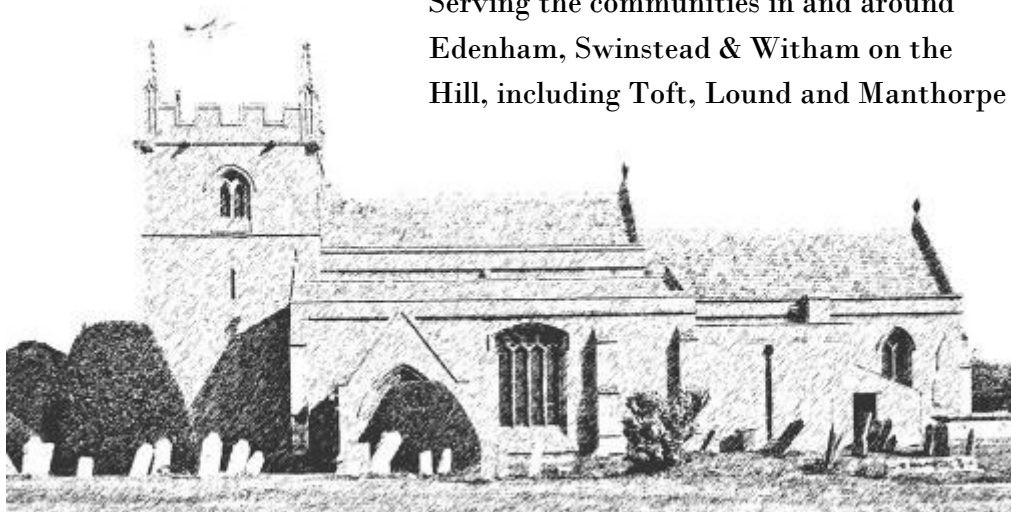

THE VICAR'S WRITES

Jesus said (John 18 v 37) 'I came into this world to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice.' 'Truth' said Pilate 'what is that?' Pilate the politician knew that truth is not only the first victim of war, it is a stranger to those in seek to maintain power. The truth for Pilate was that to maintain peace he had to sacrifice Jesus and condemn him to an unjust death. Thus the Lord of truth was the victim of two lying witnesses.

The recent shocking revelation of the horrendous manipulation of the truth by some members of South Yorkshire Police of evidence relating to the Hillsborough disaster is the latest in a sad catalogue of those in authority hiding the truth to maintain power. We saw it in the parliamentary expenses revelations, and for weeks on end in the Leveson Inquiry. We could all say with Pilate when we are dealing with anyone in power or the media 'what is truth?'

It is no good being hypocritical

about it. Most of us struggle to live in the truth. It is very hard to be honest through and through. Some people would find it impossible to receive some of the truths we could reveal to them about themselves and those who they love. Thus it is that our relationships are built on a foundation that is economical with the truth. Jesus always spoke the truth for he was truth incarnate. He taught quite plainly that he revealed truth –'you shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free.' He also described himself as 'The way, the truth and the life.'

For the Christian, the call to live in the truth is a call to live a life that is often vulnerable to misunderstanding, a life that is conscious of the inevitable sense of failure, and one that is aware of the need for forgiveness and help. In all this, it is important to remember one thing, Pilate asked the wrong question; he shouldn't have asked 'what is truth?' He should have asked 'who is truth?' We can live more truthfully and know true peace and freedom when we learn that Jesus is a

companion to all those who cherish and value the truth – and, that by his unjust death and resurrection, he has shown that truth is stronger than the lie. To know and love him is to know and love truth.

VICARAGE WEDDINGS

In August 1869 the Vicar of Edenham, the Revd Chapman, dropped dead on his daughter's wedding day. This summer the Vicar gave away both of his daughters in Holy Matrimony and survived. The answer to the first question (everyone asks) is: 'No, I didn't marry them. I was the bride's father for the day'; the answer to the second question is 'No, they were very different, unimaginably different!' That is one of the marvellous things about the Anglican approach to the Marriage Service. Elisabeth's was modern language, with well-known hymns; whilst Hannah's service was in traditional language and included one hymn the Vicar even had to learn! One was bathed in sunshine, the other accompanied by thunder, lightning

and torrential rain! Both experiences were marvellous, the only disadvantage of marrying them both off within five weeks is that I haven't another one to look forward to.

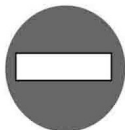

Fire Station News

It has been a quiet last three months for the fire crew at Corby Glen but in that time we have attended some serious road traffic accidents. We were called to assist Bourne and Billingborough crews at a two vehicle accident near Morton where a van and a car had been in a head-on collision. The driver of the van was severely trapped and it took all the skills of the firefighters and paramedics to free the driver from the wreckage. We were grateful for the attendance of the air ambulance; this invaluable capability assists getting the injured to hospital in a very quick time which is all part for the golden hour for any casualty.

We are pleased to welcome new recruit – Tom Pacey to the station. Tom has just been through six weeks of training at the service training school at RAF Waddington where he passed out with flying colours. Although it has been quiet since Tom joined, he has certainly been to some very serious and stressful incidents and

performed very well at two serious road traffic accidents.

The first of these incidents happened on the A1 when a car travelling north went out of control and crashed into a vehicle travelling on the southbound A1. The car travelling south took a full side-impact knocking it off its wheels and onto its side. Stamford and Oakham crews were first on the scene and we were tasked with helping those teams with casualty care of the occupants of one car and the roof removal to free the driver of the other vehicle. Unfortunately despite the best efforts of all the emergency services there were two fatal casualties at the scene.

Two accidents in exactly the same spot on the A151 at Grimsthorpe left me feeling very grateful for the skills that the service has taught me to deal with casualties involved in serious car crashes. The first was a simple matter of removing a sunroof from a car on its side and letting a relieved driver climb out; the second was a Friday the 13th I will never forget. I was working in

my primary job repairing a roof on a Grimsthorpe Estate property with a fellow workmate. At around 10am we heard a terrific bang which we thought could be nothing but a car crash. On investigation I found the cause of the bang was a car which had collided with a tractor which had been parked completely off the road on the grass verge. It was very strange to be at an incident in the first few seconds after it had happened and it was almost like a moment frozen in time with shocked people who had not yet been able to collect their thoughts to respond to the emergency unfolding. The impact had moved the tractor about five feet along the verge and the casualty was slumped in the driver's seat with no obvious signs of life.

Casualty care is the main thing we are trained to focus on in the first few minutes of attending any car crash and I knew from the casualty's position that she had an obstructed airway. I moved the driver's head back into neutral alignment and was grateful for the ID badge she was wearing which

gave me a name to fix on.

After a few moments the casualty started to take some laboured breaths but these, along with a heartbeat, soon disappeared. The only course of action left was chest compressions and after several minutes of trying the casualty again showed signs of life and just managed to flicker an eye.

It was now a matter of maintaining an airway and monitoring the casualty's vital signs. I will always be grateful for the help given to me in those vital few minutes by local villagers and a work colleague – to Wendy Todd stayed with me on the phone to ambulance control and talked them through all we were attempting to do; and to Amy Wilkinson and Gary Henson who stopped and controlled the traffic – you all did a great job.

An on call MoD doctor who is very well known to Corby fire crews was next on the scene and he quickly assessed the casualty and administered oxygen. The Corby fire appliance was next to arrive and I was glad to have the security

of a big fat crew around me!

The fire crew then went through the well rehearsed methods we use at all road crashes and within 45 seconds they had the car stabilised giving us a safe working platform that would aid casualty care and removal. In the following few minutes Bourne's fire crew attended along with road and two air ambulances. FF Pacey took over from me as casualty carer, while FF's Brian Walsingham and Tim Brown worked with the Bourne fire crew to free the casualty.

The local people looking on have told me how impressed they were that each individual emergency service worker knew his own task and seamlessly fitted into the extrication operation and within ten minutes the crews had removed the roof.

The doctor and ambulance crews were working on the casualty during this time and, with what seemed a serious head injury, it was fantastic to have the helicopter there. The crew knew because of the nature of the driver's injuries that Coventry hospital was the best place to take her - "twenty minutes, no problem". It was very pleasing to hear the next day that the casualty would make a slow but good recovery.

The firefighter's charity clothes bank is back at the station and will accept – adult and children's clothing including underwear, linen and shoes in pairs. No thank you to bric a brac, toys, books and electrical goods. Many thanks to all the villagers who have already filled the bank twice over!

Localism Act 2011. All members have now signed revised Declaration of Interest Forms - copies of which have been forwarded to SKDC Legal & Democratic Services

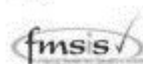

Edenham School Life

Summer term was a riot of colour with Jubilee celebrations, wheelbarrows and Olympic-mania. JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPE

Beetroot has been one of our more successful crops this year, so this is a good way of using it that makes a change from pickled beetroot, beetroot salad or chutney. It is a very hearty, wholesome casserole that can be served with jacket potatoes and a green vegetable.

BEEF AND BEETROOT CASSEROLE (SERVES 4)

- 1kg stewing beef
 - 290ml red wine
 - 2 tbsp olive oil
 - 1 tbsp balsamic vinegar
 - 20g butter
 - 290ml beef stock
 - 16 whole shallots, peeled
 - 2 tbsp crème fraiche
 - 1 tsp brown sugar
 - 1 tsp dry mustard
 - 2 tsp plain flour
 - 3 tsp creamed horseradish
 - 8 small beetroots, peeled and halved
- Heat oil & butter, brown beef over a high heat. Remove beef from pan. Reduce heat, add shallots & cook for 5-10 mins until golden. Stir in sugar & cook until the shallots are caramelised. Add flour & cook for 1 min. Add red wine & vinegar. Blend in stock. Return beef to pan & add beetroot. Cover & cook in oven at 160c for 2 hours until beef is tender. Mix crème fraiche, mustard & horseradish. Stir into casserole before serving.
