

Sometimes it is impossible to keep causes of celebration to ourselves. 'I just had to tell someone' a friend might say about a piece of goodness.

I would like to think that the life of the church community is one where joys are shared, and thanksgiving is offered both with and on behalf of those we know and even those we don't. Each Sunday we hear the phrase 'it is our duty and our joy to be thankful at all times and in all places.' To the best of my knowledge there is no other organisation that is so 'geared up' for saying thank you.

8th OCTOBER - DAY PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM

Walsingham in north Norfolk has for centuries been known as England's Nazareth. In the eleventh century the Lady Richeldis had a dream in which the Virgin Mary showed her the house in which Jesus had grown up in Nazareth and asked her to build a copy as a place of prayer. This she did and in so doing discovered a spring. The little house and the spring soon became a place of pilgrimage and healing. Until 1539 the Augustinians managed a huge church and complex for visitors – in that year Henry VIII (once a

Walsingham pilgrim) dissolved the house and the shrine was closed. In the 1930s the Vicar of Walsingham revived the practice of pilgrim and built another 'Holy House' and, as a thousand years before, a spring was uncovered. This much smaller shrine church is now a very popular place of pilgrimage and has a newly opened visitor centre and restaurant. It also provides educational opportunities for children and young people. Children from Edenham School have visited Walsingham twice in recent years.

On our day-pilgrimage we will join in the 12 noon Pilgrims' Eucharist, have a choice of a picnic lunch (there is a room set aside for this) or lunch in the Pilgrims' refectory or in a local pub. The children will have their own post-lunch activity and adults will have time to look around or pray the 'stations' in the grounds. At 2.15pm we will join in the service for healing and leave for home at 4.00pm. The coach leaves Edenham Church at 8.30am and returns at 6.00pm.

The cost is £10.00 for adults – the first child in any family is free, subsequent children £5 each. To book a place please contact Fr Andy or fill in a booking form to be found in church.



Clerk's notes of the Witham on the Hill Parish Council Meeting, held at St Andrew's Parish Hall, 12th September 2011

The Clerk informed the meeting that the majority of the land which contains the Stocks and Sinks area was unregistered with the Land Registry. After considerable discussion it was decided that the Parish Council would monitor the situation. Cllr. Stanton informed the meeting that he had spoken to Ray Thompson in regard to the site and he was prepared to help with some remedial work when time allowed. The Clerk reported that Lincolnshire Highways had sent their Maintenance Team to remove the weeds along the side of the road towards the crossroads. She also reported that South Kesteven District Council had confirmed that it had inspected the blocked drain at the bottom of East Green car park and arranged for it to be cleaned out. The hedge along the footpath towards the crossroads had been trimmed.

It was decided that the Council

would not open a Melton Mowbray Building Society Account as it was hoped that work would start on the extension to the car park on the Green, which at last had been approved with conditions. It was agreed that the Clerk and Cllr. Stanton would obtain quotations.

There was a long debate in regard to the planning application from Mr Soar, Palace Close – demolition of existing dwelling and garage, replaced with private dwelling house and garage. Concern was expressed about the height in comparison with the original building and colour of bricks. It was agreed that there would be no representation for the removal of one Eucalyptus tree at Brook Field House, and pollard of Willow, The Chilterns.

It was reported that pigeons were using the seats of the swings as a defecating area by perching above.

The councillors discussed the possibility of joining with other organizations of the parish to provide a village event to celebrate the Queen's Diamond

Jubilee in June 2012. It was agreed that an Open Meeting be arranged in early October. Please come and show your support or contact a member of the Parish Council, contact details available on the notice boards or parish website – <http://parishes.lincolnshire.gov.uk/WithamontheHill> .

Edenham Parish Council Meeting Notes 13th September 2011

Open Forum: A member of the parish raised the issue of the condition of the BT kiosks in the parish – Secretary to contact BT about cleaning/painting. Also the issue of poor broadband service to rural residents/business was raised. Secretary gave details of current scheme to improve such services by Lincolnshire County Council under a government initiative. Parish Council Meeting:

No objection/comments made to planning application for interior changes to listed property Grimsthorpe (Ivy Cottages)

Annual Audit Report from the auditors, Clement Keys, was read – Audit satisfactory, report accepted by meeting.

Annual Maintenance Grants to Edenham Parochial Church Council and Edenham Village

Hall/Playing Field were considered, it was agreed to make a small increase in these grants from £450 to £465 each for the forthcoming year.

Queen's Diamond Jubilee: It was reported that 'Steam Action' are considering organising an event to celebrate the Jubilee on Saturday 2nd June 2012 such as a family fun day at the village hall/playing field. Possible attractions would include musical entertainment, hog roast, children's games etc. The Council think this would be a great idea and fully support the proposal. It is also hoped that all residents get involved in marking the occasion by offering help during the preparations and participating on the day itself. Make a note in your diary!!

To make a more permanent reminder of the day it was proposed that a weather vane, depicting the year 2012, be purchased and erected on the Village Hall. Cllr Stanford volunteered to construct the vane.

Agreement on design to be discussed at the next meeting, subject to permission/agreement from the Village Hall committee being granted.

Notes of the Swinstead Parish Council Meeting 7th July 2011

Anchor Farm Development, High Street: As there were no further developments regarding signage at this site, it was agreed that this matter will remain in abeyance.

Cheques signed since last meeting:

£96.00 E. Walsingham (supply and fix plaque to shelter); £100.80 PJH Landscapes (grass cutting); £40.00 T. Bradley (grass cutting)

Cheque signed at the meeting:

£50.40 PJH Landscapes (grass cutting)

Butter Cross: The application submitted to English Heritage had lapsed due to insufficient time to obtain plans and quotes. Two quotations have now been received for the work, the first for £2,080 and the second for £800. It was agreed to go ahead with the quotation for £800 from Neil Dolman, Architects in Grantham. The Parish Council has been informed that there will be an increase in this sum but that it will not be more than 5%. It was agreed that Neil Dolman be asked to go ahead with this quotation plus the 5% maximum increase. There will also be the builders' costs after the architectural plan is agreed. It was pointed out that there may be a requirement for an archaeologist to inspect the site and the costs involved will need to be investigated. Mr Somerville will investigate the various options.



JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPES

I am not fond of chutney (I don't like a strong vinegar flavour), but I often make it when I have a glut of fruit or veg as Bob loves it. However, this recipe is one of my favourites, as it is quite sweet and fruity. The recipe originally came from my Dairy Diary, and I first made it last year when I was given a bag of plums and pears. Chutney isn't difficult to make, just very time consuming, chopping all the fruit & veg, and having the patience to cook it for long enough. Chutney must be fairly thick – not runny!

Autumn Fruit Chutney (Makes about 4 x 1lb jars; if you are short of jars, I have plenty - please ask!)

500g bramley apples - peeled, cored & chopped

6 large conference pears – peeled, cored & chopped

8 large plums – stoned & quartered

600g blackberries

50g fresh ginger – finely chopped

red & green chilli 1cm piece of each - deseeded & finely chopped

600g onions – peeled & roughly chopped

750g granulated sugar

450ml distilled white vinegar

Put all the ingredients in a large stainless steel preserving pan.

Heat gently, stirring often, until it comes to the boil. Reduce heat & simmer for 3-4 hours, stirring occasionally to prevent it sticking to the bottom of the pan, until thick and reduced. Spoon into clean jars, warmed in the oven on a low temperature. Store in a cool dark place for a minimum of 1 month, to allow the flavour to develop, before using. Serve with bread, cheese & cherry tomatoes.
