ASSISTANT CURATE

Later this month, David and Sarah Pickett will move, with their three children, from Mirfield Theological College, in South Yorkshire to Corby Glen. David is to be ordained on July 3rd to be the Assistant Curate in Beltisloe Deanery. I am designated as his 'training incumbent' and therefore a great amount of his time, at least initially, will be spent in and around the 'Three Towers' villages. My role is to help him adjust to life as an Ordained person, to teach him the practical, administrative tasks that are part and parcel of a Parish Priest's life,

to mentor him as he begins pastoral ministry and in the leading of worship, It is my task also to oversee his ministry as a teacher and preacher of the Faith.

David will join in the daily rhythm of prayer and worship of our communities, and as relationships and opportunities develop will spend time in some of the other thirty four parishes in our Deanery. All this is in place to enable David to prepare to take on responsibility as a Parish Priest in four years time.

Next month David will introduce himself; this month provides an opportunity to write something about ordained ministry in general.

HOLY ORDERS

During the Reformation of the mid sixteenth century, and the ensuing secession from the authority of the Bishop of Rome, the Church in England was very careful to keep unbroken the Apostolic Succession of its Holy Orders of ministry. From the time of the Apostles the authority to preside at the Eucharist, to Baptise, to teach the Faith, to bless and forgive in the name of Christ was conferred by prayer with the laying on of hands, by those who had received this commission by Christ himself. In this way men were ordained or 'set apart' for this role in the life of the Church. This gift of authority, and the ministry that flows from it was passed on from generation to generation by the sign or sacrament of the laying on of hands – this physical continuity ensuring the integrity of the ministry of those ordained.

There are three orders or types of ordained ministry – Deacon, Priest and Bishop. All ordained ministers

are ordained Deacon first. This is the foundation for all ordained ministry. David will be ordained Deacon in Grantham on the 3rd July. As soon as he is a Deacon he will become a member of the clergy and by addressed as The Revd or Father – depending on local custom. He will not be a 'Vicar' or a 'Rector' as this is a 'job title' of an ordained person – as would be 'Chaplain' or 'Padre'.

A Deacon is given authority by ordination to preach and teach the Christian Faith, to exercise pastoral care, to lead worship including funerals. A Deacon in the Anglican Church does not Baptise or conduct weddings except in exceptional circumstances. Being a Deacon is usually a time of preparation for ordination as a Priest, although some men and women are called to remain as 'permanent Deacons'. All being well, after a year, David will be ordained Priest and then he will be given authority to preside at the Eucharist, to Baptise, to give absolution to those seeking forgiveness (hear confessions) and to give a blessing in Christ's

name. The order of Bishop can only be conferred on those ordained Priest and a Bishop has oversight of the pastoral care of the Clergy, has authority to ordain people to Holy Orders and to confirm people. The minimum age for ordination is twenty four, for Bishops it is thirty years of age.

Having a newly ordained Deacon in our communities will be a new experience for us all and it is important to realise that David will learn a great deal from his day to day encounters beyond the routine of Church life. Everyone will play a part in the development of his ministry – knowingly or not! He will be encouraged to make himself known to as many households as possible, and I am sure he will find a welcome in all our villages. Speaking personally I am looking forward to what will be a new challenge and opportunity, and I look forward to having a clerical colleague to share the daily round. My confident hope is that we all will be enriched by his time with us. Please join with me in remembering the whole Pickett family in your prayers.

JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPES

I found this recipe when searching for ideas to use up gooseberries from the freezer, before Bob pinched them all to make wine (they do actually make an excellent wine though!) With the gooseberry season coming up, the ripe pink ones are best, so leave them on the bush longer – don't use hard green ones.

GOOSEBERRY & WHITE CHOCOLATE FOOL

12 oz gooseberries
3 tablespoons sugar
2 tablespoons water
1large tub natural yogurt
150g white chocolate

Poach the gooseberries, sugar and water gently. Remove 4 whole gooseberries for decoration, before they turn to pulp. Leave to cool. Melt white chocolate gently until smooth – in a bowl over a pan of simmering water, or for 1 ½ mins in microwave, stirring halfway, taking care not to let it burn. Put half the cooled gooseberries in the base of 4 individual dishes; and stir the rest into the yogurt. Gradually stir the yogurt mixture into the chocolate and mix well. Spoon onto the gooseberries in the dishes, then leave to set for about 1 hour in fridge. Decorate with reserved gooseberries.

I did try this recipe with raspberries, but it didn't work so well – too sweet!

Clerk's notes of the Parish Council Meeting held at St Andrew's Parish Hall, Witham on the Hill 14th March 2011 between 7.30pm-9pm.

Four members of the ParishLincolnshire County CouncilCouncil, the Clerk, District(LCC) Arboriculturalist hadCouncillor & three members of thechecked the chestnut tree at thepublic were present.junction of Bottom Street and

One of the major issues was the proposed planning application to change agricultural land into a Golf course. Members of the public were able to give their opinions and it was decided that the District Councillor would apply for the application to be discussed at South Kesteven District Council (SKDC) Development Control Committee. Councillors were concerned about the removal of mature trees without applying for the correct consent and two letters of objection had been received which raised many valid points. Other planning issues discussed were the proposed Village Green car park extension and additional joinery and materials at The Old School House. The councillors agreed that they would provide no representation to either. The clerk was asked to contact SKDC regarding the proposed removal of the willow tree at East Green.

Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) Arboriculturalist had checked the chestnut tree at the junction of Bottom Street and High Street. He informed the clerk that a micro moth was responsible for the brown foliage and the tree would recover.

A village highways walkabout had taken place on Monday 7th March with LCC Officers, C.Cllr. Trollope -Bellew and members of the Parish Council. It had been agreed that various patching work would be carried out and road markings, but the doubling of the kerb and replacing the grass along Main Street was to be deferred until 2011/12. Sue Pennant-Jones had reported that the internal back wall of the Stocks required attention. She also stated that there was a problem with the catchment sink not holding
