of panto rehearsals. Jane's seasonal recipe

This is my adaptation of a Waitrose recipe – a tasty winter warmer. The original recipe used cavolo nero, but I put sprout tops in, though any leafy greens could be used.

Spicy lemony lentil green soup - Serves 4

250g red lentils 1 onion 1 teaspoon turmeric 1 teaspoon ground cumin ½ teaspoon chilli flakes 1 teaspoon cumin seeds 1 large potato 1 lemon ½ teaspoon salt 200g Brussel sprouts 2 tablespoons olive oil chopped coriander to serve

Put lentils & chopped onion in large pan with turmeric, ground cumin & half chilli flakes. Add 900ml cold water, bring to boil & simmer very gently for 15 mins. Stir in small cubes of potato, 2 strips of pared lemon rind & salt. Add another 500ml water & simmer gently for 20 mins. Stir in the greens and cook for 5 mins until wilted. Whizz with a soup blender to the consistency required – I prefer it slightly chunky. Season with pepper & the juice of ½

lemon. Heat the oil in a small pan, stir in the rest of the chilli flakes, cumin seeds & 2 strips of lemon zest. Sizzle gently for 2 mins until seeds are toasted & the oil a reddish colour. Drizzle over the soup & add chopped coriander & a squeeze of lemon juice.
