

THE VICAR'S WRITES

This month I begin a three month sabbatical (or to be more accurate) extended study leave. This is the third time during my ministry of thirty three years that I have had the opportunity for time off the treadmill of Parish ministry and had the opportunity for fresh challenges. In 1990 I was able to undergo the Spiritual Exercise of St Ignatius Loyola and in 2000 I was on pilgrimage to Santiago de Compestella (1563 miles on my bike)! This year I am again having a long guided retreat, attempting a total immersion language course and hoping to write up some accumulated academic work from the past ten years. In my absence the Assistant Curate Fr David Pickett will be the first port of call for pastoral and spiritual care and he will be ably assisted by an army of others.

It is times like this when I am acutely aware of the contribution of so many voluntary helpers in the life of our three Parishes. Most of the administration and the day to day management of three medieval buildings and their daily and weekly use are down to

volunteers. The lay officers of the Parishes carry tremendous responsibility on behalf of the whole community – no praise is high enough for them. Consider how many volunteers it takes to produce and distribute this Parish news! In every aspect of the life and ministry of the Church the Vicar has a supporting role; all the important work that holds everything together is by lay people.

Which begs the question – what on the earth is the use of a priest? A priest is not much good to anyone unless he is a man of God. By that I mean that his life is entirely centred round the fact of the Gospel. His vocation is to be a person whose heart is fixed on Jesus. As any priest knows, he constantly fails to meet this hope and desire. It is all too easy for the concerns of family life and the rough and tumble of life in the community to knock him off centre. No priest ever judges that they have 'got it right' - this one certainly doesn't.

That is why it is so valuable to step back, take stock and then begin again. It is good to put





Clerk's Notes of the Toft cum Lound and Manthorpe Parish Council Meeting – 27th February 2013

Parish Donations. Donations have been given to individuals who have carried out tasks on behalf of the Parish Council.

Replacement Street Light
Policy. SKDC advised that they
wished to use low energy bulbs.
Although these appeared brighter
than existing bulbs, the Parish
Council would wait until the next
bulb was replaced before deciding
on whether to take any further
action.

NHW review. There is a need for a local Co-ordinator for the NHW scheme in the Parish. An email has been circulated asking for volunteers; a flyer will also be compiled and circulated to all Parish residents. Temporarily, Mr Anderson will take the lead in obtaining and distributing relevant literature to the Parish community.

Farm Vehicles Turning sign.

The County Councillor reported that he had not approached the County Council as he was told that discussions were in place

between Mr Blanchard and Highways. However, Mr Blanchard stated that this was not happening. A letter from the Parish Council to Mr Brumfield. In addition, the County Councillor would follow up on the issue.

Planning Applications.

Parish Property.

Playing Field. Attempts to speak to a contractor reference painting the playing field hut door had failed. As the bus shelter at the Manthorpe crossroads, the WI bench, the bench on the road by the bridge in Manthorpe, the playing field hut roof and 2 of the Parish noticeboards also require maintenance, the Clerk would seek out a different contractor to carry out these tasks. The Clerk explained that all bar one of the individuals who volunteer to cut the grass on the mound had agreed to stay within the scheme. Toft. Hotel Entrance and Rockery on Lound Road. Two of the 3 landowners have had formal legal letters issued as they have not cleared the Highways land as requested. The footway moss on Fairways has been cleared by local resident, Mr Neil Adams. The Parish Council will write a note of thanks to Mr Adams.

Lound. Pothole repairs to Lower Street will be carried out in the next financial year.

General Items.

Indemnity Agreement. An Agreement to Indemnify has been

received from Mr Richard Hartley in respect of electricity supplied by him to the playing field hut. This will be signed following successful negotiation on a minor amendment.

Community Lights in Parish.

The Parish Council wishes to place on record its thanks to all residents who had contributed to the festive occasion by setting up external lights in their gardens.

SKDC Electoral Review. Details for residents to comment have been posted on the Parish website.

Village Signs. The Parish Council will investigate costs to install more welcoming village signs in the Parish.

County Councillor Report.

Care Quality Commission report relating to Stamford and Rutland Hospital dates back to August 2012. Peterborough and Stamford Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust has stated that since that time several vacant nursing posts have been filled and nursing rosters have been reviewed to ensure staffing levels are adequate.



L.C.C. Wind Turbine
Consultation. A poll in the county showed that 89% agreed with L.C.C.'s stance & 63% thought wind turbines had no place in Lincs.

Highways. Salt usage this year has been 25,000 ton with 10,000 ton still in store. A further 9,000 ton is being delivered. An extra £6.4 million from Government over 2 years has been granted for pothole repair. However, the estimated cost to repair all Lincolnshire potholes is £100 million with £400 million needed to

bring all Lincolnshire roads up to standard.

Education. Bourne Grammar School is increasing their intake to about 200 this year. Previous entries are 2010 – 100, 2011 – 150, and 2012 – 180.

The next meeting will cover the Parish Annual Meeting and the Parish Council AGM; 8th May 2013 commencing 7pm.



It's been a while since we passed on our news to the Three Towers but not because life has been quiet – quite the opposite.

Our Advent celebrations were extremely enjoyable and culminated in a week of Christmas Nativity and Tudor productions, a Christmas Party for the whole school and a family Carol service.

The New Year brought great fun in the snow. I think we are becoming accustomed to the annual downfall with pupils readily prepared with snow coats, hats, scarves and boots. The corridor is transformed into a chaotic scene of melting snow and mucky wellies but that's how great childhood memories are made!

Our efforts to develop Learning
Outside the Classroom for our
pupils are going really well. We
have mentioned trips to Burghley,
Grimsthorpe, the Theatre and the
cinema in the Autumn. This term,
the pace picks up again with visits
to Duxford and Coningsby for our
World War 2 project, The Big
Bang Science Fair in London.
Visitors will include Jules Howard,

a Zoologist specialising in
Dinosaur Discoveries (sure to be
a smash hit), Jumicar (a road
safety project within which
children can drive minicars) and
representatives from the Osprey
Conservation project who will
teach us about the fascinating
migratory journey of the Ospreys

David Hawes is nearing the end of his Forest School training and has been working with small groups of pupils from across the age ranges – den building, making tools, cooking on campfires, exploring the world around us and generally getting extremely wet and muddy.

Notes from the Edenham Parish for the end of March. Many thanks **Council Meeting 12th March** 2013

Open Forum A roadside grit bin was requested for School Lane and the issue of dangerous parking on the A151 near to Edenham School was raised. Parents are reminded that the Village Hall car park is available for use at School opening/close times. The community police team are requested to monitor the parking and use the necessary enforcement actions against people contravening road traffic regulations.

All parishioners are reminded that the Open Forum is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. Parishioners can contact the council and register for e-mail reminders of forthcoming meetings by e-mailing the parish clerk at clayton epc@o2.co.uk.

Emergency Defibrillator East Midlands Ambulance Service has agreed to provide, install and maintain an emergency defibrillator within the parish - to be located outside Edenham Village Hall. Installation is planned to Cllr Biggs for his work in acquiring such a valuable resource for the community.

Jubilee Celebration Funds It was agreed that should there be no financial support required for the defibrillator then the remaining funds should be used to purchase a memorial bench for the Edenham Playing Field.

Highway Matters The on-going issue of potholes on parish highways was discussed with the need, not only to improve the standard of such repairs, but to address root causes of damage. It was considered that in a high percentage of cases standing water due to roadside drainage grips and dykes etc being blocked was a significant factor. Cllr M Hill (LCC) advised the meeting that revised repair schemes are currently under trial. Concern over the drainage issues to be passed to the Highways Dept.

CARROT AND RAISIN CUPCAKES (MAKES 12)

225g carrots

130g raisins

2 large eggs

130g caster sugar

120 ml corn oil

* 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

Grated zest of 1 orange

120 g plain flour

1 teaspoon bicarb

Pinch salt

**

1 teaspoon cinnamon

Preheat oven to 160 and line muffin tins with cake cases. Finely grate carrots and combine with raisins. In a large bowl beat eggs and sugar for several minutes and then add oil, vanilla and orange zest and beat well. Sift flour, bicarb, salt and cinnamon then gradually add these to the egg and sugar mixture, beating well. * Pour mixture into the bowl containing the carrots and raisins and blend well. Spoon mixture into the cupcake cases to about 2/3 full. Bake for about 25 mins - the cupcakes will be quite dark brown in colour and feel spongy to the touch. Remove from oven and leave in tins for about 10 minutes before putting them on wire rack.

Clerk's Notes 7th March 2013 It was agreed to pay the LALC annual subscription.

A poster outlining proposals for a review of Local Government Representation has been displayed and further details of the review will follow.

Following a burglary in the village, residents are asked to be extra vigilant.

Butter Cross Cllr Somerville will continue to liaise with a preferred bidder who will submit final costings following clarification of details and conditions to be approved by L.C.C. (Highways).

Pollution from Braziers The disposal of local waste by burning in braziers was considered to be a potential health hazard. The Clerk will liaise with Environmental Health at SKDC to confirm current regulations and a letter will be drafted to explore alternatives.

Roads and Pavements With the exception of a repair to dangerous kerbing in Croake Hill, none of the repairs agreed with the LCC Civil Engineer on his tour of the village

had been attended to. Of special concern are the blocked drains and gulleys which continue to cause flooding down Creeton Road hill, High Street and Bourne Road. A request by the Clerk for a visit by the road sweeper has also been ignored. The extension to the soak-away in Bourne Road, agreed as part of the engineer's visit, is particularly urgent as sandbags had to be employed on Bourne Road. The road surface on Forstedd Hill and pot holes on Creeton Road and Park Road also continue to worsen. The Clerk will write a further letter to the Engineer to ensure this work is progressed with urgency.

The Clerk will also write to the Grimsthorpe and Drummond Trust to request that the trees, hedgerows and verges at the top of the High Street near the football field be tidied up.

The Diamond Jubilee Community Wildlife Orchard

Cllr Webb reported that the application form and invoices to support the Council's claim for the Wildlife Grant had been successful and payment will be made following submission of an Invoice.

The Clerk is to write to SKDC for further posters and fine warning notices.

Noise Nuisance For the third year running, the council has received complaints regarding loud music being played in the Croake Hill area. This has been reported once again to SKDC for action.
