

As I write this the sun is shining, its warm and we are in – dare I say - a mini heat-wave! As I look out of my window I can see the rapeseed in the fields wafting gently in the breeze to the sound of evening birdsong. I can see a clear blue sky that holds the same colour as a warm Mediterranean sea. No doubt though that by the time you get to read this the weather will be back to its British norm and it will be wet, windy and cool! Like many things in life, our weather is fickle. That is why many nations know the UK as having 4 seasons in one day when it comes to weather patterns. But being fickle, I think, is part of what it means to be British. Speaking for myself I love tomatoes (my favourite food), but dislike tomato-juice as a drink. I love, love, love chocolate (don't we all!), but dislike chocolate cake and hot-chocolate as a drink. You too, may be fickle when it comes to food and drink or perhaps other things in your daily life. This same fickle behaviour of ours can also be found in our approach to Church and Church services. As baptised Christians we all accept and confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, the Son of God made man who came to earth.

We also accept that His Church, both spiritually and historically, is part of what it means to be a practising Christian, coming together to worship God as one body. By doing this, it allows us to live and practice our faith in an environment that is comfortable and enjoyable - I think it fair to say that no one wants to feel uncomfortable in Church or see it as a form of dutiful drudgery? 

### **Fire Station News**

The Chief Fire Officer Group inspection occurs annually at all fire stations across the county and in May it was our turn. The first part of the inspection is done in the afternoon by a senior officer who goes through every record from the time it takes the appliance to turn out, to how well maintained the premises and fire appliance are. For the second part, the Chief Officer Group arrive in the evening to watch an observed and assessed simulated incident of their choice.

When the audit report came back a few weeks later it stated that Corby Glen fire station was performing excellently reflecting the hard work done by all to achieve such a high standard. The audit highlighted how much pressure the staff are under to turn out the appliance in the timescales demanded by the Service. Never was that more important than on the morning of the audit when we turned out to a house fire in a local village where the speed the professionalism of

the fire crew undoubtedly saved a life that day.

A crew of four arrived to find smoke issuing from an upstairs window and bystanders informed us that someone was still in the property. All windows and doors were locked but on smashing the lounge window I was able to gain entry to the property and unlock the front door to allow the Walsingham and Turner firefighter crew to enter the building. They quickly extinguished a fire on the stairs and discovered an unconscious person in a bedroom.

Carrying an unconscious person down a narrow stairs, while wearing breathing apparatus, is a very arduous operation and I made my way to the top of the stairs to help out. By this time Crew Manager Harwood had set up the oxylator outside in the garden, and oxygen therapy was soon administered to the casualty. Grantham and Billingborough fire crews along with the ambulance service were next on the scene and the casualty was quickly

whisked off to hospital and is now making a good recovery.

The next day the rapid response and quick thinking of the crew prevented a raging fire in outbuildings spreading to the nearby house. No fire hydrant was eventful beginning for him. Finally, readily available in this remote location and so with limited water available, we decided to play one hose reel on the fire and the other on the house. I sent a priority message to control to "make pumps four" for water supplies and we were relieved to get pumps in and start water ferrying from the nearest hydrant. With Grantham, Bourne and Melton Mowbray fire appliances now in attendance, we had enough resources to deal with the incident and we limited the fire damage to the outbuilding. These two incidents coming so close together certainly highlighted the very high standards of service of the firefighters, and I am very proud of the crew here at Corby Glen and the results they achieve. Whether alerted from at home or from their primary employment, it always amazes me how fast we

turn the appliance out and just how important that is in an emergency situation.

We are pleased to welcome new firefighter Julian Turner at the station; it has certainly been an thank you to everyone who has helped fill the charity clothes bin at the station, so far your efforts have raised £330 for The Firefighter's Charity.



# Notes from Witham on the Hill PC Meeting 13th May 2013

A large number of residents attended the Annual Parish Meeting held at the Parish Hall, Witham on the Hill. Chairman of the Parish Council Will Stanton. Parish Clerk Rosemary Woolley, Susan Pennant-Jones, D.Cllr Ibis Channell and C.Cllr. Martin Trollope-Bellew all gave their annual reports. Residents had many concerns which included the planning application at Warren Farm for change of use to a motorcycle dirt track, street lights, highways issues, replacement of hedgerows, re-seeding of verges and the neglected state of the Village Stocks and By-wells.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council Cllr Martyn Hyde was elected Chairman with Susan Pennant-Jones as Vice-Chairman. The End of Year Accounts, wages, Insurance and Risk Assessment Audit were all approved.

At the Parish Council Meeting the councillors agreed that they would object to the planning application

at Warren Farm but had no representation for the application at St Halina. The clerk reported that she had received a mixed response from other Parish Councils about organizing a joint meeting with Alan Hardwick, Police and Crime Commissioner of Lincolnshire. Dog fouling was continuing to be a large problem, especially between Cleeve Acre and Hillcrest House. Bottom Street. Dog walkers are asked to bag up the litter and take it home so as not to spoil the enjoyment for others. The village stocks and Bywells area was reported to be in a neglected state. Various highways issues were reported around the parish.

Finally C.Cllr Martin Trollope-Bellew thanked everyone who voted for him at the May elections and will continue to represent the parish to the best of his ability.

### **Annual Parish Meeting**

A member of the Parish highlighted that a high number of motorcycles using the A151 road throughout the Parish. Weekends and Tuesday evenings in particular are causing concerns over both the levels of noise and road safety. The local policing team will be requested to monitor the situation and to visit the road at varying times to act as a visual deterrent. Secretary reported that during the year the parish had celebrated the Queen's Diamond Jubilee by holding a family fun day, including a parish photograph, games, decorated wheelbarrow competition, ceilidh and hog roast. A commemorative wooden bench for the village Playing Field is to be purchased with funds raised. Long serving Parish Councillor, Mrs Jean Joyce, resigned from the Parish Council after completing 18 years service, the last 9 as Chairman. Many thanks to Jean for all her support and hard work throughout her term as councillor.

**Election of Officers**: Cllr Martin was elected as Chairman and Cllr Cranfield as Vice Chair for the forthcoming year.



# Swinstead Parish Council Notes 23rd May 2013

Neighbourhood Watch. Police reported that children were seen climbing on to the roof of the bus shelter and jumping across the gap on to the roof of the telephone box. This dangerous practice will be monitored locally and by the Police.

**Buttercross.** The contractor is to meet with the engineer from English Heritage for final approval of the renovation.

Jubilee Orchard. A padlock has been installed and keys distributed. Cllr Lunn has also performed the first mowing of the paddock. All trees purchased by the Council and potted up last autumn have survived the winter and are in blossom. It is too late to cut the hedge for this year. Arrangements are in hand to settle costs for the erection of the gates.

Croake Hill. Noise nuisance at No 18. A meeting has been arranged to discuss the noise nuisance with the Environmental team which would also incorporate a review of the Tenancy Agreement.

Dog Fouling. The company appointed to administer the scheme for SKDC had gone into liquidation and that the planned leaflet drop for the village had therefore not been undertaken. A poster initiative was planned. The idea of a local volunteer Dog Warden was also discussed.

Potholes. The continuing deterioration of local roads posed an increasing danger to road users. Lincolnshire has 5000 miles of roads to maintain with a budget of £50m and LCC spends almost £1m per week on road maintenance. D/Cllr Robins said that LCC are trialling a new machine which could potentially increase productivity on filling potholes with a permanent flexible tarmac filler. The Parish Council will keep the situation under review and continue to press the engineers for rectification.

Post Office Mobile Van. It was noted that where recent Post Office closures had occurred villages were provided with a mobile Post Office van service. However, as it was twelve years since the Post Office closed at Swinstead, the village was not entitled to this service, there also being a nearby Post office at Corby Glen (soon to be moved to the old Market Cross Surgery premises).

**Machams Close.** D/Cllr Robins said he would liaise with SKDC officers following the recent meeting with concerned residents.

AON Insurance Renewal. As the Council could receive a further 5% discount from its annual bill from AON if it agreed to commit to a three year contract with the company, it was agreed to take up the offer.

Hedgerow. Corby Glen Road. The Head Forester was contacted following the attentions of the Grimsthorpe Trust to the hedgerow on the village approach. No action has yet been taken and a letter will now be sent to the estate Manager.

**St Mary's Church.** Donation. A letter had been received requesting the Council make a

contribution to St Mary's Church to assist with churchyard maintenance. It was agreed that a sum of £250.00 be donated.

Football Field. It was agreed that the Council would continue to fund the cost of maintaining the football field for another year (water charges £57.00 p.a. and cost of mowing – approx £250.00). The council received a suggestion that mowing costs could be reduced by allowing sheep to graze in the field periodically but this was not considered appropriate for the time being. The clerk will arrange for the field to be cut during May.

High Street Sign. The siting of the new High Street sign further down the street toward the middle of the village had caused some confusion to visitors and emergency services. The clerk will investigate the erection of a sign on the left hand side of Corby Glen road at the entrance to the village.

The Clerk advises that due to unavoidable circumstances, it was not possible to hold the Annual Parish Meeting on 9th May.

**Election of Officers.** B. Lynch continues as Chairman and G. Brown continue as Vice-Chairman.

# Chairman's Annual Report to the Council.

There remained a need to support residents and liaise with the Police and SKDC with regard to continuing noise nuisance problems at Croake Hill.

The Chairman thanked M. Somerville for progressing the Buttercross Project and for his continuing liaison with English Heritage and the successful contractor.

Progress with the Diamond Jubilee Orchard project had continued with receipt of the Grant from LCC, the purchase of trees and gates and the planning of the proposed Community Planting day scheduled for 31<sup>st</sup> August.

The Council needed to continue to be vigilant in its monitoring of LCC's progress with regard to flooding in the village, particularly the collapsed drains on Creeton Road and the soak-away on Bourne Road, and also with pothole maintenance.

The Chairman also continues in his role as Trustee for the Poor's Land and noted that increasing land values had led to a current valuation of £65 per acre. Beneficiaries of the Trust had accordingly enjoyed a corresponding increase in their annual income.

Financial Report for the year ending March 31<sup>st</sup> 2013. Income for the year was £3,193.00 including the annual precept, VAT refund, interest on bank accounts and tree sales. Expenditure amounted to £2,624.00 and the Council had £4,321.00 in hand at the year's end. The accounts were approved by the Council and have been passed to the internal verifier, Sir Edward Barry.
