## THE VICAR'S WRITES

I am often asked, "What do you think about Islam?" My perspective on Islam is founded chiefly on my studies of Medieval History. At University I read some of the Koran seeking to understand the remarkable rise of Islam and its conquest of North Africa. In the space of a few decades, in the seventh century, it supplanted a vibrant Christian culture and established a power base to which the Eastern Mediterranean succumbed. At another stage I studied the Crusades and the rise of the Ottoman Empire. Some years later I found myself in exchange visits with the Greek Orthodox Church and gained insight from friends there about life under the Turkish occupation – which in some parts of Greece did not end until 1921.

What did I learn? I learnt that Mohammed cannot be compared to Jesus or Buddha, both of whom history teaches were pacifists and peacemakers. Mohammed was a warrior and a war lord. He was a

charismatic figure with a ruthless streak. He ordered the deaths of those who questioned his authority and he himself took part in the beheading of many of his enemies. Although a 'peace code' can be drawn together from the Koran, it sets out a world view of conflict between Islam – the community of peace and fellowship with Allah - and the Infidel – that is to say anyone outside Islam. War is a tool and means of conversion and the Koran emphasises that Allah blesses those who fight for him. 'When you throw the spear, Allah throws it with you' is one verse I remember. Powered by this creed the highly skilled Arab Cavalry led by Mohammed tore through North Africa declaring victory for Allah.

Herein lays the problem for moderate Muslims. It is very difficult to condemn outright the use of violence for religious reasons. In France there are six million Muslims. In recent surveys one in ten declared support for militant Islam – that is six hundred thousand supporters of those most of us would see as terrorists.

## Fire Station News

After a quiet time the incidents in the last couple of months have been many and varied. We were called out to an animal rescue emergency in Sutton St James – the journey in itself was eventful, the fen roads testing out the appliance suspension to its maximum. On arrival we were faced with an aging thoroughbred horse laying on its side in a stable and unable to get up because of the limited space combined with a rheumatoid leg. With the roof timbers not substantial enough to do any winching, we were faced with getting long straps under and around the animal, attaching them to lines and physically trying to pull the horse to its hooves. The horse had been down a long time and although very tired and distressed, it soon reminded us of its power as it flailed around its stable sending all of us scurrying for cover. One kick from those powerful legs could do unimaginable damage.

With this not working we decided the only chance we had of getting her standing again would be to

drag and skid her out of the stable on her back. Salvage sheets were laid out to act as skid aids and it took all of us pulling on lines and manoeuvring her legs with crooks before the horse unceremoniously finally came out into the stable yard on her back. We then allowed the horse to recover before once again using straps to help to pull her back to her legs and this time we were successful. A very emotional owner was able to walk her around the yard, a little the worse for wear but remarkably agile after its ordeal.

A road traffic accident in thick fog just outside Corby Glen presented us with different challenges. On arrival, there were casualties thrown clear from a head-on crash and one passenger trapped inside a vehicle. It was then a matter of prioritising which casualty to deal with first. With a crew of five, we were glad to see the police already on scene and dealing the traffic build up.

The passenger in the vehicle actually appeared to be the least injured of everyone and, leaving a

casualty carer with him, we assessed the remaining two casualties who were being cared for by passers-by. Grantham's appliance was next to arrive and I was able to instruct them to begin the extrication of the casualty in the car.

With the help of two of Corby's personnel they set about cutting the roof off the vehicle. Active safety systems in modern cars present us with all sorts of challenges and Grantham's Crew Manager was so impressed by the knowledge of one of our Firefighters, Matt Smith, that he singled him out for special praise at the incident. One of the great advantages of retained firefighters is the many and varied personal trade skills that we can bring into play at an incident. Thankfully none of the casualties appeared to be seriously injured and they were soon all on their way to hospital in the care of the ambulance crews.

A recent well reported incident certainly threw something else into the mix. For the first time in my 28 years with the Service the incident printout read "light aircraft into

building". Our local knowledge gave us an advantage over other crews attending and within a few minutes we were in attendance.

On approach the wing tip of the aircraft could be seen jutting out from a bungalow roof. The air ambulance crew were already in attendance but were unable to approach too closely because of the fuel pouring out from bottom facing wing. We quickly deployed a hosereel and a dry powder extinguisher. Utilising the short extension ladder, we were able to get air ambulance crew up to the pilot who was still stranded in his damaged cockpit. Although very confused and disorientated, he had what appeared to be only slight injuries.

Our main problem was getting the pilot down from his perilous position. Grantham's rescue appliance carries a Heavy Goods Vehicle access platform which we able to utilise to give us the height and solid working area needed to transfer the pilot onto a spine board. Remarkably, the pilot was not trapped and, although it was quite a difficult manoeuvre, we

## Lincolnshire Police—Restorative Justice

Lincolnshire Police has a Restorative Justice resolution programme that brings criminals and victims together. There are a number of critics of Restorative Justice, who say it's a soft option and policing on the cheap, but in reality it provides a real voice for victims and an opportunity to influence what should happen to the offender. An impressive 92% of victims, who provided feedback after their offence was dealt with by a restorative resolution in Lincolnshire, stated they would recommend it to others.

Faced with what to do now with a light aircraft balanced precariously on a bungalow roof, it suddenly struck me that I had a friend who actually flies out of the airfield involved. A quick phone call and

he arrived to give some expert advice which proved invaluable to us and investigating police officers. Many thanks to that person, you know who you are, local knowledge really is one of the main assets for any emergency service!

## **SWINSTEAD PARISH COUNCIL**

Minutes the Parish Council meeting held 8th January 2015

Present: B. Lynch – Chairman, C. Lunn, S. Webb, PCSO S. Bowden and Mrs J.M. Hunt-Webb (Clerk)

1. Apologies: G. Brown, M. Somerville
2. Declarations of Interest: None
3. Minutes of Previous Meeting: The Minutes of the previous meeting held on 6th November 2014 were agreed as an accurate record and signed.
4. Correspondence: The following had been received:

An e-mail from SKDC regarding the removal of the metal stake which supported the litter bin recently removed on the High Street.

The SKDC Minerals and Waste Plan for consultation by 5th February 2015.

A Helping Hand advertisement which has been passed to the Three Parishes magazine for publication.

Details of a Budgetary Planning and VAT seminar for Parish Councillors on 24th January at Rippingale.

An advisory note from the Local Government Chronicle that sector-led Local Improvement Grants have been cut by 10%.

Details of the LCC Funding Advice network Grants Scheme.

5. Financial Report: The report was presented and agreed. It was agreed to retain the precept for 2016 – 17 at the same level as that for 2015-16

6. Highways: A reply is still awaited from LCC following the Parish Council's request for "Hidden Dip" signs to be sited both ways on the A151 to the west of the Forstedd Hill junction.

A Closure Sign has been deployed warning of forthcoming remedial works on Park Road. Yellow road markings have been made in Park Road to indicate the extent of forthcoming much-needed carriageway repairs.

Recent works to the drainage system seem to have been effective with a resultant decrease in standing water through the village.

7. Buttercross: Quotations for work to the base should be available for consideration at the next meeting. The work will require approval from LCC Highways.

8. Croake Hill: The Parish Council continues to receive anecdotal reports of further anti-social behaviour including loud hammering on resident's doors through the night. PCSO Bowden stressed the need for residents to ring 101 as soon as possible as these events occur and also to report them to SKDC.

PCSO Bowden makes regular ad-hoc visits to the village. If operational pressures allow, he also times his visits to co-incide with those of the Mobile Library so that residents can let him know of any concerns they may have. (Residents are encouraged to use the Mobile Library on a "Use it or Lose it" basis and the forthcoming dates will be placed on the noticeboard.)

It was agreed that District Councillor Nick Robins would be appraised of these latest concerns.

PCSO Bowden reported that since June 2014, there had been a total of 28 incidents reported for the village of which three were concerns for safety, three suspicious circumstances (door knocking etc) one of violence which was not treated as a crime, three for theft including monies taken from the church, and an attempted burglary where items

were disturbed, eight Anti-Social Behaviour calls which included noise nuisance, malicious communications and an apparent abandoned vehicle, two for criminal damage and three abandoned or hoax calls. He stressed that compared to elsewhere, these statistics were on the low side.

9. Community Wildlife Orchard: The orchard is in good order generally with work on hedge trimming to be organised shortly.

10. Dog Fouling: Council members were appalled to hear of incidences of persistent dog fouling within the Churchyard in spite of notices banning the walking of dogs within its confines. Arrangements for new, more prominent notices are in hand and residents are asked to report any instances of dog fouling in the Churchyard or anywhere through the village to members or the Parish Clerk.

11. Councillors' Reports: A letter is to be sent to a resident whose hedge has over-grown a footpath.

Quotations will be sought for the supply of a replacement seat located at the entrance to Croake Hill. It was also noted that the Notice Board requires some refurbishment and costings for this will also be obtained.

12. Date and Time of next meeting: Thursday 5th March 2015, 7pm.

## Notes of the Edenham Parish Council Meeting 13th January 2015

**Open Forum.** Three members of the public present – Concern raised over yet another road traffic accident on A151 (Near to Grimsthorpe House, Grimsthorpe) – incident details to be recorded on Parish Accident Log. Details were also given on consideration being given by Grimsthorpe Estate to the possible change of use of the old post office/residence, Edenham. The re-occupancy/ utilisation of this empty property was welcomed by the meeting subject to the necessary planning application etc being granted. Clarity was requested on the progress of the planned upgrade of the current broadband service throughout the parish - Cllr Hill (LCC) stated that superfast broadband roll-out plans were progressing and gave details of the council's website where information could be found on specific locations. The main villages of Edenham and Grimsthorpe are hopefully to be included in 2015, however the

outlying farms etc could be somewhat later. The poor standards of recent pothole repairs carried out on Scottlethorpe Road were also commented on. Cllr Hill took note and outlined the County Council's plans to improve pothole repair procedures and equipment. The chairman thanked the members of the public for their attendance.

All parishioners are reminded that the Open Forum at each Parish Council meeting is their opportunity to voice concern/raise local issues with their councillors. They are also reminded that the Local Election will take place in May; hence it is an opportunity for anyone interested in contributing to their local community to step forward and stand for election to the council. Details can be obtained by contacting the parish clerk at [edenham.pc@btinternet.com](mailto:edenham.pc@btinternet.com) – or contacting any of your current councillors.

Highways: Chairman requested that details of any road traffic accidents witnessed/reported (however minor) within the Parish should be passed to the clerk. This

will allow a more accurate account of the road safety to be passed to Highways/Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership who only receive reports if police/emergency services are involved. A total of 7 incidents have been reported since the last PC meeting in November.

Financial Matters: Proposed annual budget for year 2015/16 studied and agreed. It was also agreed that the Precept upon SKDC for the year should remain the same as year 2014/15 at £2,750.

Play Area Maintenance: Site meeting to discuss a joint maintenance contract with Edenham Village Hall committee for maintenance of the Children's Play Area and Village Hall Surrounds to be arranged. Report at next meeting.

Dog Fouling. Reports received about dog fouling - in particular along Scottlethorpe Road, Edenham. All dog owners are reminded that it is their duty to clean up after their pets wherever they are and be considerate to

other footpath and road users.

Property Address. Householders/Businesses are reminded that their properties should be clearly identified with a house number or name. Could the emergency services easily find you if the unfortunate should happen and you called on their services?

# JANE'S SEASONAL RECIPE

*It has been a bumper year for carrots in our garden – the largest we have ever had, mainly due to the load of soil we bought from British Sugar! So this quick and easy variation on carrot soup is worth a try, if you like something a bit different.*

1 TABLESPOON OIL

700 G CARROTS, PEELED & CHOPPED

1 ONION, PEELED & CHOPPED

2 CLOVES OF GARLIC, FINELY CHOPPED

1 TEASPOON CUMMIN SEEDS

1 LITRE VEG STOCK

400 ML CAN OF LIGHT COCONUT MILK

2 TABLESPOONS FRESH CORIANDER, CHOPPED

1 TABLESPOON DESICCATED COCONUT, TOASTED

*Heat the oil in a pan, Add veg & cumin seeds. Cook over moderate heat for 5 mins, stirring. Pour in stock, bring to boil, cover & simmer for 20 mins. Liquidise & add coconut milk. Heat through. Serve in warm bowls, with swirl of coconut milk & a sprinkling of coriander & toasted coconut.*

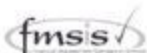
