

THE VICAR WRITES

The season of Easter lasts fifty days. The first forty recounts the dynamic time of the young Apostolic community coming to terms with their experience of meeting with the Risen Christ, the growing conflict with the Jewish authorities and the dramatic growth in the number of believers. The fortieth day sees the anniversary of the Ascension of Christ – the last occasion the apostles saw and talked with Christ in his resurrected form. Easter ends on the fiftieth day – Pentecost. Pentecost was the temple harvest festival marking the first fruits of the fields and vineyards, and it was at this festival that the young Christian community experienced the dynamism of the Spirit that Jesus had promised would come from the Father which would lead them into all truth: a Spirit of power and love and self-control.

It is this seven weeks that is the time of formation for the Christian faith. In this time all that is needed for its life is given and established. Foremost among this foundation

was the witness of the eleven apostles. Jesus made absolutely certain that all of them knew, with cast iron certainty, that he was Risen. All but one of them were to bear witness to that truth in their own deaths. It is the fact of the resurrection that is the transforming fact of history: more than that it is the transforming fact for the whole created order. In the resurrection of Jesus, creation is being renewed.

Throughout the month of May the worship of our churches looks to this light and listens to this good news. It is also in May that we share two important events; the first is the Parishes' service of Baptism and Confirmation, the second is a service of thanksgiving for the restoration of the roofs at Edenham Church. Both, in their own ways, are witnesses to the fact of the resurrection. They are celebrations of hope for the future and mark new beginnings. This hope is the great Christian virtue: hope transforms all situations in life. Our parish churches and their weekly worship are expressions of this hope being lived out in our midst. Open to all, full of beauty

and, one as visitor commented in the visitors book, 'peace and joy abounds' - and all because the Lord is risen.

Jehovah's Witnesses (JWs)

Several people have brought to my attention an increase of activity by JWs in some of the Three Tower Villages – one having fifty JWs visit on one Saturday morning! I am also aware that in some cases their approach has met with some success. Just to make a few things clear. JWs are not Christians. They do not believe that God was incarnate in Jesus (God from God, Light from Light, True God from True God, as Christians profess in the Creed Sunday by Sunday). They believe that Jesus is a being separate to God (identical to Michael the Archangel) and therefore they have no concept of God revealing himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit (The Holy Trinity). Therefore, they deny the two central tenets of the Christian Faith, the Incarnation of God in Christ and the Holy Trinity. Their claims are supported by their own version of scripture which in key areas are not the

same as the Bible. I'll say a bit more next month – but these are the essential differences which lead to the construction of a belief and ethical system that do not resemble orthodox Christianity.

Fire Station News

The first 3 months of the year have been very busy for the fire crews of Corby Glen as our appliance rolled out of the doors 50 times by the 4th April. All this made life very hectic, so it was nice to reflect on the long service of Firefighter Brian Walsingham when he was awarded the British Empire Medal for his service to the community and for 50 years with the fire brigade.

It is remarkable to think of the changes Brian has seen since joining the Service in 1965. Equipment has evolved, a new station has been built and a new appliance is parked at the station but we must not lose sight that we are really doing the same job with the same goals that Brian joined up for all those years ago. Over seventy guests including the Chief Fire Officer crowded into the fire station to see his medal presentation made by the Queen's representative, the Lord Lieutenant of Lincolnshire. A massive well done to Brian's wife Jill for organising the occasion,

enjoy your day at the Buckingham Palace garden party, you both deserve it.

Of course in that time Brian has been helping us strive to uphold the Service values of 'making Lincolnshire a safer place to live. work and visit'. The all-wheel drive capabilities coupled with winter tyres of our new appliance certainly came into their own when we were called out to a road accident on a minor road near the village of Hawthorpe during one of the few snowy nights of the past year. While other attending appliances struggled to get there, we were unhindered in our journey and were soon in attendance. It was a dark, very cold windy night and the crews did a fantastic job in releasing the driver from his vehicle which had skidded into a ditch. Thanks very much to the driver of the Range Rover who transported the casualty to the waiting ambulance which had not been able to get close because of the icy conditions.

The recent windy weather saw a car blown off the road and into a

dyke. Modern cars offer all sorts of dangers and technical issues to firefighters and one of the first considerations of the incident commander will be to assess any safety systems such as airbags which have not activated. We carry restraints to deal with steering wheel airbags and info to reveal the car's interior to identify all remaining safety systems, cutting through a live safety system cable can cause serious issues for casualties and rescuers alike.

The car's battery will be disconnected early in the incident and ignition keys taken at least twenty metres away so they cannot remain live. At this particular incident we were tasked with a "b post rip" – that is to cut

the middle post of the vehicle away from the vehicle and remove the door to create a bigger exit route as possible – " always make the hole to fit the casualty, not the casualty to fit the hole". We were almost being blown off our feet by the gale force winds but again the crews performed manfully to release the casualty.

Please remember we are still recruiting at the station and looking for those elusive people who can cover on any weekday between the hours of 8am to 5pm. You may be that person, come up and see us on any Tuesday evening 6.30pm onwards to see if you are that person – your fire station needs you!



Andrew Hawes is a priest, poet and librettist.

Born in Grimsby in 1954 and schooled at De Aston School, Market Rasen, he left Lincolnshire for six years to study Medieval and Modern History at Sheffield University and to train for the Priesthood at Westcott House Cambridge. He also read for a Theology Degree at Emmanuel College.

Returning to his home Diocese of Lincoln to be ordained in 1980, he

spent four years as curate in his birthplace, followed by five years as Vicar of Lutton with Gedney Drove End, Dawsmere, also in Lincolnshire. In 1989 he came to his present post where he is Warden of Edenham Regional House Retreat Centre and Vicar of Edenham, Witham on the Hill and Swinstead.

He has been writing poetry from an early age and has collaborated with his composer brother, Patrick Hawes, by providing the libretto for many musical works.

Andrew Hawes Collected Poems 1970-2014 is the only publication containing all his poetry produced to date and the poems are presented in a chronological sequence according to writing and subject revealing the development of technique and theme.

Toft cum Lound and Manthorpe Parish Council Clerk's Notes 2 April 2015

Matters Arising

Restorative Justice: As nothing had been heard back from the general public concerning a briefing on restorative justice, it was decided to take no further action.

Faulty streetlight, Manthorpe: The streetlight had now been repaired.

Planning meeting at Carlby 24
Feb: District Councillor Ibis
Channell reported that the meeting
went very well. District Councillor
Martin Wilkins stressed that even
when parish councils do not have
any objections to a planning
application, SKDC would like to be
informed of the parish council's
thoughts on the application. This
could influence the Planning
Committee's approach to any
conditions that they may wish to
impose on an application.

Sandbags: It was agreed not to take up SKDC's offer of sandbags for flood protection.

Dip in road outside The Wilderness, Manthorpe: LCC Highways stated that no action was necessary but the situation would be monitored.

Highways

Street lighting, Manthorpe: It was commented that the streetlamp recently installed on the Wilsthorpe Road is extremely bright and shines directly into the windows of the adjacent houses. (Note, subsequent to the meeting the office responsible for street lighting advised that a cover would be placed around the lamp to reduce the glare into the affected houses.)

Grass verges, Lound: Despite receiving an incident number from LCC Highways, nothing has yet been done to make good the damage caused by a previous traffic diversion around Toft.

Planning Applications

SKDC approved Mr & Mrs Mossman's new vehicular access in Lound.

County Councillor's Report

Councillor Martin Trollop-Bellew informed the Council that:

The Boundary Commission is reducing the number of councillors in Lincolnshire from 77 to 71 and that county councillor allowances had been increased by 2.2%.

Peterborough and Stamford NHS Trust has decided to extend the opening times to the Stamford hospital minor injuries departments; including weekend and evening cover.

Stamford hospital is an integral part of our local NHS trust with 40% of the trust income coming through Stamford. The trust will spend between £8.5 and £9.2 million in the current financial plan. The Trust is trying to obtain an MRI scanner. It has a portable scanner but intend to purchase a permanent device.

The Stamford hospital Hurst ward will be demolished to make space for 2 additional miniature operating theatres.

Hospital parking would be increased but it is expected that a parking charge will be introduced.

Listed building restrictions demand that the west end of the Stamford site be sold - it cannot be altered and does not comply with the 2004 disability act.

There has been an attempted blackmail of a County Councillor. The blackmailer demanded £10,000 or threatened to accuse the councillor of paedophile activity. Lincolnshire police is aware of the attempt.

District Councillor's Report

The change to the SKDC boundary has meant the removal of District Councillor Ibis

Channell's position. Although she had no report to make, Councillor Channell handed a letter of her appreciation to the Parish Council for their support during her period in office. It was agreed that the Chairman would write and thank Councillor Channell for her excellent work over many years.

Parish Property

Defibrillator Fuses: Fuses for the defibrillator in Manthorpe had been replaced. Both Parish defibrillator are in good condition.

Jasmin Cottage Rent Review: The Parish Council would initiate a rent review of Jasmin Cottage.

Small Authorities' Requirements

To ensure compliance with the requirement to publish details of parish matters online, it was decided that details of Parish finance and property would be placed on the Parish website.

Local Elections

As all 5 Parish Councillors will not stand at the next election, all 5 positions on the Council will be

vacant. The possibility and impact of not enough nominations to forma Parish Council was discussed. Should less than 3 parishioners put themselves forward then SKDC would have to call a By-Election. Should this fail to raise sufficient interest then it would be possible for the Parish to be subsumed into another neighbouring parish.

Roster for grass cutting
Manthorpe Playing field: The
Parish Playing Field grass cutting
roster is yet to be published.
Action is being taken to compile
the list. The key to the Parish shed
was not returned at the end of the
2014 season. The clerk will have a
new key cut.

Some side panelling of the small shed on the Playing Field are broken. These will be repaired.

Disrepair of the Parish Playing Field Boundary Fence: The Boundary fence surrounding the Parish Playing Field is in a very poor state of repair. The clerk would ascertain the Parish responsibility to make good this fence

Parish Summer Party: It was decided a decision on a possible Parish summer party on the Playing Field would be left to the

new Parish Council.

E-mail Contact Details: It was decided to take action to try to compile a full list of parishioner e-mail contact details.

Back Lane Hedges: A member of the public reported that the footpath leading up towards Back Lane in Toft is overgrown. It was agreed to speak to residents to ask them to clear the path.

Parish Cleaner: Although the Parish no longer has a paid cleaner, we do have one parishioner who carries out this task on a voluntary basis around Manthorpe.

Next Meeting: The next meeting was set for 7.00pm on Tuesday 19th May 2015.


War Brides: Promise and Sacrifice 6th May to 3rd June

Maureen McCormick, the American artist daughter of war bride Elsie Grocock of Swinstead, tells her mother's story in paint. American troops were based at nearby Grimsthorpe Castle during World War II. At village dances the local girls danced with soldiers - they were introduced to men from all over Europe and the USA. Suddenly small village life was opened up to the world. Many war brides, like Elsie, picked up and went to new homes and new countries. The world was larger

then – no mobile phones, no affordable airfare. Many women were promised a different life to the one they actually arrived at. Unlike the many immigrant families who went to America together, war brides left their families and embarked on new lives alone. Women who were homesick or unhappy couldn't just turn around and go home.

Maureen was born in Swinstead and emigrated with her mother to the USA in 1945. Since qualifying and raising her own family, she worked as an artist in Massachusetts, California and France. Maureen now lives in the suburbs of Chicago, shows and sells paintings and teaches. She exhibits at the Atkinson-O'Rourke Gallery.

Among other examples of Maureen's work the loneliness of the war bride in her new surroundings is to honour her mother and the women who sacrificed their lives - whose lives were completely changed by the war.


