

FibreLincs

FibreLincs is a community led rural broadband project for South Lincolnshire. The project aims to bring FTTP/H (Fibre To The Premises/Home) based Internet connectivity to communities not covered by high-speed services from existing commercial providers or BDUK initiatives (e.g. Digital Rutland and OnLincolnshire). FibreLincs strongly believes that a community led initiative has the best chance of succeeding to deliver high-speed Internet access to rural communities. FTTP/H roll-outs are very rarely commercially viable for the likes of BT, due to the high cost of labour.

FibreLincs believes that its approach will succeed because it intends to use a community workforce to lay a fibre network on land owned by the community (you and me!). The FibreLincs network will therefore be owned, led and maintained by those communities in the form of a social enterprise (CIC – Community Interest Company). To further improve its chances of succeeding FibreLincs will be following the very successful model adopted by B4RN (Broadband 4 the Rural North), recently featured on BBC Radio and Newsnight.

A meeting of the group was held in Carlby on 20th March where members of the surrounding villages were invited to take part, ask questions and present their views.

THE VICAR'S WRITES

Apart from the hours in the upper room, the events of Holy Week and Easter are all outdoors. Gethsemane, Golgotha, the Mount of Olives only have the sky as a roof. This is true of a great part of Jesus' ministry. It is especially true of his recorded life of prayer: the wilderness, the mountain top, the garden – these were his sacred spaces. There must be something in this outdoor praying to take note of. Speaking personally - I would go guite barmy if I couldn't spend a good part of the day outside. We live surrounded by fields with woods and a lake twenty minutes' walk away. We also have a dog who is my companion on my daily walks which I look forward to as a time of prayer and reflection. The rhythm of the walking aids the quietening of the mind and deepening of consciousness – but there is more to outdoor praying than that.

'Outdoor Learning' is now an important provision in our schools, it compensates children for the rather antiseptic play

environments they are restricted to, by safe-guarding concerns and the tendency of children to think that if it hasn't got a flickering screen it's a waste of time. We have a son who makes his living by running 'Forest Schools.' 'The benefits of the engagement with environment', he tells me, 'are far reaching.' 'It enables respect and knowledge of natural forces, it awakens imagination and stimulates emotions, it enables a growing awareness of self and one's place within the natural order - but most of all. it's fun.' Some of these 'learning outcomes' ought to be part of our spiritual life but often they aren't. Very quickly our own prayer life

can become ritualised and routine. It also becomes cerebral and does not engage our whole self – it makes very little impact on the senses. The old saying 'you're nearer to God in the garden than anywhere else on earth' – has a great amount of truth in it. But being nearer to God and engaging with God are two different things altogether.

At the retreat house at Edenham we have provided days of reflection which take Gospel events and then pray with them in an outdoor context. We have had walks to Emmaus, breakfasts on a lake side, and outdoor Stations of the Cross concluding at the top of a hill. In these experiences light breaks into our understanding of the Gospel and new insights and direction emerges. We now have an 'outdoor Church' in the garden with a stone table at the east end and a fountain at the west. It is easier to pray for the world when one hears and sees it at work and at play. Holy places are exactly that - places. Our outdoor meditations, pilgrimages and liturgies help us to experience that all places are Holy. We are able to say with Jacob setting up his stone by the river, after his dream of the angelic ladder 'the Lord in this place, and I never knew it: this is the gate of heaven.'

On Palm Sunday we take the church outside on procession and on Easter Day the Dawn Vigil begins in the dark around a fire – to hear those wonderful words –

'may the light of Christ rising from darkness scatter the darkness of our hearts and lives.'

Our Lord, who is the Word through whom all things are made, speaks to us about the spirit being like the wind – it helps sometimes to pray with the wind on your face and its sound in your ears.

View From the Pew

I have just returned from a very interesting day in Lincoln. It was about exploring possible ways in which we can grow as a church, lead by a remarkable young priest from London called Philip North. What can we, as a church-going community, do to invite our neighbours in? How do we demonstrate our desire to share the very precious gift of Faith, the simple and beautiful message of the Gospel? Charles Spurgeon says "I will not believe that you have tasted of the honey of the gospel if you can eat it all yourself". This, I find very challenging and a bit scary. Maybe, we all should be prepared to be challenged, if we are practicing Christians, how do we reach our friends who are not. and if we are not, how do we view those who are? There is, of course, no difference between us at all, in so far as we live our lives near to each other, welcome the same signs of spring, watch with wonder the same beautiful sunsets and worry about our families and friends, we are all

moved to tears and laughter in some measure. So why are we not sharing, in some measure, our need for companionship, fellowship and spiritual understanding? Why do some of us walk in and out of those church doors at varying intervals, and why do some of us never feel moved to go anywhere near? Is there an invisible line that causes a division between us? Are not our church buildings big enough to hold us all? Can we not bring our questions, needs, fears and joys under that same roof? Do not be surprised if someone accosts you before too long and asks you some such questions. There are no wrong answers but many, many more questions yet, can we, I wonder, explore them

Swinstead Parish Council Meeting Notes - 6th March 2014 in Swinstead Village Hall

Financial Report: The Report was circulated, approved and signed with the exception of a query on a charge which is presently being resolved.

Machams Close: A site visit took place recently whereupon a survey was undertaken and measurements recorded to ensure compliance with the Planning Regulations. A security fence was put in place. A further meeting is now scheduled and several members of the public are expected to attend. It is hoped the meting will further progress this matter.

Buttercross: Stone for the project has now been successfully sourced at a cost of £200. Fresh measurements are being taken and the work will go ahead as soon as the present frosts have

finished enabling the work to begin.

Highways: Various works by the Anglian Water Authority have taken place over the last weeks and work is now in progress by LCC on Bourne Road. A letter is to be written to K. Brumfield at LCC as the Council understands that no further work is to take place on Creeton Road which is the site of the worst of the flooding and is responsible for the general village flooding. The Council will also be drawing attention to the drain outside No 7 New Estate in the village.

Jubilee Orchard Project: It was agreed that 10 more fruit trees together with tree guards will be purchased which brings the Orchard towards completion. Cllr. Lunn presented the completed sign for the Orchard to the meeting. This will now be mounted on a piece of oak to be installed at a later date on the Orchard gate.

Croake Hill: It was reported that an incident had taken place recently which involved the Police and an arrest was made.

Dog Fouling: This perennial problem was discussed, with various methods used by other Parish Councils to control the

problem being put forward. It was agreed that signs stating that fines apply, whilst not detailing the amount are one method but vigilance for offenders is basically the only weapon.

Football Field, change of use:

The Council will be writing to the Grimsthorpe Estate with regard to the Change of Use and outlining the necessity of a Planning Permission document being displayed for the relevant time.

Councillors' Reports: Cllr. Lunn wished to record his thanks to D/ Cllr. Robins for his assistance in cleansing the telephone box prior to painting by British Telecom.

Any Other Business: The Clerk advised Councillors of the meeting date of 18th March next relating to Machams Close.

Planning Application:

Application for the changes affecting Condition 18 of the Planning Permission Granted for the conversion of the barn adjacent to Mill Leys, School Lane, Edenham, studied – no comments/objections raised.


