THE VICAR WRITES: I notice that the comedian Marcus Brigstock has joined those other wits
Stephen Fry and Ricky Gervase by opening up an income stream titled 'mocking religion' (see latest best sellers list)! It's easy to make fun of religion – I do it all the time; when clergy get together we usually end up in hilarity having a good laugh at church life – someone usually has a good funeral, wedding or baptism story to tell, most of which couldn't be published.

But there is something serious here about intelligent, well educated, middle class Englishmen ridiculing the foundations of the society that nurtured the freedom of expression they enjoy. In a celebrity culture it is the Frys, Bonos and Brigstocks that act as the contemporary prophets and soothsayers and they deserve to be taken as seriously as they take

themselves. So being serious I would like to make two observations.

The first is that what they satirise is not the life of faith and spirituality as most people of faith experience it. It is one thing to pillory established religion, it is another to belittle the encounter of the human with the divine, which has been and is the catalyst for the highest expressions in art and the source of inspiration in many areas of knowledge.

This leads me to a second observation. These are clever people whose capacity to reason has somehow become disconnected (perhaps wilfully) from the spiritual experience which is the well spring of consciousness. Until the eighteenth century, and the ironically named 'enlightenment,' the purpose of human reason was 'illumined' by the life of the Holy Spirit. Even the pagan philosophers of the classical world saw that human reason without spiritual enlightenment was handicapped – without spirituality

humanity is destined to be 'oneeyed' and 'one-lunged'.(For any reader who is interested in exploring this further see Eric Mascall –'Whatever happened to the human mind?')

In this way our prophetic comic social commentators are more the result of society than its opinion formers (which is why they are so popular). It is, however, a society which in Christian terms knows how to exist but has forgotten how to live. The New Testament echoes the Old in having guite a lot to say about the 'fool who says in his heart there is no God.' St. Paul points out that the 'wisdom of God is foolishness to man 'Jesus was, before his death, 'satirised' by being dressed and reverenced as a King – a Monty Python moment in the Gospel accounts.

This comedy business is deadly serious – I wonder who will have the last laugh?



JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPES

A couple of years ago we bought a small white currant bush and this is the first year it has produced enough to make anything with. This is the best recipe I could find and makes a delicious cheesecake. I used a mixture of red and white currants to give it colour, but you could use raspberries or strawberries just the same. The recipe also suggested you could use ginger biscuits or orange biscuits, in which case you might use the rind of an orange instead.

It is quick and easy to make, but it does have to be started the day before!

White Currant Tart

500g fromage frais
450g plain yogurt
3 tbsp icing sugar
grated zest of a small lemon
450g white currants
75g butter
300g lemon biscuits
icing sugar for dusting

Mix the fromage frais and yogurt. Line a colander or sieve with muslin or a new J Cloth. Pour the mixture into the sieve, place the whole thing on a shallow dish and put it in the fridge. Leave overnight. Melt the butter. Crush the biscuits, then mix them with the melted butter. Tip them into the tart tin and press down firmly. Chill for 20 minutes. To make the filling, discard the liquid, tip the strained cream cheese mixture out of the muslin into a bowl. Stir in the sugar and zest. Smooth the filling into the chilled tart crust. Pull the currants from their stalks and pile them on top of the tart filling. Dust generously with icing sugar and leave for a few minutes before slicing.


