

THE VICAR WRITES

As a child, and then as a teenager, I could never understand why on Remembrance Sunday the Gospel reading from St John proclaimed 'greater love has no man than this that he lay down his life for his friends'. The juxtaposition of love and war struck me as odd, and I could not imagine how the soldiers of the Great War, slain in their thousands, could be said to have 'lovingly laid down their lives.' This all changed for me when our son became a soldier, and I was introduced to life in the Army and came to know the family of his company and his battalion. His colleagues often come and stay at Edenham and indeed on their first tour of Iraq in 2006, I took some of them back to camp on the eve of their departure. I also knew and shared their grief when their friends were killed. I saw that they did indeed 'love one another'.

Part of the problem in understanding this kind of love is that love, as a concept, has been debased in our culture. Unless it is fluffy, feel good and pretty it is not love. Love that is hard work and sacrifice, that gives no thought for the self, but only cares for

the person who is loved, is not the kind of love that people seek or is headlines. There is a huge section of the media that is dedicated to 'love' that is not worthy of the name.

Remembrance Sunday is about love; the deepest most mysterious aspect of love. Some of the First World War poets wrote about this. They could see in the soldiers something of the innocent, self-giving love that we see in the suffering and death of Jesus. Studdart Kennedy (Woodbine Willy) wrote about the 'unutterable beauty' of the deepest love and friendships made in the most inhuman of contexts.

One of the features of public life of the past thirty years is that very few involved in government, or responsible for the formation of public policy in other areas, have had any experience of war. Up until this point in national life, the reality of armed conflict and civilian involvement in war, was a significant element in the make-up of the 'national psyche'. Values in family and community life were certainly affected by the 'easy luxury' of a peacetime mentality. As someone who was born nine years after the end

of the Second World War, and whose grandparents were veterans of the First World War, I was always aware that my 'world' was very different to theirs. No one could have predicted how different it would become and that even the meaning of love would be affected.

CONFIRMATION Next year's Parish Confirmation will take place on Sunday 21st April at 1030 in Edenham Parish Church. Preparation for this will begin in the New Year. There are usually two separate groups that prepare for confirmation; one for adults and one for youngsters (10 -13 years old). If there are any 'inbetweeners' there is usually a separate group for them. The aim is to have at least ten sessions before the confirmation. In addition, there are follow up meetings to this that run on until the summer holidays. The minimum age is 10; there is no maximum. It is often the case that some candidates are also baptised at the same time as Confirmation or sometimes on a separate occasion. The sessions assume that candidates are approaching the Christian Faith with an open and enquiring mind, and the assumption is that we will 'start from scratch'. Anyone who is at all

interested should contact one of the clergy. If you are confirmed and would like a 'refresher' you are welcome to join in. Taking part in the course does not commit anyone to confirmation – so if you are at a stage in life where you would like to find out more about being a Christian, this might be helpful. Do pick up the phone or email if this is something you would like to know more about.

WALSINGHAM This year's annual pilgrimage on the 6th October had the usual age range – six months to ninety five years! There were thirty six pilgrims who were blessed with the most wonderful weather. Some of the party were dropped off at the Slipper Chapel and walked the last mile into the village, whilst others followed the Stations of the Cross in the grounds – praying especially for our family and friends. All joined in the Pilgrims Service at noon and the prayers for healing in the afternoon. There was plenty a free time to enjoy the Shrine, Village and the Abbey Grounds, and we all gathered for the 'Last Visit' before returning home around 6.30pm.

WALSINGHAM the Vicar has booked some rooms, with full board, from the afternoon of Friday 23rd until Sunday 25th November after lunch. This will enable a full participation in the Shrine Programme, and also Parish Communion in the Parish Church on Sunday. The cost is £80; for more details or to book, pick up an application form in Church or contact the Vicarage.

ST ANDREW'S DAY is 30th November and the Patronal Festival of the ancient parish of Witham on the Hill which includes Manthorpe, Toft and Lound. This year it falls on a Friday. There is to be a Patronal Festival Service at 6.45pm which will allow plenty of time to get to the Toft House Hotel for a two course supper at 8.00pm (fishy in nature as St Andrew is patron saint of fisherman) which will cost £11. To book a meal, please pick up a form from church. It is possible to go to either/or service and supper.

SERVICE OF LIGHT This will take place at St Andrew's Witham on the 2nd December at 6.00pm. This will

be the traditional service for Advent Sunday – the first day of the four week season in preparation for Christmas. It anticipates the coming into the world of Christ the Light. The service begins in darkness, and as the carols and readings unfold the fulfilment of God's promises throughout history, the church becomes filled with light as the flame of one candle becomes the source of light for hundreds. This service will be ticket only. This is for two reasons: first, the layout of the building and the preparation of the candles will depend on the numbers attending. Secondly, seasonal refreshments will be served afterwards and tickets will determine how much baking is done! Tickets from the Vicarage, or after any service. Tickets are £2 for adults and free for children – who will still need a ticket!





JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPE

Blackberrying is a wonderful pastime in the autumn; this pudding makes a change from blackberry crumble.

Blackberries for this recipe can be used straight from the freezer

BLACKBERRY PUDDING (SERVES 4)

500g blackberries

1 tablespoon caster sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

150g butter

150g caster sugar

150g plain flour

150ml milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 eggs

Heat blackberries gently in a pan with 1 tablespoon of sugar until just soft. Add vanilla. Place in a buttered baking dish.

Cream butter & 150g caster sugar until soft & pale. Add flour, milk, vanilla & 3 egg yolks. Mix well. Whisk 3 egg whites until stiff. Fold gently into mixture, & spoon over blackberries. Bake at 160c for approx 1 hour until brown and slightly puffed.

Serve with cream, crème fraiche or vanilla ice cream.
