Fire Station News

Watch Manager, Bryan Lynch

The personnel at Corby Glen Fire station have been busy in 2011 with over 60 incidents attended by the end of April. These have varied from chimney and car fires to more serious road traffic accidents.

One incident involved two cars who had collided on one of our minor roads resulting in one driver being severely trapped by a side impact to the driver's door. Being first on the scene, we quickly assessed the situation. The car had gone from the initial impact with the other vehicle through a roadside hedge. The damage to the vehicle meant that it was difficult to get to the casualty but our first priority is always to get a casualty carer in place as soon as possible. Next the car needed to be stabilised using blocks and wedges as it is vital to have solid platform to work on; the slightest movement of someone in a vehicle crash with suspected neck and spinal injuries is always paramount in our thoughts.

Bourne's fire crew were next on the scene which gave me the luxury of a Crew Manager who I could use as a sector commander in charge of cutting operations, while I looked after the whole incident as Incident Commander. The crews from Corby Glen and Bourne worked quickly and efficiently together and the excellent training provided by the Fire & Rescue Service shone through – the incident being managed from dynamic risk assessment, casualty care, aggressive glass management, cutting operations to removal of casualty. Ambulance crews were already treating the casualty when the air ambulance flew in carrying a doctor and paramedic; and once freed the casualty was transferred to hospital via the helicopter.

A vehicle fire in a village gave locals a frightening experience. Seeing how quickly a modern car can be engulfed in flames, an incident made all the more intimidating by the close proximity of houses in a narrow street. This made having a fire station close by seem all the more important. Our breathing apparatus crew of Firefighters Walsingham and Harwood quickly brought the blaze under control.

As I mentioned earlier, the training provided by Lincolnshire Fire & Rescue is second to none and the Service has just won a national award for its workforce development. The Service has created a superb training facility on land leased at RAF Waddington, which includes mock ups of earthquake damage for training the search and rescue teams who have recently returned from Japan.

I have just attended a 2-day Supervisory Manager Level 3 course. This is an intense training period with 6 people attending the course from all over the county. Incidents are set up for you to

manage as a first attending fire appliance just as you would do at real incidents. Cars set on fire, road accidents with human casualties, house fires, fallen electricity poles and people fallen into water are just about the most realistic training you will find anywhere in the country. Feedback is given on your performance at the end of each scenario. Interesting terminology was to think of ourselves as the sticking plaster to the incident you can make things a little better and prevent things from escalating until more resources can get to the incident ground. It was interesting and thought provoking two days!

Thank you to everyone who attended our recruit awareness day, the event turned out to be a great success.

JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPES

This is a quick and easy recipe I use a lot at home. To make it even easier and quicker you could use a ready made curry sauce! It can also be made with gouda or even cheddar, but a lower fat cheese works best.

FRUITY EDAM CURRY

1 onion chopped

1/2 oz butter, or 2 tablespoons of oil

1 tablespoon of mild curry powder (or stronger if you prefer)

1 tablespoon cornflour

¹∕₂ pint vegetable stock

2 tablespoons chutney

1 oz sultanas

1 courgette

1 eating apple

200g edam cheese

Fry the onion gently in the oil for 5-10 mins until softened but not brown. Add the curry powder and cornflour, & cook for 2 mins. Gradually add the stock, & heat gently until thickened. Add the sultanas & chutney. Simmer gently for 10 mins. Add chopped courgette & chopped apple (skin can stay on) Cook for 5 mins. When almost ready to serve, remove from heat & stir in cubed edam at the last minute. Serve with boiled white rice.

Parish Annual Meeting

Annual reports were presented from Edenham School, the County Council, District Council, Parish Council and the Village Hall. No additional issues were raised by members of the public.

Parish Council AGM

Mr McWilliams was elected as Chairman and Mr Stock as Vice Chairman. An update on planning applications was provided and details of proposed alterations to one of the Parish's rental agreements were outlined. New swing seats have been purchased and installed at the playing field but rabbit hole damage on the playing area remains a problem.

Local highway topics were discussed including the proposed walkway in Toft. It was agreed to start discussions with the Highways Department to purchase a new reactive sign in Toft on the A6121 from Bourne. An updated financial summary

was given and a cheque for

A Parish Clean Up Campaign was discussed and volunteers to progress the campaign were forthcoming for Toft and Manthorpe areas.

It was agreed to hold Parish Council meetings on a 2 monthly basis rather than the existing 3 monthly period. The date of the next meeting was scheduled for 12 July 2011 at the Toft Hotel at 7.30.p.m.

Parish Council AGM

The Annual Parish Meeting was poorly attended again this year. The outgoing chairman of the Parish Council gave his annual report which included the long awaited planning permission for the extension of the car park at the Green, new street signs and congratulations to Susan Pennant -Jones on the excellent job she was doing as community cleaner.

He concluded by thanking all who had served on the Parish Council during his reign and the clerk, Rosemary.

The clerk gave a brief report on the end of year accounts for 2010-11. The District Councillor Miss Channell reported that SKDC no longer dealt with bus passes as this had been taken over by Lincolnshire County Council. County Councillor Trollope-Bellew informed the meeting that the county's aim for the next couple of years was to mend and repair the roads. He also reported that the Council had bid for a grant to improve internet connection and speed but would not know the outcome until the autumn.

The review reflected the use of the Hall and Field during the previous 12 months. From his point of view it had been a reasonable year with a small profit showing in the accounts. The meeting agreed that to close the Hall would be a drastic step and a small committee has been formed to look in more depth at the situation to see if the facility can be used more effectively by local people at the same time looking for new blood to help in running it.

Michael Wilson agreed to act as a temporary Chairman and David Marshall agreed to remain as Treasurer with David Johnson as Secretary. The Committee members will meet on 1st June 2011 to review the options. So if any member of the local community has any thoughts or ideas then please come forward to any of us before this meeting otherwise there is the real possibility of the Hall closing.
