

The Vicar Writes

Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel [a name which means God is with us]. *Isaiah 7.4*

The Church of Immanuel stood in the middle of a large and busy village. But if anything was the beating heart of the community, it was not the Church! The congregation was a collection of the most boring, mundane and downright-depressing Christians in the world... ever! They were a miserable lot and they knew it. They didn't really like each other (never mind anyone else). The Church was cold and empty, with only a handful in the pews on a Sunday.

Witham's Stimson Hall Theatre is an outstanding facility available to pupils, named in memory of Mr David Stimson whose loyalty was demonstrated in his 59 years of service as gardener. Mr Stimson was a long-standing member of the Witham on the Hill community and is remembered for his "commitment, humility and professionalism" throughout his career.

Witham on the Hill Parish Council Notes of the Meeting of Nov 2020 held remotely via video link

Jo Plews and Lisa Lord provided an update on initiatives to combat speeding. They have been in contact with Lincs Road Safety Partnership (LRSP). Amongst the discussions were options of volunteers monitoring speeds through the village: LRSP could provide a site survey with training and 6 static lamp post speed signs for a £40 fee. A handheld speed gun would need to be purchased with high-vis jackets and an advisory signage kit for approx £390.

Another option discussed was purchase of reactive speed signs and wheelie bin stickers £2,000 approx.

Cllr Adams suggested that help with funding was unlikely.

Frances Plummer ascertained the Church Hall Committee would have no objections to housing a defibrillator, although listed building consent would be required.

Jo Plews obtained and forwarded costing for defibrillator to the Clerk of £1,149.00 ex-VAT. Incl a 10-yr warranty. Frances Plummer informed all, the School was still happy to extend the use of their defibrillator. Signage to find it was discussed.

Lisa Lord felt there was a shortage of Dog Poo bins and asked if one could be located in Bottom St. It was discussed, if we purchased it, SKDC would not accept responsibility for its emptying.

Cllr O'Hara reported that SKDC were happy for us to paint the play equipment on the Green. The majority of the work has been carried out, a few outstanding items – new seats for the roundabout awaiting from SKDC.

Cllr Henriques wished it to be recorded that painting of the equipment had greatly improved the look of the play area and grateful thanks to Martyn Hyde, Valentino Calabrese and Frances Plummer for their hard work. £106.50 cheque was approved for paint.

The necessary protective work on the stiles either end of the church field has now been done by the landowner.

Cllr Adams gave his report:

Budgets for County and District Councils were on track this financial year.

COVID-19 would likely have an impact on business and domestic rates but no info as yet. He was pleased to report that front line services would not be affected.

Unitary Authority was now on back burner again.

It is illegal for cars to park on the pavement and Enforcement Officers are in place to check illegal parking.

The Government has made available substantial financial support for low-income families. LCC received £835k for support to vulnerable. Additional £400k to Lincs food partnership and food banks. £215K to Community Lincs Programme ran by YMCA to help with Good Neighbours and communal kitchens.

Cleaning Drains was now a priority.

The approach to the A6121 crossroads will have double white lines applied. The work would be carried out in the spring 2021. The reactive speed sign has been replaced and 40 mph signage added to the junction /bend warning panels.

Planning received: S20/1898 trees removed, no objections. S20/1451 Bridge Cottage works, S20/1313 Brookside cottage treeworks, S20/1372 Greystones, treeworks, and S20/1458 Prep. School, treeworks; all approved.

Cllr O'Hara reported that discussions to improve the canopy over the stocks, are still in progress.

The Clerk was instructed to approach a possible candidate for replacement of the retired auditor.

Cllr Pennant-Jones will email copy of this month's meetings minutes to The Three Towers Magazine.

Mr G Plews (resident) enquired if the village could have metallic poppies placed at each entrance to the village. Cllr Henriques had contacted the British Legion. Hopefully these


should be in place for Remembrance

Notes of the meeting of the Parish Council held via ZOOM on Thursday 19th November 2020

The Clerk asked Cllr Lynch to act as Chairman for the meeting.

The Clerk apologised for an error at the September PC meeting, in allowing a guest Councillor to propose the acting Chairman.

The Minutes of the previous meeting held on 17th September were agreed as an accurate record and will be signed by acting Chairman when Covid-19 restriction allow.

Clerk's Report:

Finance: The Clerk presented the accounts which met with full approval. (Report available from the Clerk).

Speed Sign: Data was presented to the Councillors.

Jubilee Orchard: The Clerk advised that 3 new fruit trees have been purchased at a cost of £115.50 and planted.

Following a discussion with Richard Lidstone of Park Farm, Richard confirmed he will cut the hedges at the orchard at no cost to the Parish Council.

Notice Board & Spring Bulbs: The Clerk took the opportunity to thank

Cllr Ashby for erecting the new notice board.

He confirmed that he and Mrs Cowan had re-planted spring bulbs lifted from the village planters earlier in the year and re-planted them in and around Croake Hill. New spring bulbs were purchased for the village planters. As many of last year's plants had been over wintered and replanted, the total cost of new plants was only £39.42.

Unregistered vehicles: Following on from Cllr Plowright's concerns regarding unregistered vehicles, driving through the village, the Clerk confirmed he had spoken with both Grimsthorpe Estate and Park Farm who confirmed, all their vehicles are insured to travel on the highway, even those not displaying number plates.

The Clerk advised he had placed the Parish Poppies around the village in plenty of time for Remembrance Sunday.

Cllr Underhill thanked the Clerk and Mrs Cowan for all they do for the Village.

Chairman's Report:

As acting chairman I would like to pass my thanks on to the Reverend Ed Martin and Reverend Andy Hawes for making sure that Remembrance Sunday was observed in Swinstead. Father Ed filmed the dedication and reading of the names of our war dead and posted this on social media while Father Andy conducted a small service on Sunday morning and the laying of the Parish Council Poppy wreath at the war memorial in the church.

Croake Hill: The Councillors were reassured by Cllr Robins that the recent incident involving 2 residents in Croake Hill was still under investigation by all relevant agencies. Cllr Robins will forward comments made by Councillors to the relevant agencies and keep the PC advised on developments.

Croake Hill Brambles: Cllr Underhill asked if a working party of volunteers could clear the brambles at Croake Hill green. Cllr Lynch will organise a site visit with the Greens Committee. A date will be set on Social Media calling for volunteers to help with the clean-up.

Village Christmas Tree: Cllr Ashby advised, a 15-foot tree will cost approximately £150, lights £50. The tree will be sited on the green area

on the left as you enter Swinstead from Bourne. The area is deemed large enough to allow for carol singing and refreshments, weather and Covid-19 restrictions permitting.

Roads, Volunteers: Cllr Underhill requested volunteers to clear the gullies at the junction of Forstedd Hill and Bourne Road to prevent flooding in the winter. The Clerk will advertise the date on Social Media, (hopefully a dry day), probably a Sunday morning, bring your own flask, the PC will provide the biscuits.

Any Other Business: The Clerk advised he had been contacted by residents in the High Street confirming, after extensive discussions with SKDC & LCC Highways, the ash tree outside number 56 High Street, although sited in a conservation area, is not subject to a Preservation Order and can be removed. The residents advised the cost of removing the tree would be between £800 to £1,500 and wondered if the PC would contribute to the cost. After discussions, the Councillors decided a contribution would be an inappropriate use of public money as the tree is not the responsibility of the Parish Council.



100 years ago this month

(From entries made by the Rev L H Cooley into the Parish Magazine—reproduced by kind permission of The Witham on the Hill Historical Society)

DECEMBER 1920

The bronze Tablet will very shortly be ready for erection. It will be remembered that the War Memorial Committee decided that, instead of fixing this on the Cross, the steps of which are too narrow to give the space required for it, it should be placed in the porch, where it will be in a most conspicuous position, and in close proximity to the Cross. It was then agreed that the present inscription should be cut on the steps, which indicates the object of the Memorial. This plan has been adopted in many cases of churchyard memorials, when the names are perpetuated upon the more enduring metal tablet, for it is thus protected from the weather, whereas, if fixed to the stone out-of-doors, it stains the stone and renders it unsightly.

Poinsettia - Cultivation Notes (With thanks to the RHS)

I am sure that we are not the only family who buy their poinsettias around Christmas and never seem to manage to keep them alive! Luckily, an Irish friend of mine is a member of the RHS. This is one he sent to me this month.

Poinsettias need bright, but filtered light, away from strong sun and draughts. They need a minimum temperature of 13-15°C (55-59°F).

Be careful when transporting poinsettias from the shop to your home in the winter, as the cold outdoor temperatures can damage the foliage. Always ask if the shop can wrap the plant in paper right around the top of the foliage, or put it in a plastic bag so that it is completely protected.

Sometimes a poinsettia will start wilting once you get it home, and continue to deteriorate, no matter what you do. This could be due to the plant having been stored in cold conditions in the shop before you bought it.

Unfortunately, there is little you can do about this. Buying plants from reputable suppliers is therefore recommended.

Water poinsettias sparingly as overwatering can damage plants. As a rule of thumb, only water when the surface of the compost has begun to dry out. The flowering life of plants is extended by humidity, so mist plants regularly.

Feed monthly with a low nitrogen, high potassium fertiliser.

If potting up poinsettias, use three parts John Innes No 3 to one part grit.

Getting plants to colour up again next year

Poinsettias are often disappointing in their second year, but this is the best way to try and get a good display from them in their second year.

Prune back the plants hard in April, to about 10cm (4in), and keep at a temperature of 13°C

In early May, repot them, growing them in a light, cool place over summer. A temperature of 15-18°C (60-65°F) is ideal

Flowering and bract colouring is initiated by short winter day-length, occurring naturally in December and January. So from November

onwards, plants should be put in a dark room after twelve hours of daylight and protected from artificial light sources

Plants need a constant temperature of around 18°C (55°F) to colour up well, so make sure they do not get too cold

Commercially grown poinsettias are often treated with growth depressant or dwarfing chemicals to obtain a compact plant, but plants grown on for a second year will revert to their taller, natural habitat

Propagation

Poinsettias can be propagated by <u>softwood cuttings</u> in May, making sure you wear gloves, as the milky sap can be an irritant.

Jane's seasonal recipe

This is a BBC Food recipe that I have adapted. I have reduced the amount of caramel as I felt it was a little too sweet. It is a very tasty unusual dish – so if you love beetroot give it a try! You could use pre-cooked beetroots to save on time, otherwise you have to prepare well in advance.

Beetroot Tarte Tatin

4 medium sized beetroot 35g butter 35g caster sugar 200g puff pastry 1 egg

FRYING PAN WITH METAL HANDLE

Wrap washed raw beetroots in foil, place on a baking tray and cook 200° C for approx 1% hours. Set aside to cool in foil. Peel the beets and cut into quarters. Cover the base of 8in frying pan with butter – spread out and press down with fingers. Sprinkle sugar over butter. Heat over a medium heat until butter melts and sugar turns light golden. Arrange the beets in circles to cover the base of the pan. Set aside to cool. Roll out the pastry to 8 in circle to fit over the top of the pan. Brush the pastry with beaten egg. Ensure that the frying pan is safe to use in the oven – silicon handles can cope up to 240° C. Bake in oven 200° C for approx 40 mins until pastry is golden and oozing caramel slightly at the edges. Invert carefully onto a serving plate. Serve with a green salad and balsamic dressing.
