THE VICAR'S WRITES

The Olympic Games have their origin in the athletics competitions between the city states of Ancient Greece. The discus and the javelin were weapons of war and the marathon preserved the memory of the defeat of Troy at Marathon the messenger running the twenty six miles to bring the news of victory. The games were ritualised warfare and provided the opportunity for the warrior elite to train and hone their skills in a competition which was bloodless. Sport and politics mix very easily. We know that sport has great power for propaganda purposes; we need only think of the 1936 Berlin Olympics and its presentation of Nazi Germany as super power and a 'super race'. The post war period saw the exploitation of the Olympic Games by the Eastern Bloc countries, and the 1968 Olympics are remembered by the black gloved salute of the American athletes launching the 'Black Power' movement.

Politicians know that sport has power, and business knows that

sport is money. The power of sport can be easily manipulated to political and commercial ends and it is a well-used means of exploitation and social engineering. Even as long ago as 1935 George Orwell was warning that the behaviour of football crowds made them ripe for political exploitation; 'all football fans are potential fascists' was his argument, and many sociologists have compared the pattern of life of a football fan to that of a follower of any religion. Last month 17 million people watched the Wimbledon Men's Final. That is only a few million less than the number who voted in the last general election. The value placed on professional footballers reveals a society with an absurd view of what is important.

More parochially families thrash themselves to death to support children in their sport with a devotion that would rival a Franciscan monk, putting enormous pressure on their home life and making sport a priority over many other family activities and aspects of community life. In

other homes countless hours are squandered in the addiction to TV sport whilst at the same time local organisations struggle to find support and volunteers, and (ironically) some local sports clubs struggle to put out teams. There is something unhealthy about this and it would be a good thing if the sports fans among us reviewed the place of sport in our hearts, minds and use of time and other resources.

Like many other aspects of life sport needs to be subject to thoughtful appraisal. Ask the questions 'why I am doing this, who am I doing this for and what outcomes will it have in the medium and long term? The Christian Faith teaches that all things can work for good if they are used for a good purpose but warns that even the best things in life can corrupt if they are misplaced and misused. There is a great responsibility on each of us to be thoughtful about what we do with our lives.

One of our daughters had the opportunity to continue a successful career in international

sport after school and under 18 age groups but she decided to withdraw from the senior international squad. 'Dad,' she said after making her decision, 'I can't see the point in it ruling every minute and every aspect of my life; it's just not worth it.' I for one agreed with her. Hats off to those Olympic athletes who think it is.

and a fountain at the west end, St Michael's Court mirrors the pattern of the Parish Church, its eight beds of green oak shadowing the pillars of the church.







Swinstead Parish Council Clerk's Notes

Accounts for 2011/12 were signed and submitted to the external auditors. Accounts will be available for public inspection later in the year.

Swinstead now falls under the Colsterworth Neighbourhood Watch Area.

No quotations for restoration work on the Butter Cross were received; a further 3 stonemasons will now be approached for tenders. Work on applications for grants continues.

BT will be approached with regard to refurbishing the telephone box.

Costings have now been ascertained with regard to the Council's application for the Community Wildlife Grant. In the meantime, an initial purchase of 5 apple trees will be made to start the Jubilee Orchard in the paddock on Creeton Road. Anyone wiling to help set up and care for the Community Orchard would be most welcome.

Highways will be approached to

ensure that jetting of local culverts was carried out soon.

An application with regard to 12 High Street, Swinstead was approved. The SKDC has conditionally approved the plans for repair of the Church porch roof.

Bad weather prevented completion of the last grass cut on the football field; the Council have now agreed to keep the matter under review. LCC has stated that grass verges are now cut twice per year.

The Council discussed the issue of nuisance bonfires and burning of material in braziers in the village.

Liaison with SKDC continues with regard to issues at Croake Hill.

A letter is to be sent to Yvonne Szwed and Ann Hakesley thanking them for arranging the tea party at the Village Hall for the Jubilee Celebrations.

SKDC will be approached to sweep the pavements of gravel as this remains a persistent problem since the re-surfacing last year.

Next meeting will be held on 6th September.

Notes of the Witham on the Hill Parish Council Meeting 2 July 2012

The Parish Council agreed to adopt the same code of conduct as South Kesteven District Council, (SKDC) which included the Nolan principles and dispensations.

The clerk reported that she had again contacted SKDC in regards to various problems at East Green. She had also received a reply to her request for a map showing the site and number of each street light belonging to SKDC. They replied that there was 'insufficient funds' to place the numbers on the posts. It was reported that some of rights of way had been cleared, while others would have to wait until August.

It was agreed that there would be no representation in regard to the applications to remove a willow tree at Hillcrest House or stone cladding, install new windows and replace front porch with gable roof at The Sycamores.

Cllr. Bonney informed the meeting that he and Mr & Mrs Stapleton

had agreed an area on the Green which could become the Nectar Meadow (referred to previously as Wildflower Meadow). It was agreed that they could spend a maximum of £200.00 on seed and other items required. Cllr. Bonney would apply for a wildlife grant from Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) to help cover costs.

C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew reported that C.Cllr Webb, portfolio holder for LCC Highways, had visited the site at Witham Manor and looked at the problem in regard to the footpath and yew hedge. C.Cllr Trollope-Bellew also reported that LCC had adopted a wind farm policy which was being looked at very closely by other councils. Finally he congratulated Witham on the Hill on their win against Manthorpe in the Tug of War and that he was pleased to support their Jubilee celebrations with a donation from his 'Councillors Big Society Fund'.

Next meeting takes place at The Parish Hall on Monday 3rd September at 7pm. All welcome.



*** JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPE**

Rhubarb is very much in season now, and the Regional House has plenty of it! I have made rhubarb fool, rhubarb crumble, rhubarb cake, and rhubarb chutney. This recipe comes from a British Sugar book which I got in 1977, that started my foray into preserves. I always consult it when I have a glut of produce, to see what I can make. This recipe I used for the first time this year, and it is absolutely delicious on a slice of fresh home-made bread.

RHUBARB AND GINGER JAM

2lb 8oz rhubarb

*

2lb 8oz sugar

5 tablespoons lemon juice

4oz stem ginger

1 teaspoon ground ginger

** Cut rhubarb into small pieces, place in a large bowl in alternate layers with sugar. Add lemon juice and leave overnight. Place in preserving pan and bring to boil, then boil rapidly for 15 mins. Add stem ginger & ground ginger. Boil rapidly for approx 10 mins until setting point is reached - test by cooling a teaspoon of jam on a cold saucer in fridge for 5 mins. Push the jam and if it wrinkles, setting point has been reached. Give the jam a good stir, then pot in small jars and seal with screw tops immediately, while still hot.
