



#### THE VICAR WRITES

In June I was a participant in a conference called 'Hidden Needs'. It consisted of a day of talks and workshops exploring Christian ministry to those in our communities whose needs are often hidden from others. This could be deafness or mental illness (in any of its crippling manifestations); it could be grief or addiction. There was, however, an emphasis on the Christian understanding of those who have learning difficulties of any kind.

I led two workshops on the work of Jean Vanier and the L'Arche communities. These communities are Christian households made up of adults, some of whom have learning difficulties and some who do not have these 'hidden needs'. As the day unfolded and I spent time with carers, professionals in many areas of education and medicine, as well as a number of young adults with learning difficulties, I began to realise that I had learning difficulties too.

In many respects my education has dulled important ways of

learning. Jean Vanier terms intellectual learning 'sky knowledge' and other ways of learning 'earth knowledge'. This is the knowledge that we gain through our senses, emotions and intuition. It was quite clear that some people who might be termed 'those with learning difficulties' are far more fluent in the language of love and far more rounded in character than people like myself who spent six years at University.

On the Feast of Pentecost (Whitsunday), the day we remember the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles and their companions, we pray the Collect, or prayer for the day, which remembers that the Lord 'taught the *hearts* of your faithful people by sending the fire of the Holy Spirit'. It is in the heart that God teaches us. I would suggest that we can often have 'learning difficulties of the heart.' Sometimes we are brokenhearted, sometimes we are 'hardhearted'. What God asks of us is that we should be 'open hearted'.

People struggle with the concept of faith or trust in God because





they cannot think their way into it. But this insistence on 'sky knowledge' is a learning difficulty. St Anselm in the eleventh century said 'I believe in order that I may understand'; Lady Julian of Norwich in the fourteenth century wrote 'by thought is never gotten and holden – only be love.'

In another area of my ministry I am a 'theological consultant' to a psychotherapist (who is also a physician) who is researching in the field of neurology, spirituality and trauma. This is providing insights into this whole question of 'how do we come to know anything.' Her research, which draws on the work of others all over the world, is examining what neurology (the science of the brain and nervous system) is revealing about the way humanity perceives and understands the world around them. It has been well known for some time that the conscious (or thinking) part of the brain is only secondary in our decision making. In the language of Jean Vanier – 'earth knowledge' comes first and 'sky knowledge' helps us process it. When the brain is in shock and

trauma it would appear whole other areas of the brain, that are usually dormant, become active and in such a state of new awareness 'The doors of perception open'. This is similar to what happens in 'near death experience,' or for people in situations of extreme stress – as on a battlefield. What is interesting from a Christian point of view is that these 'doors of perception' are also opened by worship and prayer.

All the above throws a huge question mark over the rather lazy assumption predominant in our society that being rational is the only way to interpret reality. For a new learning experience and the opening doors of perception all you have to do is go to church!

# FROM THE LAST TWO CENSUSES

I was recently sent an analysis of the parishes I serve, based on a comparison between the 2001 and the 2011 censuses. One interesting statistic – in 2001 90% of the parishes of Witham on the Hill and Manthorpe, Toft and Lound designated their religion as Christian. In 2011 it was 70%. As someone said – 'you must be doing a marvellous job!'



The Gulley opposite covers Windmill: These have yet to be handed over to the Authority under Sect 47 of Highways Act by the Machams Close contractor and they will be assessed at that point. Although the gulleys sit proud of the road and one is oddly placed, water fills the drain at a lower level from the site. Further down the road to the corner, LCC have replaced smashed gulleys under the road and renewed and reinstated inspection covers and gulley covers.

#### Steam Action

Steam action was first founded in 1972, by a group of teenagers who were fed up with the lack of local entertainment. They started organising dances, with the money raised going towards to senior citizens of the parish. 
