



THE VICAR WRITES

This month sees the start in one of our parishes of a 'Stewardship Campaign'; last year there was a similar and very successful effort in Swinstead. Another is pencilled in for Edenham next year. This means that all our local readers will have in the past or will in the future be asked if they would like to contribute to the life of the Parish Church by a gift of time, talents or money. This is a revival of an approach which, for the past twelve years or so, was seen as not as effective as a straight forward funding programme, to set our financial needs, as any other voluntary organisation would. I am very happy indeed that we have reverted to Stewardship again. This is why:

It used to be the case that a four yearly cycle of 'Stewardship Campaigns' were a regular feature of Anglican parochial life. They seem, in many Dioceses, to have been replaced by the 'funding programme,' with a single focus on raising money. Travelling one generation back in time the 'Stewardship Campaign' was often

titled 'Stewardship Mission' and had a strong preaching, praying and teaching element in it. In many cases individuals made a huge step forward in their spiritual journey in coming to a thoughtful, prayerful response to the invitation to give of their time, talents and money.

Christian Spirituality is nothing other than the practise of Stewardship. Stewardship is responding to the call of Christ in the present moment, offering to his service all our gifts and abilities. It is the desire to make this loving response to God, that is the well-spring of our Christian Ministry. Consider these two profound prayers; first this prayer from the Methodist Covenant Service: 'I am no longer my own but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; let me be full, let me be empty, let me have all things let me have nothing; I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal.' The second is from the final stage of the 'Spiritual Exercises' of St Ignatius: 'Take, Lord and receive



all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all that I have and possess. Thou hast given all to me. To thee, O Lord, I return it. All is thine, dispose of it wholly according to Thy will.'

Both these prayers express the deep desire to make a loving and sacrificial response to God's love for us, which is experienced by each person in the totality of their life. 'All is thine' prays Ignatius,' In response John Wesley declares 'I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure.' It is this deep awareness of God's goodness, and that life is grace or gift that transforms and transfigures the individual will to generous self-giving. This is the only place to begin any prayer and reflection on one's own response to God, in the giving of our time, talents and money.

Since Jacob vowed at Bethel to give one tenth of all he had to the Lord, tithing has been recognised as a faithful response to God's goodness. I have always thought that one tenth is a little mean

considering that 'all things come from you and of your own do we give you.' The sad reality is that a very small proportion of Christians tithe. This is the fact behind the rather feeble spiritual life and halfhearted mission of the Church in many contemporary contexts. To tithe is both to recognise the goodness of God and to trust in his faithfulness. To try and work out what to give in any other way, is an exercise in balancing the books with God, without recognising the truth that it all belongs to God anyway. Two questions: what is your giving like, are you being generous to God? If you aren't, what is stopping you? These questions will take you to the heart of another fundamental question: 'What really matters to vou?'

Fire Station News

Exciting times at Corby Glen fire station, as for the first time we are the proud owners of a brand new fire appliance - and no ordinary appliance at that. Our new MAN appliance is one of only two all-wheel drive pumps in the county, packed with the very latest technology available to fire authorities across the country.

It features Holmatro hydraulic rescue, cutting equipment and rams, considered by many to be the best on the market. Also included is the very latest method of firefighting, the Cobra Coldcut system. Lincolnshire Fire and Rescue is the first Service in the country to adopt the Cobra equipment as part of a new integrated firefighting strategy. And our village appliance is one of the first in our county to be fitted with this system.

The Cobra Coldcut extinguishing equipment infuses water with tiny pieces of metal and shoots it at very high pressure through a lance to cut through plastic, wood, metal and even concrete to gain entry to

a fire. This excellent equipment can be used in nearly any type of incident, including loft, basement, ducting, rural, high-rise, thatch, stack, and vehicle fires, but will prove particularly efficient in compartment fires.

The system has been proven very effective in attacking and controlling fires without the need to insert firefighters directly into the situation, as well as reducing room temperature and reducing the risks of flashovers, backdrafts, steam burns and other hazards. It also uses much less water than other techniques, meaning less damage to property and better-preserved evidence for fire investigation. Overall, the introduction of this new equipment will reduce risk to the firefighter, reduce damage to property, and reduce the resources needed to fight a fire.

State-of-the-art handheld thermal imaging cameras featuring a search capacity will be used to find temperature discrepancies. This allows the seat of the fire to be identified from a safe distance.

Once the seat of the fire is located,

Cobra equipment will be used to gain entry through a door, wall or window frame, often in less than a minute. Lance jets then fire a fine spray of water (without the metal particles) through the hole to bring the fire under control. Within minutes, the temperature of the room is cooled to a tolerable level for breathing apparatus wearers. The system is also used in conjunction with the Positive Pressure Ventilation fan carried on the appliance, which can clear smoke from a building in seconds.

We have already used the Cobra lance to assist the Stamford fire crew to tackle a dustbin wagon, on fire in the Morrisons' depot.

The wagon's contents were well alight and the vehicle's hydraulics were not working. We were able to access the vehicle roof, and used the Cobra to cut a number of holes through which we injected high pressure water jets, to suppress the fire.

The new MAN appliance was officially blessed by our former colleague, Reverend Margaret Barton, in a moving ceremony that

was well attended by village organisations, local employers and former firefighters.

Annual Parish Meeting. The chairman expressed disappointment that only parish councillors were present. He encouraged all to promote parishioner involvement in local government over the forthcoming year. All parishioners are again reminded that the Annual Parish Meeting, along with routine Parish Council meetings, is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. Community Police Team Member PCSO Chris Hughes was in attendance and updated the meeting on local police issues. Concerns were raised by members about the ongoing matter of poor/dangerous parking in the vicinity of Edenham School. Chris agreed to visit the site whenever possible to monitor/ take appropriate actions against those found to be at fault

Chairman's Annual Report to the Council:

The Chairman looked back on a year where much had been accomplished, in particular, the Jubillee Orchard which will be a lasting legacy for the village. The football field has now been re-established as allotments for use by residents in Swinstead and surrounding villages. The Parish Council was also involved with local residents in ensuring the incomplete development at Machins Close was demolished.

Meanwhile, other areas had been progressed. Following a revision relating to the choice of stonework, the Buttercross restoration would hopefully be completed in early summer. A leaflet drop regarding the on-going problem of dog-fouling had been made, and there also remained the need to support residents with regard to problems at Croake Hill. A recent survey had identified a programme of work to be undertaken with regard to flooding, grass verges and potholes throughout the village.

The Chairman thanked members of the Council and the Clerk for their support throughout the past year.

Financial Report for the year ending March 31st 2014:

Income for the year was £3,611 including the annual precept,

Community Wildlife Grant, VAT refund, interest on bank accounts and tree sales. Expenditure amounted to £2,826 and the Council had £5,105 in hand at the year's end.

The accounts were approved by the Council and will now be passed to the internal verifier, Sir Edward Barry, before being submitted for audit.


