### THE VICAR'S WRITES

The King is dead! Long live the King!

With Fr Andy away on a well deserved sabbatical, responsibility for pastoral, administrative and liturgical care has been passed to me, the curate. It is not something that I sought but it is something I relish as I enter into the last year of my curacy. Knowing that Fr Andy has the confidence and belief that I can run the benefice in his short absence fills me not only with confidence but also with the belief that very soon I will be ready to run a benefice of my own. Being asked to take responsibility of such serious magnitude can often be daunting, but for some it can be the fulfilment of a life expectation, a chance to rise to the occasion.

For Jesus' disciples this level of responsibility must have come as quite a shock. For 2-3 years they followed their Lord and Master around the Holy Land listening and learning from his teachings. They too practiced a ministry, born out of the Lesser Commission (Matthew Ch 10) of Christ to: 'Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers and cast out demons.' But when Jesus was taken from them, quickly and violently, they would have felt quite alone, frightened that he was no longer around, no longer there as the safety blanket.

So it was with great courage that after Christ's ascension, and after Pentecost, they went out into the world to preach his gospel of Salvation. With great courage they endured ridicule and persecution in the name of the one sent by God. They handed that great commission of Christ to their fellow brothers and sisters who, in turn, passed it onto us today.

So, how do we feel about that kind of responsibility? Do we have to do all those things that Christ commissioned – heal, raise the dead, cast out demons and cleanse? No! Christ understands that not everyone is able to do these things (especially raising the dead!), but he does want us to do his work in whatever form we feel that we can manage, be that reading in church, praying the intercessions, visiting our sick and needy neighbour, encouraging our fellow Christians, or anything big or small that will help glorify his kingdom.

We don't have to be the next Billy Graham, Archbishop of Canterbury, or even Fr Andy Hawes. We need to be who we are, who we were made to be, but

His trade mark was a broad brimmed black sombrero adopted during his visit to Spain. A splendid statue of Alfred, Lord Tennyson is erected close to Lincoln Cathedral.

holes in the mound are reduced. A new shed to store the 2 new Parish marquees has been erected. The marquees are available to rent by the public and to date income received/booked has totalled £300. Roof ventilation in Jasmine Cottage has been improved to combat dampness following the previous installation of increased loft insulation.

Finances. Total receipts in the financial year were £8294 (£6628 in 201-12) and expenditure was £10864 (£4645in 2011-12.) Expenditure in 2012-13 compared to 2011-12 included rabbit prevention measures on the Playing Field for £3199, the purchase of 2 marguees for £1031, the purchase of Jubilee Mugs at £332. Jubilee expenses of  $\pounds 683$  and a new shed for the playing field to store the marguees at £510; a total of £5755.] The second Halifax account has been closed and the sum moved to the Melton Mowbray Building Society. Some £20706 is now invested in this account, Free Resource Donations have been made in the year and a total of £1200 (£1550 in 2011-12) has been donated to various institutions. The financial state of the Parish Council remains healthy with £22771 (£25341 in 2011-12) available. The Lighter Touch Audit Review has been completed for the year ending 31 March 2012. There were no comments made by the

auditors.

**General.** Jubilee celebrations were held in June and an active programme of events took place on the Playing Field. The Fireworks Display was again successful and safety standards applied resulted in an incident free evening. The format of the evening remained unchanged with food being served before the display.

The Parish Web site continues to be a regular forum for Parish News under the excellent stewardship of Mr McWilliams.

### **Matters Arising**:

NHW review. Helen Croft has agreed to stand as the new local coordinator. She will coordinate issues of local leaflets especially for those without email. She will attend an area NHW meeting soon. Lynn Powell has been attending some meetings and has some literature for the notice boards. Mr Anderson will be the contact link in Manthorpe.

Bowthorpe Park Farm.Vehicles Turning sign. Mr Cork has written to highways to ask for a continuous white line to be installed on this section of the A6121. Highways reply stated an independent study was required. Mr Blanchard stated he will erect his own signs at busy times of the year.

Indemnity Agreement with Richard Hartley. An agreement has been signed and issued. The electricity supply to the hut is now RCD protected.

### Planning Applications:

Mr Mossman – amendments to permission. Approved by SKDC.

Mr Smith – Two storey side extension. Approved by SKDC.

Solar Farm at Manthorpe Farm.

Although no planning application has yet been submitted, the proposed Solar Farm was discussed. The key points are that SKDC has agreed with the Pegasus Group that an **Environmental Impact** Assessment will not be required. However, it was stressed by SKDC that this is not an indication that planning permission will be approved. Justin Johnson, case officer, believes the site is within the Toft cum Lound & Manthorpe parish boundary. The District Councillor, Councillor Channel, believes 2 parts of the SKDC Core Strategy are relevant: visual impact of a scheme and renewable energy generation. If a planning application is made, Councillor Channel intends to ask that it is considered by the full Planning Committee. Additionally, she is prepared to speak at any future Planning Committee meeting. A public meeting including the Thurlby and Wilsthorpe parishes may be best way ahead if planning application

is made. SKDC planning officers have stated that they would not wish to give opinion at such a meeting.

### Parish Property:

**Playing Field.** Hut door still to be repainted. Contract has been made with Mathew Pryke for £958.96 to also maintain bus shelter, 2 benches and 2 notice boards.

**Grass cutting the mound**. A new roster has been issued. The Clerk will confirm the Richard Harris contract for cutting the grass.

**Jasmine Cottage**. The window problem has been fixed.

### Highways:

Manthorpe Bridge. Highways have asked BT to rectify the sunken BT manhole cover in the footpath near Manthorpe bridge. The job has been given reference number 1537342.

## Toft Hotel Entrance and Rockery on Lound Road.

According to Highways, as a result of a couple of stiff letters from their legal section, the highway verge has now been cleared. Highways will now approach Mr Lees with a view to purchasing the strip of land necessary for the Walkway.
