

The Vicar Writes

On the 29th July my daughter Jessica reached the ripe old age of 21. The day of her birth is a day I remember for a whole host of reasons. For a start, 29th July 1999 was her due date (possibly the first and last time she's been on time). When the contractions started Lesley was taking a bath and, every time she stood up to try and get out, another contraction arrived and stopped her in her tracks. We eventually got ourselves into the car only to notice that we were a little short on petrol (my fault). I can still remember the look on Lesley's face from the car as I stood in the queue at the petrol station...

We made it to the maternity unit at Lincoln sometime between 5.30pm and 6pm. By the time we got settled into a room it was all systems go and, before too long, our 9lb 3oz bundle of joy made her way into the world. In the frenzy of activity that followed, Lesley was whisked away to be put back together and Jessica was handed to me wrapped in a towel. When I next looked up I realised that everyone else had gone! Knowing that The Sopranos wasn't exactly family viewing, I bought the box set and previewed the episode in question. Well, there was no way I was going to watch it with her! Suitable viewing for a 12 year old it was not! However, as Jess was back with us for her birthday this year and seeing that she had now come of age, I finally relented and on the day in question we watched the episode. In all honesty it wasn't quite as bad as I remembered and Jess has now 'borrowed' the box set and taken it to Hull.

For those not in the know, The Sopranos is an American crime drama that revolves around Tony Soprano (played by the late James Gandolfini), a New Jersey-based Italian-American mobster, portraying the difficulties that he faces as he tries to balance his family life with his role as the leader of a criminal organization. There's nothing he won't do for his family and friends but that's where his love and morality ends.

Loving your enemies is a concept Tony Soprano would struggle to embrace. But that's exactly what Jesus encourages us to do when he reminds us in St Matthew's Gospel that we must "be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matt 5.48). But what is the perfection that Jesus is talking about? Is it a perfection that we could ever attain to or is it only achievable for a handful of super-religious types, say, the holiest Monk or Nun you've ever met? Fortunately, that's not what Jesus is getting at. In verses 43-47, Jesus speaks of how God the Father shows 'indiscriminate love' by making the sun rise and fall on both the good and the bad. Your access to the sun doesn't depend upon your morality, nor can you avoid the rain by deciding to be just plain wicked! In the same way, Jesus calls us to love all people – our brothers and sisters (those who love us) and even our enemies (those who wouldn't dream of loving us). That, says Jesus, is 'perfect love'; divine-like love.

One way of looking at it is to imagine a triangle – not your everyday 'love triangle' to be sure – it's something rather different that I'm proposing!

The greatest commandment is to love God; that's the tip of the triangle. But we are also called to love our neighbours (those who love us); they could be the right-hand point of the triangle. But if we stop there, our love seems obviously imperfect and the shape is incomplete. So, we must also love our enemies (those who, given the chance, we would ordinarily want to wish out of existence). Then, and only then, is the shape – and our love – complete, whole and perfect.

Everyone, even the worst of people, love their own. Even the most terrifying Mafia mobster remembers his Granny at Christmas. But what kind of love is that? It's lopsided love! It's a one-sided triangle which, of course, is no triangle at all. We are to love with perfect, complete love. The love that is ably demonstrated and brought to perfection through Christ's offering of himself upon the Cross. As St Paul pointed out in his letter to the Romans "... while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son" (Rm 5.10). That is perfect love. That is the love we are called to emulate. That is the love of God the Father has for us in Christ.

It's somewhat ironic that, holding my daughter for the first time (someone I

1.0 Open Forum Meeting
Councillor Casual Vacancy - Co-

option - Following the retirement of Cllr A Martin earlier this year, Councillors unanimously voted to accept Mrs Marion Marshall as a coopted Councillor to the Parish Council. Declaration of Acceptance of Office to be progressed by the Parish Clerk.

Resignation - Chairman Cllr Biggs announced that due to a change in personal circumstances he is resigning from the Parish Council. Cllr Biggs said it is with great sadness that this will be his last meeting as a Parish Councillor and Chairman of the Parish Council.

Vice Chairman, Cllr P Cranfield, proposed a vote of thanks to Mr Biggs

for all of his support and involvement in the community over the last 16 years both as a Councillor and a well-known figure in the Parishes. Ray and his wife Kim will be leaving Edenham, they will both be sorely missed by the Parish Council and the many friends that they have in the area. Cllr Robins (SKDC) also thanked Mr Biggs. Cllr Robins said, 'Having worked together for over 10 years, it has been a pleasure. You have always been very professional and you will be missed'.

Cllr Robins SKDC Update - Employees are starting to return to the Council offices following the national lockdown and home working arrangements. Many local businesses have now re-opened and SKDC are continuing to support businesses. In January the Local Plan was adopted. A review of the plan will commence 14th September to consider changes in local housing needs and provide an update on the provision of employment land and gypsy and traveller accommodation. There is currently work ongoing in relation to keeping dogs on leads and dog fouling.

All parishioners are reminded that the Open Forum at each Parish Council meeting is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. 5.0 Coronavirus Pandemic Support -

Information from Edenham and Grimsthorpe Steam Action-Lucie Wilson (Chairman)
Steam Action is still shopping and offering support within the villages; however, this has reduced

considerably in the last few weeks. The team remain on alert in case there is a second wave of Covid-19. Steam Action received a certificate from the Lincolnshire Resilience team for the help and support they have offered during the pandemic. The team is now starting to focus on Christmas; it will be very different this year due to the required Covid-19 controls. The Parish Council Chairman said that he hoped that the Parish Council, in conjunction with Steam Action, would be able to hold the annual carol singing event around the Christmas tree.

Terrace, also, the litter has been cleared from the area. In recent weeks there have been some rather unpleasant signs of human excrement on grass verges/roadside lay-bys between Edenham & Grimsthorpe.

6.3 - SID Update - the unit is now in place near Copy Lawn Farm.

6.4 - Tumblerow Farm/Scottlethorpe Road - Update from Highways Dept investigation into potential collapsed drain in this area - The Parish Clerk received a reply from the Highways Dept stating that, following investigation, a job has been passed to Alliance Partners. It is anticipated that this drainage investigation will be completed by 21/11/20. Works are prioritised countywide and, although we will endeavour to complete works by the date given, there are times when this is not possible due to weather events or unprecedented demand."

Cllr Whadcock raised concerns about potholes that have not been filled on Scottlethorpe Rd, a fix my street report will be raised again. A polite

reminder that anyone can raise issues of potholes in the local areas via the 'Fix My Street' App.

6.5 - Gigabyte Voucher Scheme & Quantum Air Fibre Optic - Cllr Clarke reported that progress is very slow with BT/Openreach. Cllr Clarke contacted Mr S Brookes from Onlincolnshire to see if he can help to speed up the process. Quantum Air is no longer being progressed as there was limited interest in this option from residents and therefore it is no longer considered viable.

6.6 Hedge/Tree trimming near the BT Exchange in Grimsthorpe - The
Parish Clerk is waiting for further
feedback on expected dates for the
works.

6.7 - Local security - implementation of a 'No Cold Calling Zone' - Letters explaining the scheme were delivered to every residential property throughout the Parishes on Friday 4th & 5th September.

Witham on the Hill WI

Witham on the Hill WI was pleased to have a dry but, unfortunately, a little chilly evening for their outdoor meeting in August. We all brought our own chairs and there was a lot to catch up on as this was our first meeting since March. Many of our members have been knitting and sewing headbands, uniform bags and scrubs for the NHS and learning new technology skills just so they can communicate with their family and friends. During lockdown we have been setting quizzes for our members. August's quiz was a logo quiz and September's was about the month September.

The September meeting was held in the Church as it gave us space to be socially distanced. We were definitely on-message as one of the national WI resolutions is to End Modern Slavery and Duncan Brock came to talk to us about this. He works for the Chartered Institute of Procurement and Supply, which educates people to be aware of good practice in the supply chain. He explained Modern Slavery is when people are forced to work, owned, controlled, dehumanised, not free to move around, badly fed and clothed, housed in poor conditions, paid a very low wage, and often have their passports taken away. In 2015 a parliamentary act tried to address the situation but with limited success. Companies with an income of £36m must produce a statement about modern slavery but only 70% have done so. One of the highest risk industries is mobile phones from mining of the metals and child labour in the assembly of the phone. The next highest risk area is clothing manufacture, mainly in Asia, but also Leicester! Other problem areas are car washes & farming in UK. The consumer has to make the difference by not purchasing goods that are too cheap!

"You may choose to look the other way but you can never say you did not know."

106 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

OCTOBER 1914

The War. – The progress of our allied forces is slow though we trust sure. It is quite possible that a very long time may elapse before the cessation of hostilities and the final victory is won. Meanwhile we must not slacken our intercessions. Let everyone of us make a resolve to pray daily during the war for our brave sailors and soldiers, and the success of our arms. Twelve o'clock is the time suggested by the authorities for such intercessions, at which hour the "Peace Bell" is toiled, to remind us of this duty. Further, every Sunday the service at 11-15 is set apart as the special weekly act of intercession: let all who can attend it in preference to any other, and make it a reality.

The Red Cross Society. – Our parish has given most valuable help to this society's work by providing and

equipping twelve kit-bags for the troops at the front. Each bag contains a shirt, pair of slippers, two pairs of socks, towel, handkerchiefs, comb, laces, boracic ointment, writing materials, pipe, tobacco and cigarettes. The last three items are the gift of Lady Ancaster. The following are the donors of the bags -Mrs. Bradshaw, Mrs Brudenell, Mrs. Carr, Miss Christie, Mr. E.W.Cooley, Miss Lee, Miss Metcalfe, Mrs. Parkin, Mrs. Pick, Mrs. Redshaw, Mrs. Wallis and the Vicar. Shirts have been given by Mrs. Battram, Mrs. Francis, Mrs. Lambert, Mrs. Pick, Mrs. Fenwick 4, and the Vicar 4; the last eight being made by Miss Brudenell, Miss Christie, Mrs. Glenn, Mrs. Garner, Mrs. Holmes, Miss Osborn, Mrs. M. Pell and Mrs. Redshaw. Our grateful thanks to all.

The Rifle Range. – We trust that by the time this magazine is published shooting may be re-commenced at the miniature range, in the sand pits. We desire to thank Mr. Fenwick for providing this excellent opportunity for rifle practise and feel sure that many will avail themselves of it.

The Prince of Wales' (National

Distress) Fund. – In addition to the large collection made in church, which we recorded last month, a house-to-house collection in the civil parish of Witham – kindly undertaken by Miss A. Holmes – has resulted in a further sum of £3/18/0. Collections are to be made – so far as we know – in Manthorpe, and Toft-cum-Lound.

Jane's seasonal recipe

I made this the first time with fresh gooseberries, and the second time with thawed ones from the freezer. Both worked well. I have adapted the recipe from a Waitrose card. I didn't have enough ground almonds, so, I topped it up with plain flour. The second time I used 200g of ground almonds (omitting the flour) but it sank in the middle, though was perfectly fine. Flour helps to produce a firmer cake but if you need a gluten free cake just use ground almonds.

Gooseberry and Pistachio cake

5 eggs, separated
220g golden caster sugar
100g natural yogurt
60ml olive oil
140g ground almonds
60g plain flour
½ teaspoon baking powder
½ teaspoon bicarb
100g pistachios, chopped
125g gooseberries (small pink ones)

Whisk egg whites to form soft peaks. Gradually whisk in 110g sugar, until stiff & shiny. In separate bowl whisk egg yolks & 110g sugar until thick & pale. With a large metal spoon gently fold yogurt & oil into yolk mixture. Add almonds, bicarb, baking powder, 75g nuts & gooseberries. Carefully fold in egg white, & spoon mixture into 23cm greased & lined spring form tin. Smooth the top. Bake for about 1 hour 180c, covering the top halfway through with foil. When cooked should be well risen & coming away from the side. Cool in tin. Serve dusted with caster sugar & 25g chopped pistachios.
