THE VICAR WRITES

Politicians, economists and environmentalists have a new catch phrase: 'The Generational Covenant.' In other words how do we organise our society, manage our resources, plan for the future - bearing in mind our responsibility to future generations. The present worldwide protests about the current state of banking and the globalisation of the world economy are justified by the selfevident truth that all our generation has done is store up debt for the future and ruined the prospects for a healthy environment for our children's children - leaving them impoverished. One has to have sympathy with this claim - I do at any rate. I see the same rejection of 'The Generational Covenant' in the Church in which I serve as a priest.

On the 1st July it is probable that David Pickett will be the first man to be ordained priest in Edenham Parish Church. That is difficult to prove as there has been a church on that site since at least the year 670. Remarkably, David's ordination would be recognisable to every previous generation that has worshipped there. A bishop lays his hands on the ordinand's head and prays for the Holy Spirit to endow him with the gifts and authority of priesthood. This has been the practice since apostolic times. Other priests gather around and also lay their hands upon him. The bishop and all the clergy will be men. To previous generations the idea of having a woman ordained priest would be, at the very least, bizarre. The Church of England has, since 1993, ordained women to the order of priest. At the same time it made provision and gave solemn promises that those who could not accept this innovation as a justifiable departure from the example and teaching of Jesus, and of the world wide church for two thousand years, would have 'a permanent and honoured place in the C of E'; I am one of those people. I believe that the ordained ministry is a sign of The Generational Covenant between

God and his people. To substantially remake and re-order the sign is to jeopardise the covenant.

In July the General Synod of the Church of England will vote on legislation to allow women to be bishops. Bishops are the source and makers of this sign of Generational Covenant. The ministry of women as bishops will have far reaching and irreversible effects on the wider church. The ecclesiastical toothpaste will not go back in the tube. Despite this, the proposed legislation does not make permanent, legal provision for those who desire to remain orthodox. The church has decided that I am no longer (to use a phrase used in 1993) 'a loyal Anglican.'

The Generational Covenant that Jesus gave to the church in its ordained ministry has always ensured that the same faith and signs have been passed on from generation to generation. Not to allow even the smallest part of the church to continue in the orthodox faith is, on one hand, the betrayal of past generations, and on the other, the robbing of the right to an orthodox way of life for my children and grandchildren. It will remove a freedom of choice and essential right to choose. I accept that it is logical for the church to have women as bishops but I find it hard to accept that the cost of this should be the total and absolute rejection of the minority whose only desire is to live in the faith into which they were baptised, and in which they have lived all their lives. It could be that future generations will realise that to ordain women as priests was a short cut to a dead-end: God knows. In the meantime I pray that the church will find a way to honour its own 'Generational Covenant'.

Notes of the AGM held on Monday 11th June 2012

Election of Officers:

Chairman - Peter Cork Secretary - Vacant Treasurer - Sue Cork Hon President - Jim Barnes

Financial Report: Full breakdown of the year's accounts were approved.

Current assets of £901.38 are £117.42 down on last year.

Membership: Membership is due on 1st of January. We only have 17 member households, discussed possible recruitment campaign. It would be good to get back to at least 30, it is still only £5 a year.

TELEPHONE SCAM WARNING

Beware - you may receive a call from someone claiming to be from Microsoft or sometimes your broadband provider. They will try to convince you that there is a problem with your PC. They will then ask to connect to your PC so they can solve the problem. Following this they will tell you that your system is either infected or broken and will offer to 'repair' it for you.

At this point they will request your credit card details so they can continue.

Here's the golden rule: there is not a single legitimate service provider that will contact you in this way, if you receive such a call it is a scam! Do not give them access to your system and do not provide any bank or credit card details to them!

The severity of the scam varies but, in effect, they do nothing you could not do yourself for free if you have the time and a little knowledge or it can be done very cheaply through your local computer service agent.

Another common tactic designed to get even more money from you, is to 'sell' you licenses for antivirus and other computer tools that are in fact freely available to you. In some cases they have also debited further sums to the individual's credit card - most recently the £150 'service' fee was followed by a further £250 drawing against the card.

We are often too tolerant and polite in the UK. These people are con-men and think nothing of taking money from your account, you do not have to be polite and you are quite within your rights to put the telephone down on them.

A more effective approach is to tell them that you have a contracted local engineer and direct them to call them (which they will not do of course).

If you have fallen for this scam you should contact your credit card company and/or bank immediately to get advice on what you can do to recover the funds and to determine if you need to change your credit card for security purposes.
